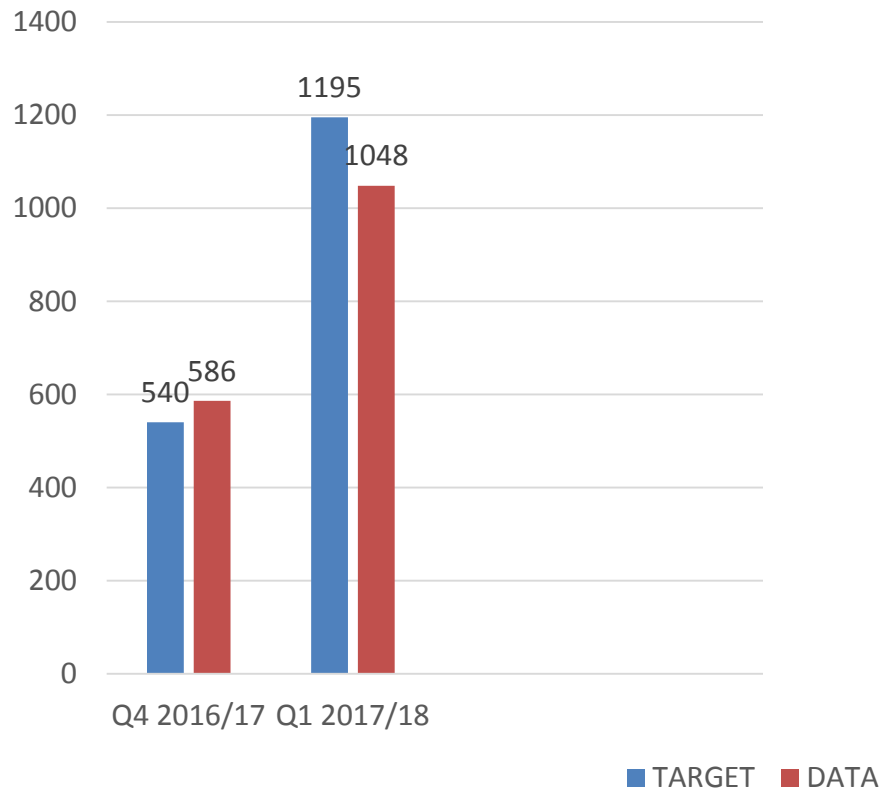

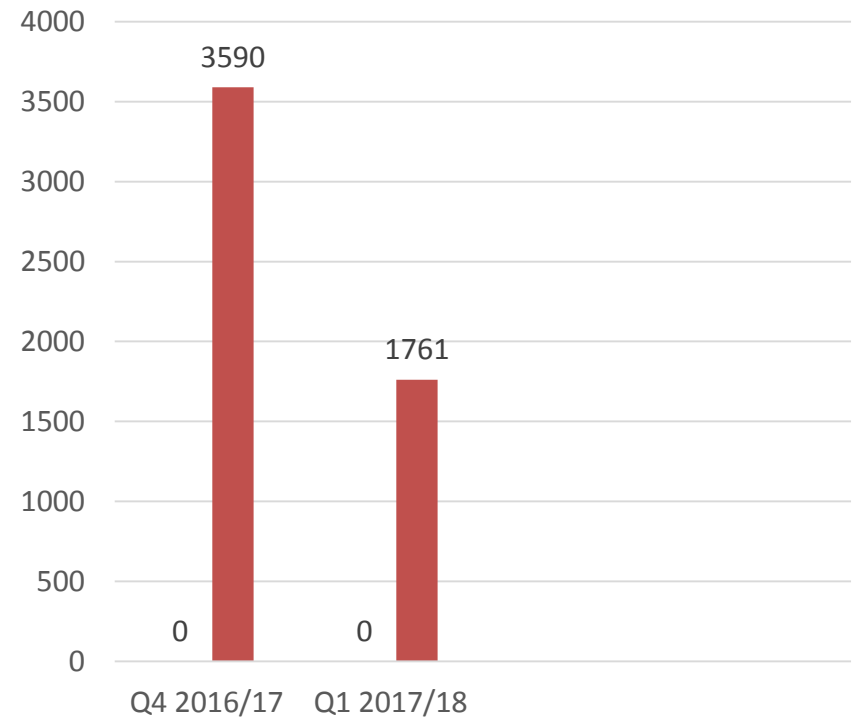

Number of OVC receiving care and support (Q4 2016/17 – Q1 2017/18) UTDM

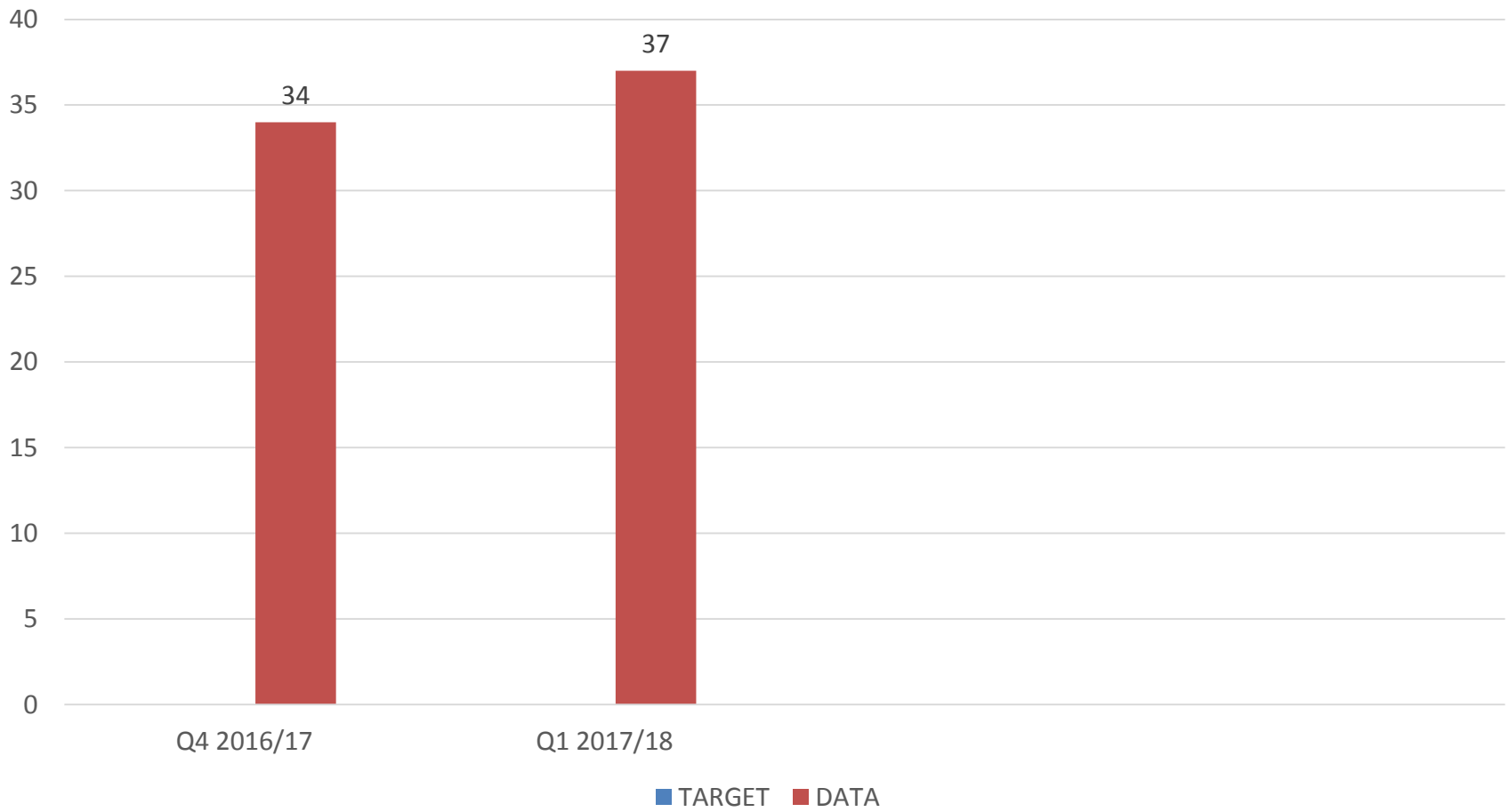


Activities

Activities

- Services rendered to new and existing OVC's by HCBC organizations, CCG's, Home Based Care Organization, SD and Youth Care Workers included:
 - 1048 homework supervision,
 - 94 referrals were made to Home Affairs for birth certificate and 66 referred to Child Support Grant.
 - 36 referred for counselling,
 - 664 children benefitted from cooked meals,
 - 88 received school uniforms
 - 89 children placed in alternative care.
 - 321 children receiving ARV were supported
 - 2545 children accessing services through Isibindi Programme.
- 1501 beneficiaries reached through the You Only Live Once program rolled out mostly by Home Community based organization .

