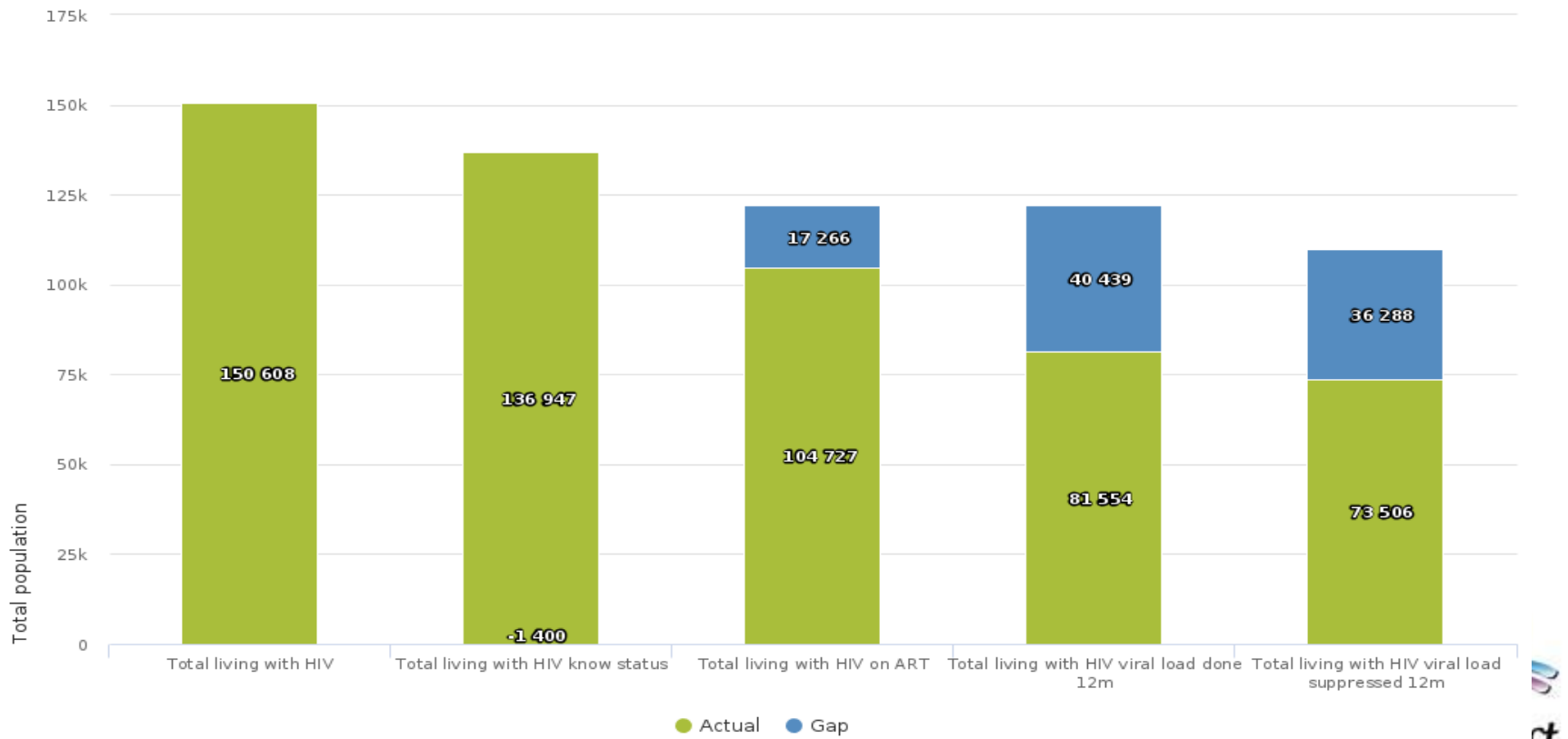

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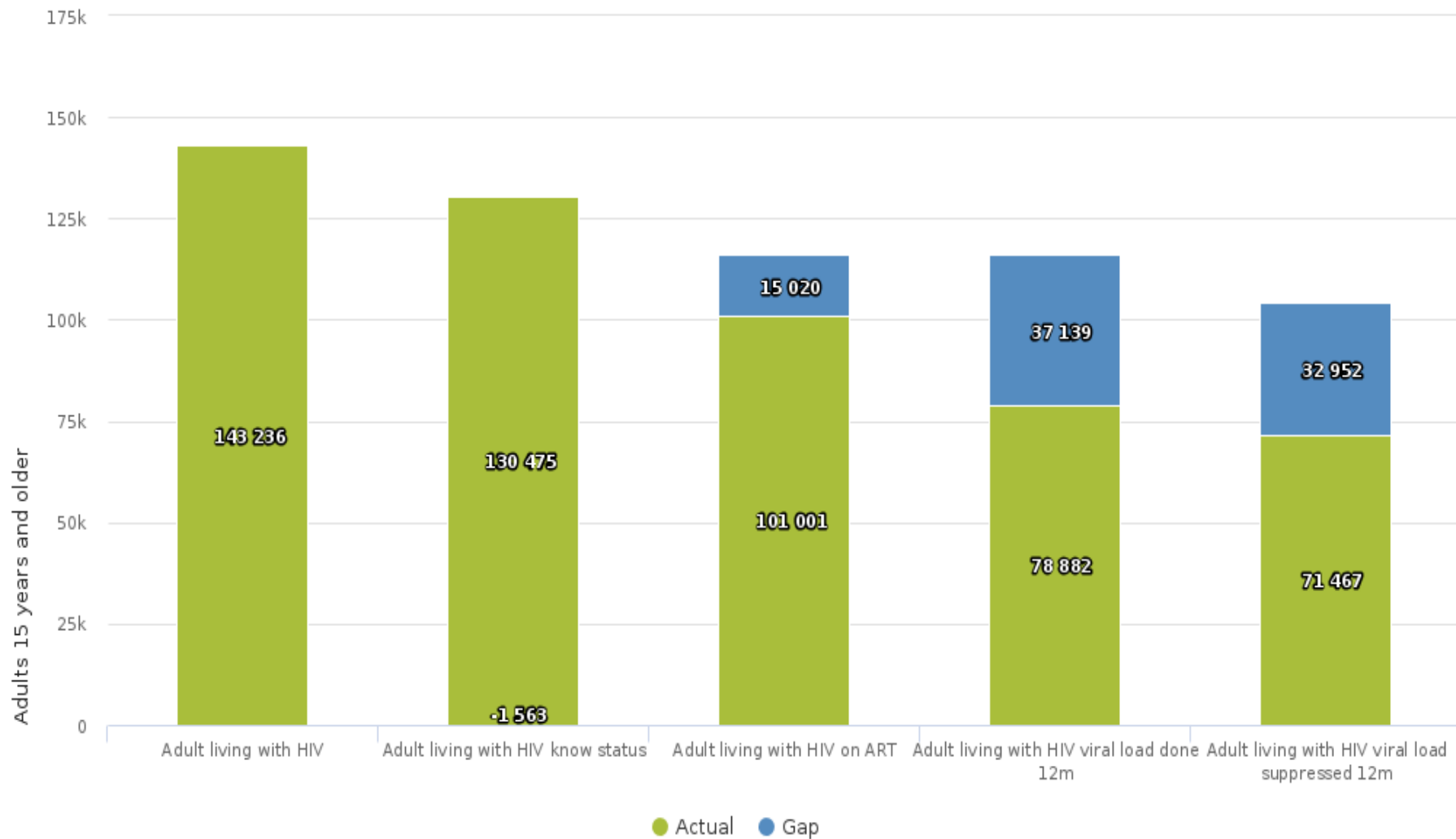
Total cascade 90-90-90 progress against targets

Bottle neck	Root cause	Remedial plan
Target exceeded, however the positivity rate remains a challenge.	Poor targeted testing of high modality patients, like comorbid clients, index contacts, breastfeeding women, patients presenting with STI.