





The District Profile








OVC RECEIVING CARE & SUPPORT




 The OVCs receiving care and support have decreased compared to last quarter.


Reasons contributes to:

NEWLY REGISTERED OVCs




The number of newly registered OVCs has increased in this quarter when compared to the last quarter.


Reasons contributing to increase in newly registered OVCs:

District performance:


The District has continuously achieved quarterly HTS target . Fourth quarter performance = 70838 - met and exceeded quarterly target of

District annual performance for 2017/18 is at 265 968— met and exceeded set annual target of 249077.


Achievements:

Achievements:

The annual target for MMC is 13 886 and the quarterly target of 3 472

The District has achieved a total 5 025 for the 4th quarter which exceeds the quarterly target. Annual target also met & exceeded – performance of 24 407 versus a target of 13 886.

The continued collaboration between the support partners and the DOH has ensured achievement of the target


Uptake of VMMC services for the older males (above 15 years) remains a challenge, only 56% out of 28 458 MMC that were performed.

Activities:


The District has a monthly schedule for Isibaya samadoda per sub district which encourages behaviour changes and recruitment of MMC.

The VMMC service are provided on a outreach basis by supporting partners







Condom Distribution: Male Condoms

Achievements:

Annual target for male condoms to be distributed is 21 737 420 and a quarterly target is 5 359 855. The district has exceeded the quarterly distributed 5 931 275 of male condoms for the fourth quarter. The district has exceeded annual and achieved 26 288 001




The target for female condoms distribution is 375 284 with a quarterly target of 93 821 and the district has distributed 78 000 for the fourth quarter which is below the set target. However the district has met and exceeded the set annual target with the achievement of 426 000

The contracted condom distributor has been engaged to assist with demand creation and demonstration for female condoms to improve the quarterly performance




ANC BOOKING BEFORE 20 WEEKS




 The District performance is at 69% in last quarter and the annual performance of 70% which is below the District target of 75%. There is a still a high number of unbooked cases which present at facilities for delivery.

Activities

- Pregnancy testing at households by CCGs and Family Health Teams takes place for early diagnosis of pregnancy and linkage to health facilities for antenatal care.
- Community awareness and dialogues through OSS structures are currently taking place to address Maternal Child and Women's Health issues.




TB SUSPECTS & TREATMENT



- The district TB incidence still remains high at 612/100 000 versus the WHO norm of 200/100 000
- The district was able to treat 87.6% of the TB clients successfully
- TB defaulter remains a challenge due to clients giving wrong addresses and unauthorized movement of patients.
- The District defaulter rate is at 4.5% for quarter 4 and the annual performance is 4.2% versus the target of less than 5%
- The TB Death rate is at 3.8 % for the 4th quarter and the annual performance is at 4.6% against target of less than 5% for TB clients is also a challenge due to clients defaulting ART, late presentation to facilities and complication from other chronic diseases.
- TB screening is done to all client who presents to facilities to improve TB case finding






Substance Abuse Demand Reduction Responses

- Rolled-out drug prevention programmes throughout the District.
- Children in conflict with the low are reffered to diversion programmes for drug related crimes.
- Integrated response on drug reduction responses with the Department of Arts, Culture Sports & the Local Drug Action Committees.
- Implement behavior change programmes & campaigns in partnership with the District AIDS Council / Local AIDS Councils (Drug Action Committees), OSS Vehicle, and other key government departments.








- The District has referred a number of youth to Newlands Park Centre and the SANCA helps with detoxification services.
- There are 434 liquor outlets monitored in the District, and 48 illegal liquor outlets have been closed.
- The District will continue with the seizure and destruction operations where officials unexpectedly stop and search an outlet.






Future Plans, Activities by the DAC

- The uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council will continue with Taxi Outreach Campaigns, BCC Campaigns using the OSS Kombi, reaching out to Men at Taxi Ranks/ Taverns.
- Reach out to a number of Adolescent Girls & Young Women throughout the District with the DREAMS/ SHEConquers Intervention Programmes / Projects.
- Substance abuse forum discussions about the Scourge of Substance abuse in the District, unregistered ECD center's, children living in the street, prostitution and other concerns raised by members of the Council.






Future Plans & Activities by the DAC

 Works jointly with DAC/LACs.








Conclusion