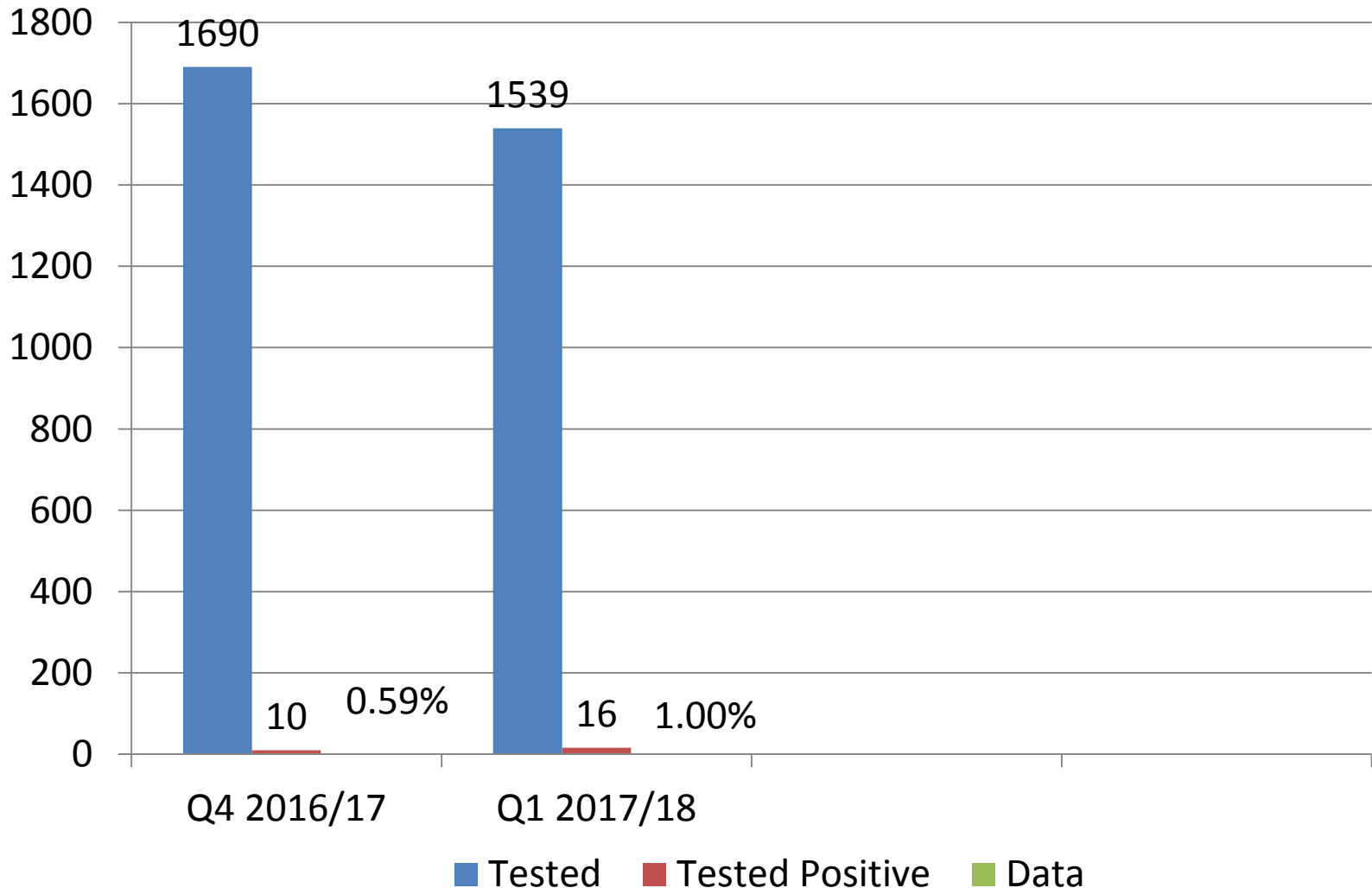

Challenges and Interventions

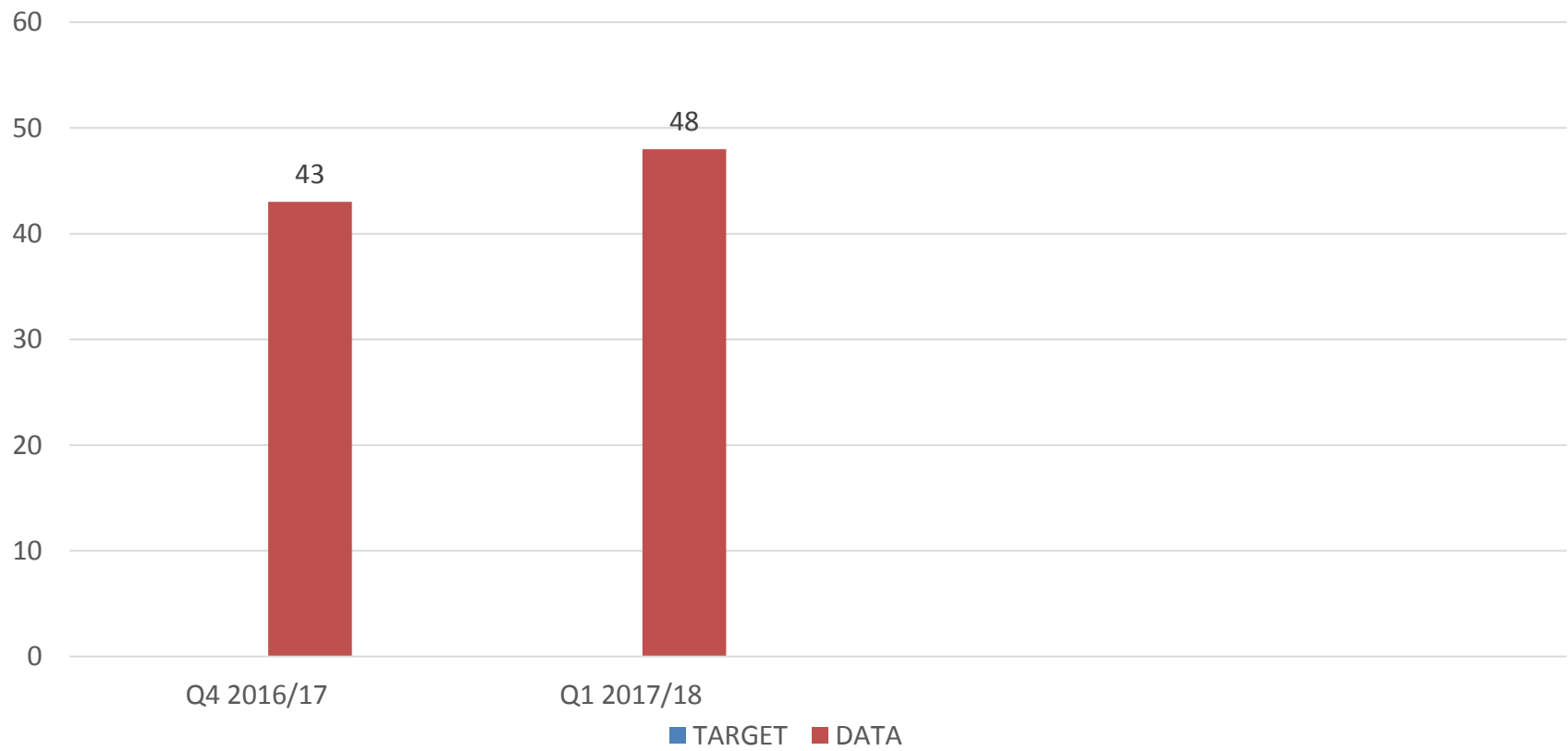
Challenges

- Mothers defaulting on treatment.
- Contracting HIV infection during breastfeeding period.

