AMLA initiative was held on 29/11/2019 • Engaging with men's for a community, religious leaders and amkhosi to host Isibongo as an amadoda in the district. • Partners assist with health education targeting young women and girls. • District is conducting youth dialogues in all subdistricts.

Achievements/Successes

Goal 1: Accelerate prevention to reduce new HIV, TB and STI infections

- Client tested for HIV, Q3 target 33 663, district achieved 193% (65 045)
- Antenatal first visits before 20 weeks rate, district above the set target of 73.4% in all quarters (Q1 – 72%, Q2 - 74.4% and 73.4%)

Goal 2 Reduce morbidity and mortality by providing treatment, care and adherence support for all

- TB clients start on treatment – total in Q3 is 1 471 vs target of 1 363

Goal 3: Reach all key and vulnerable populations with customised and targeted interventions

- District has a supporting partner who is providing health care services to sex workers (TB/HIV care, NACOSA)
- District has signed an MOU with LGBTI Community health partner also focusing on Key Populations (Gays, Lesbians, Transgender, MSM etc)
- High Transmission Area team provided HIV testing and counselling services to 1 289 key populations in Q3

Achievements/Successes

Goal 4: Address the social and structural drivers of HIV, TB and STIs

- World AIDS day at Mthonjaneni LM on 1/12/2019
- In Q3 AFSA reached 8 634 Adolescent girls and young women on prevention programmes ,at UMhlathuze, Target was 6 754.

Goal 5: Ground the response to HIV, TB and STIs in human rights principles and approaches

Goal 6: Promote leadership and shared accountability for a sustainable response to HIV, TB and STIs

Plans for the Next Quarter (Q4 FY 2019/20)

- Focus on Institutes of higher learning by conducting First things First, Graduate alive programmes and STI and Condom week
- Strengthen door to door community health services by conducting Qoqoqo campaigns in all 5 subdistricts
- Focus on youth and male population with the assistance of AIDS Foundation of South Africa (AFSA) supporting partner
- .Implementation of PrEP in high volume facilities
