


District Map & Population Size


PEOPLE AGED 15-24 REACHED WITH PREVENTION INFO



Intervention Area: Life Skills



Q3 there is a decline in our numbers due to the following:

- * DramAidE provided Life skillsbehavioural change communication trainings in three High Schools reaching 65 peer educators and also in 13 Primary schools reaching 325 peer educators
- Peace corps volunteers also conducted two camps separately for girls and boys on teenage pregnancy, who became peer educators in various schools around UDM.

Intervention Area: Life Skills Cont...


- * 6 008 learners reached with life skills focused campaigns
- * 115 learners trained as peer educators and 26 educators as peer educators' mentors.
- * 96 girl learners and 10 educators from 10 schools participated in a 5 day leadership camp.
- * 76 trained lay counselors mentored to share achievements, challenges and come up with solutions to assist one another in better assisting their community w.r.t social ills.
- * 86 educators trained as Soul Buddyz facilitators to establish Soul Buddyz clubs in their schools to identify and assist in the community.
- * 1 Soul Buddyz Congress hosted reaching 188 learners, 56 educators, 12 DoE officials, 2 Soul City Officials and 15 stakeholders.
- * 164 learners with learning barrier admitted in 6 Special School.
- * 174 347 Primary School learners benefiting from school feeding scheme

Intervention Area: Life Skills Cont...


- * 86 152 Secondary School learners benefiting from school feeding scheme.
- * 203 schools have school gardens
- * SNES is in support of 'Project Dignity'. With this project identified learners (girl learners) are firstly guided and then provided with a pack of 3 pairs of panties, 9 washable pads and 9 plastic sealable bags. One such a pack will see one young woman through 5 worry-free years. As result of this project, girl learners are encouraged to attend school every day so that they are able to benefit from all teaching and learning taking place at the school.
- * Networking with Thuthuzela Care Centre. at these meetings we discuss challenges with regard to the issue of Child Protection in the area. Furthermore, needs are identified and addressed.


Baby HIV antibody test positive at 18 months rate Target <3%

New Fixed Dose Combination (FDC) guidelines contributes to the 6 weeks decrease and training of health care providers including Community Caregivers (CCGs), on promotion exclusive breastfeeding and upgrading of CCGs to be nutritional advisers assisting the District in obtaining a decline in 18 months.




ANC BOOKING < 20 WEEKS

- * Community care givers were trained on promotion of early booking during their door to door visits.


MATERNAL CHILD AND WOMEN'S HEALTH






Maternal death decreased due to the trainings on midwifery skills update which are on going including the practical. Infants deaths increases due to lack of TOP services where pregnant women do back street abortion resulting in increase number of premature babies. Only on facility is providing TOP services at Uthungulu. Processes to open another one are in place but doctors are also going to do medical abortion now at District Hospitals

Target for MMC was not met as schools were busy with examinations followed by festive holidays in December


Intervention Area: HCT & TB Screening



There is a decline in HIV tests carried out during the third quarter due to December holidays as it has been shown from the MMC performance


District during Q4 is conducting HAST blitz that will assist to improve the numbers

Intervention Area: Condoms Distribution






Intervention Area: Condoms Distribution



Good performance on this indicator. More females are now starting to show interest in female condoms due to the educations that are being given at health facilities and during the events








There is an increase in both number of new and under 12 sexual assault cases. Community engagement need to be intensified involving other stakeholders and government Departments






New adult initiations continue to increase due to introduction of Fixed Dose Combination (FDC).

ADULTS LOST TO FOLLOW UP