Interventions

- Prioritize pregnant and breastfeeding mothers for adherence counselling at Public Health Facilities (PHC).
- Encourage couples counseling during pregnancy and breastfeeding.
- Implement Index HAST case finding.

Challenges and Interventions

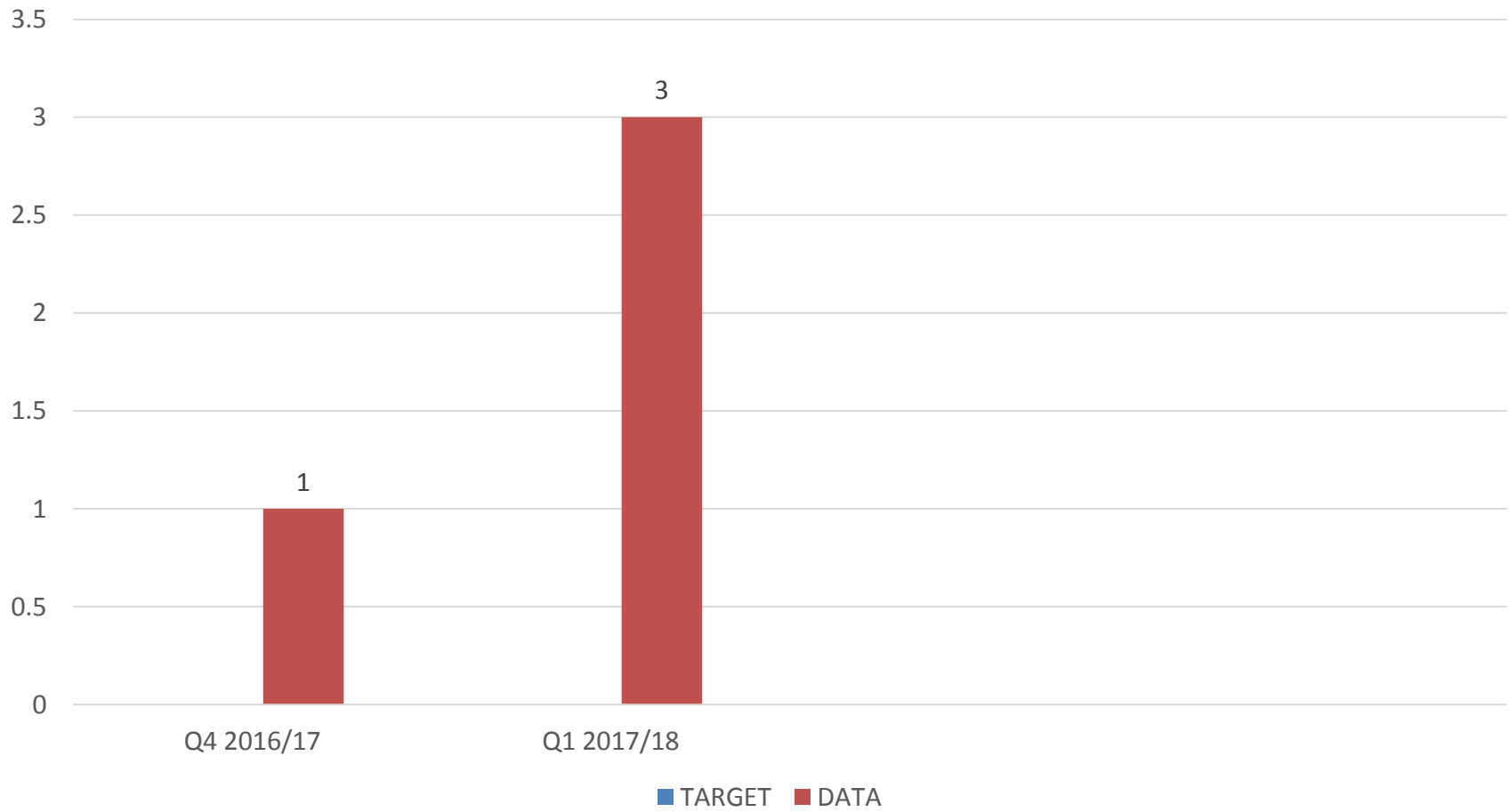
Challenge

- Infants death in public health facilities is still high.
- Undiagnosed infections and health conditions during pregnancy.

Intervention

- Early detection and management of underlying conditions during pregnancy.
- Improve and monitor closely HAST screening amongst pregnant women.

Challenges and Interventions

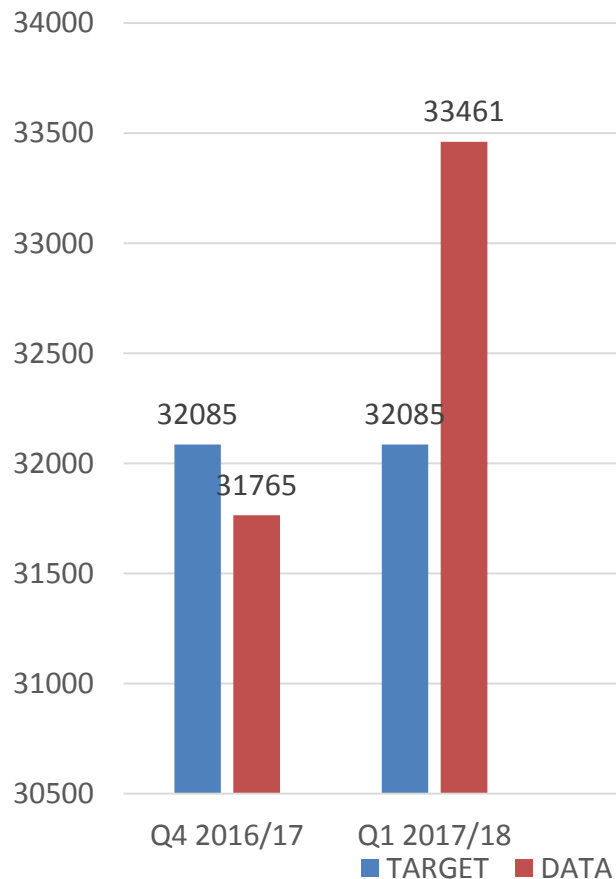
Challenges

- Pregnancy related conditions affecting pregnant women and infant in utero i.e. Pregnancy induced hypertension, Hemorrhage during and after and TB/HIV.
- Late booking or non-booking of pregnant mothers.

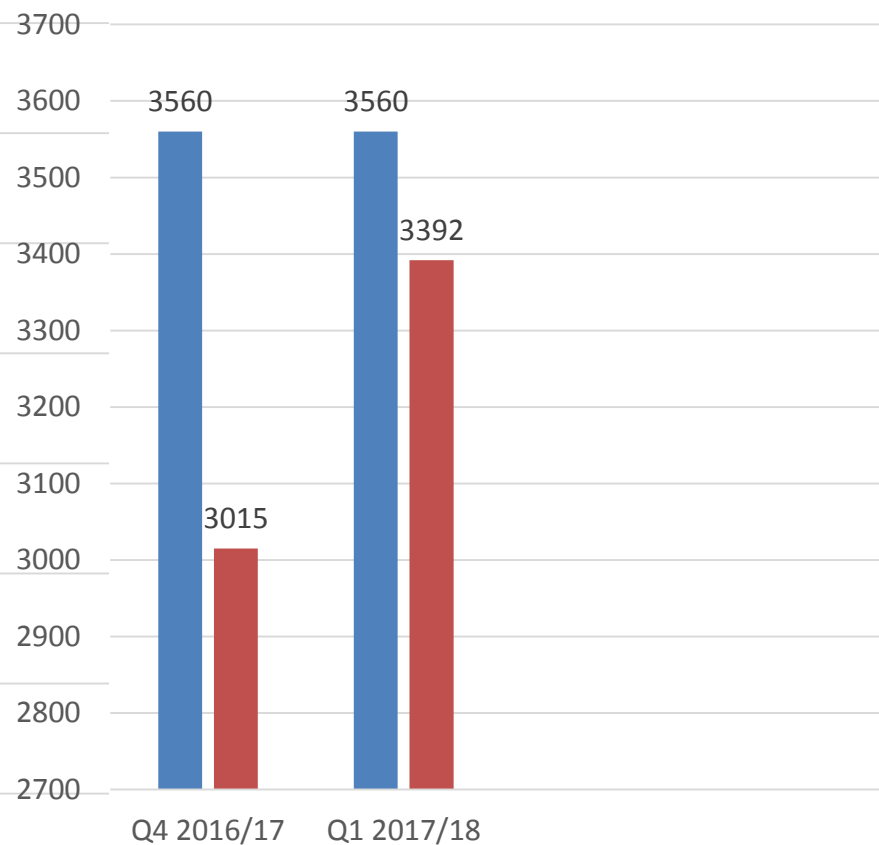
Interventions

- Promote of early Antenatal Care (ANC) booking before 20weeks through community radio, health education and dialogues.
- Market household pregnancy testing (which is done by CCG's) in order to increase ANC early booking for pregnant women.

Number of new positive cases (Q4 2016/17 – Q1 2017/18) UTDM

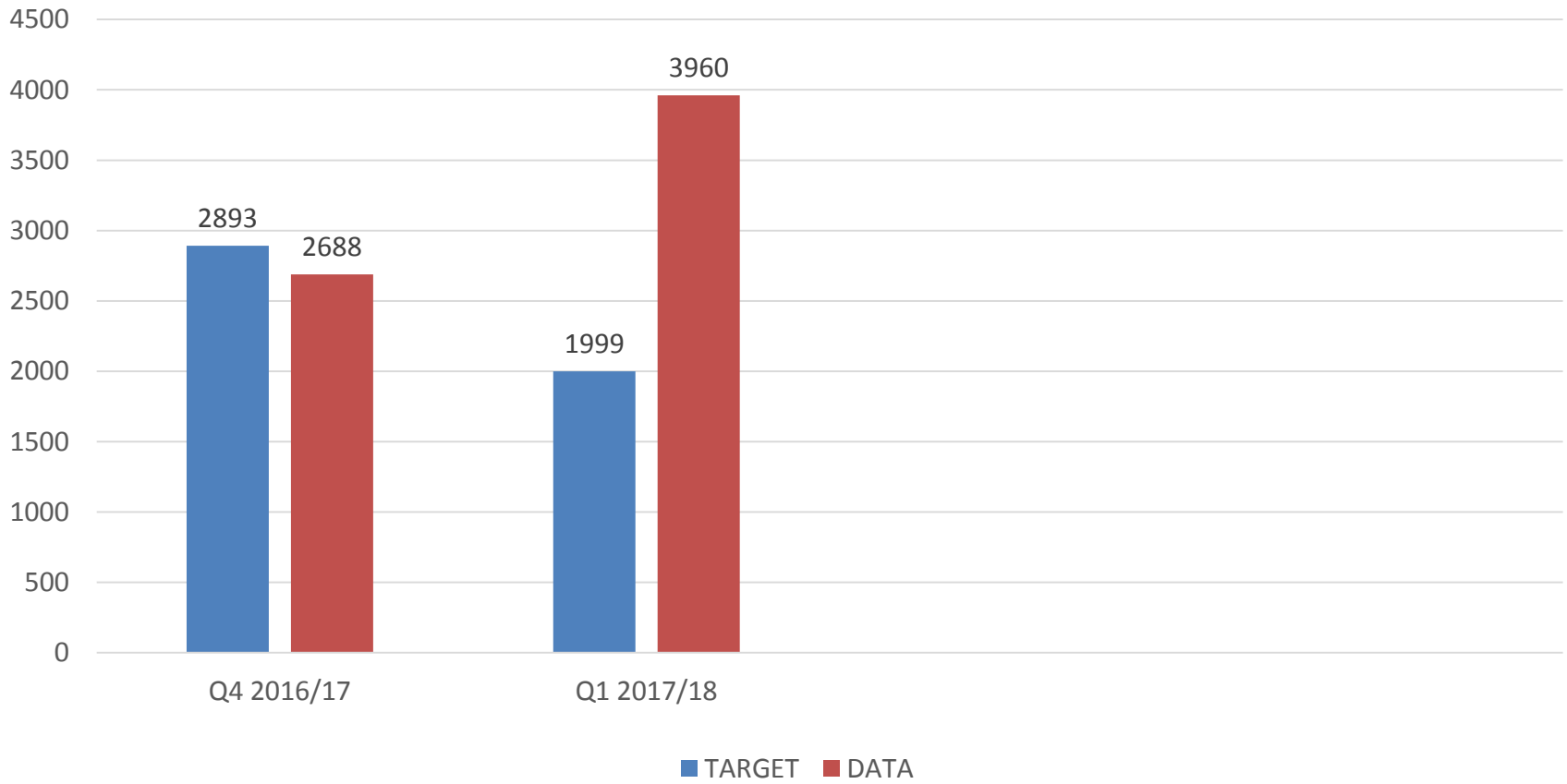


Achievement

Achievement

- HIV tests conducted target exceeded by 17%.
- New HIV positive cases targets exceeded by 17%
- District coordinated outreach activities in hard to reach areas and at household level reaching children, men, Adolescents and Key Populations with the support of stakeholders.

Achievements

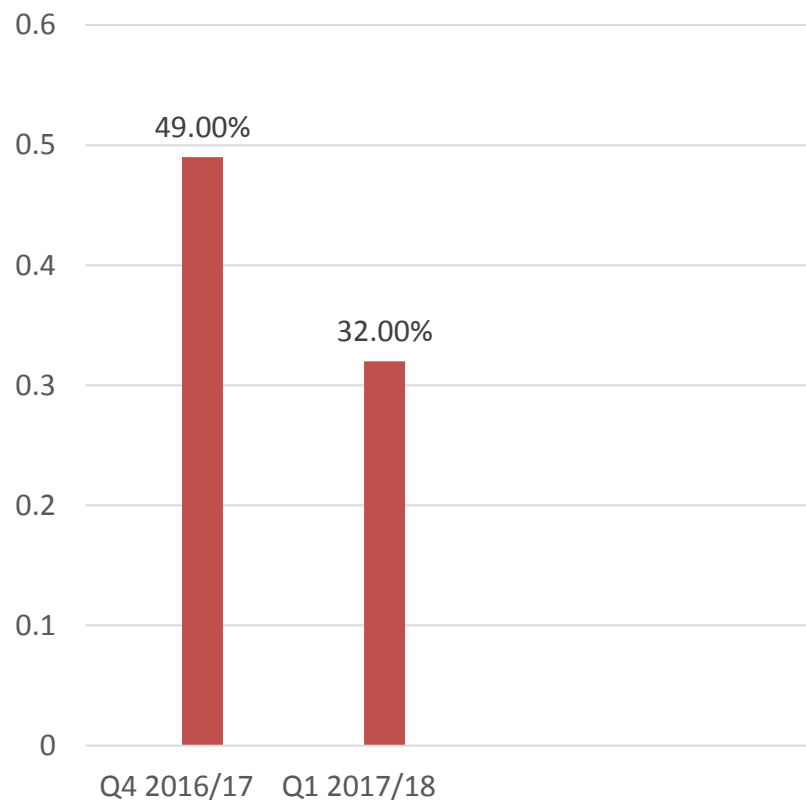
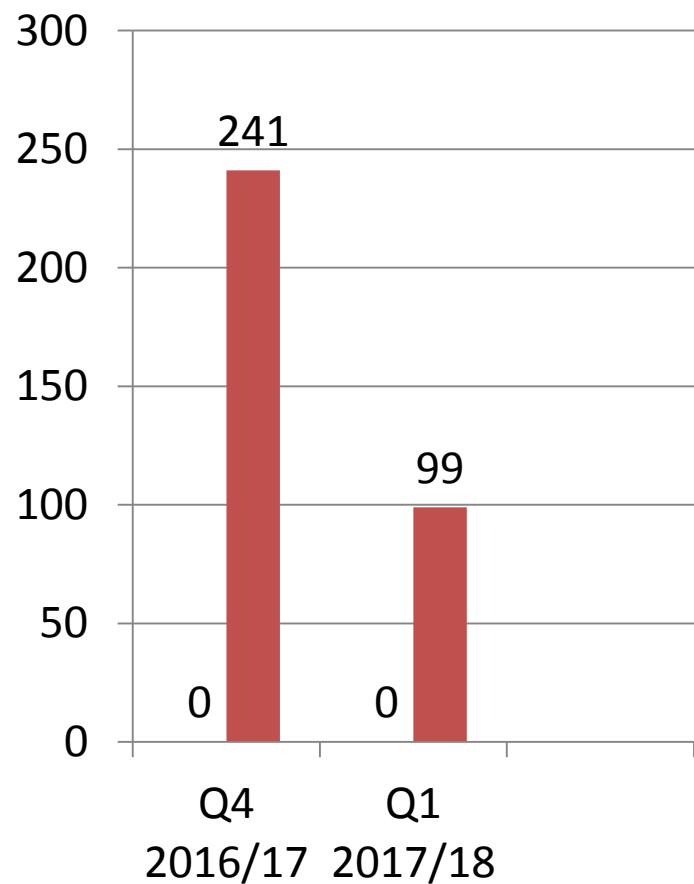
- Target exceeded by 98% through support by Partners (Care Works and SACTWU) in mobilization and circumcising.

- Unexpected drop in sexual assault.

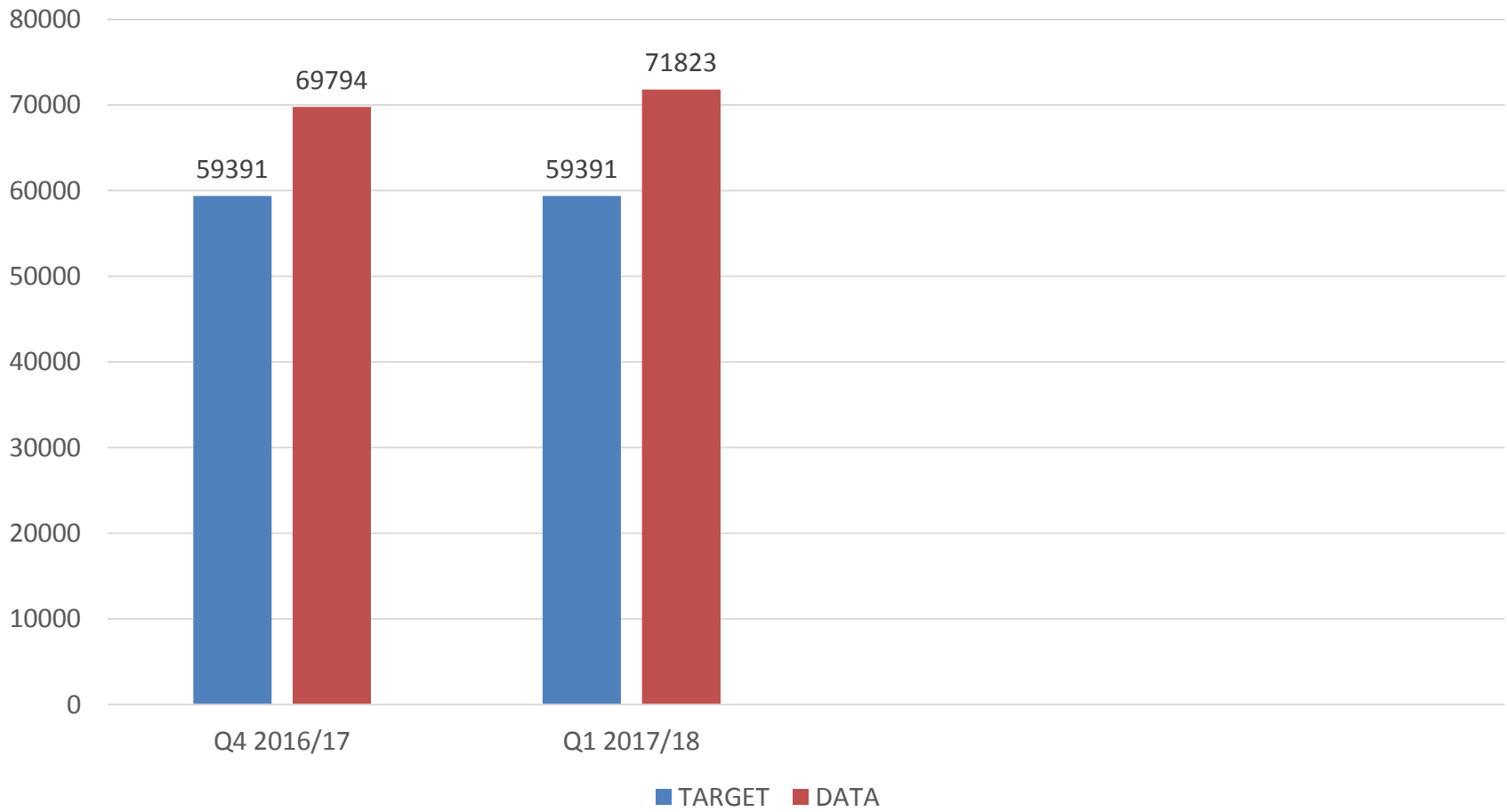
Interventions

Activity, Challenge and Interventions

Activity

- Target achieved due to support from Partners on ART initiation for clients from hard to reach areas.

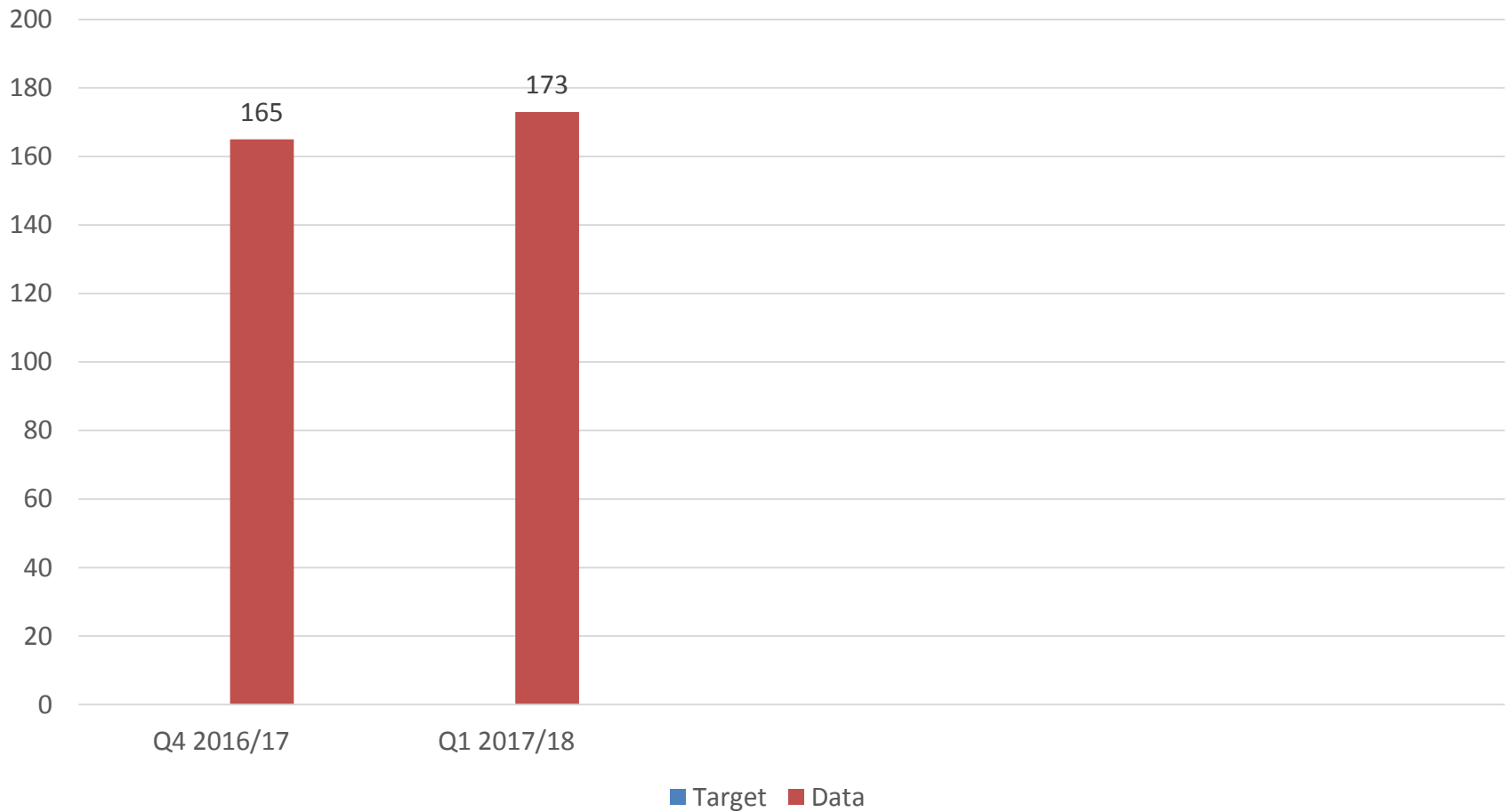
Challenge

- Low uptake on HIV testing on children's they rely on parents and caregivers to access services.
- Backlog in capturing due to shortage of data capturers and incorrect recording of CCMDD clients.

Interventions

- District DoH established a stakeholders forum to improve HAST (HIV/AIDS STI and TB) case finding prioritizing males, children, adolescents and Key Population.
- District Department of Health is implementing National Strategy to integrate TB/HIV electronical data collection system.
 - To improve data quality.
 - To improve patient management
- DoH in a process of recruiting 8 data capturers

Challenges and Interventions

Challenges

- Shopping around of health services by clients
- Vacant post of data capturers at some facilities
- Patient file backlog on TIER

Interventions

- Promote, market and encourage clients to utilize Centralized Chronic Medication Dispensing and Distribution (CCMDD) services.
- Department of Health is in the process of back capturing patient files on to TIER. net with the assistance of Supporting Partners.
- DoH in a process of recruiting 8 data capturers.