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Effectively advocate for index testing at facilities.• Testing of high modality targeted groups.e.g at farms• Taking testing serves to male dominated areas

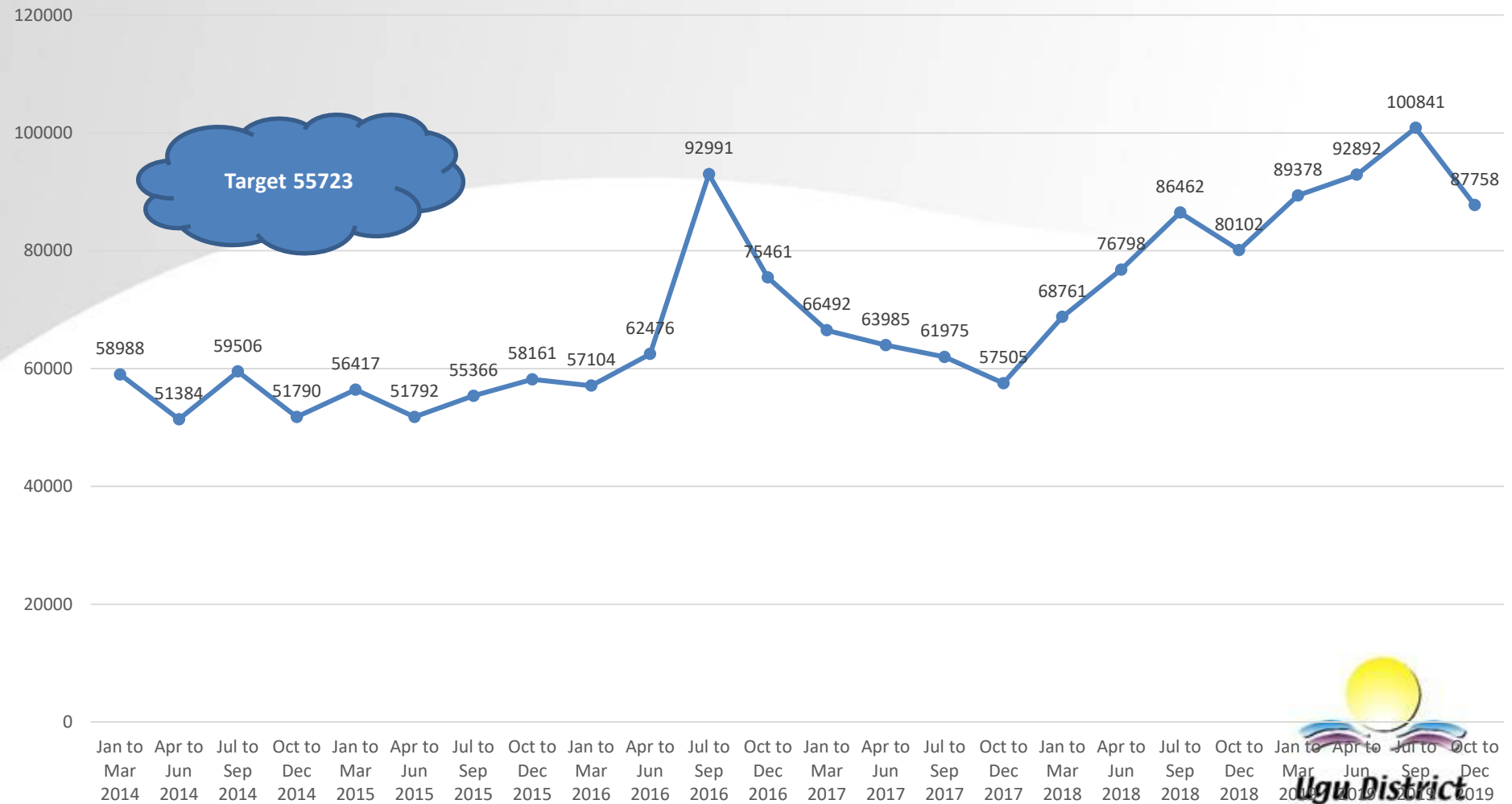
ADULT AND VIRAL LOAD CHALLENGES

Bottle neck	Root cause	Remedial plan
Patients not honoring appointments	High early missed from 1-28 days	-To implement 28 day tracking and tracing of patients.
Incorrect capturing of patients on clinical charts	Unscrupulous writing of clinical notes by clinicians on clinical charts	-facilities encouraged to include supporting patients on ART with adherence challenges by counselling for disclosure and educating and involving family members. This issue was critically discussed at the monitoring and response session and each facility were given their numbers of patients that were not initiated for follow up and initiation.

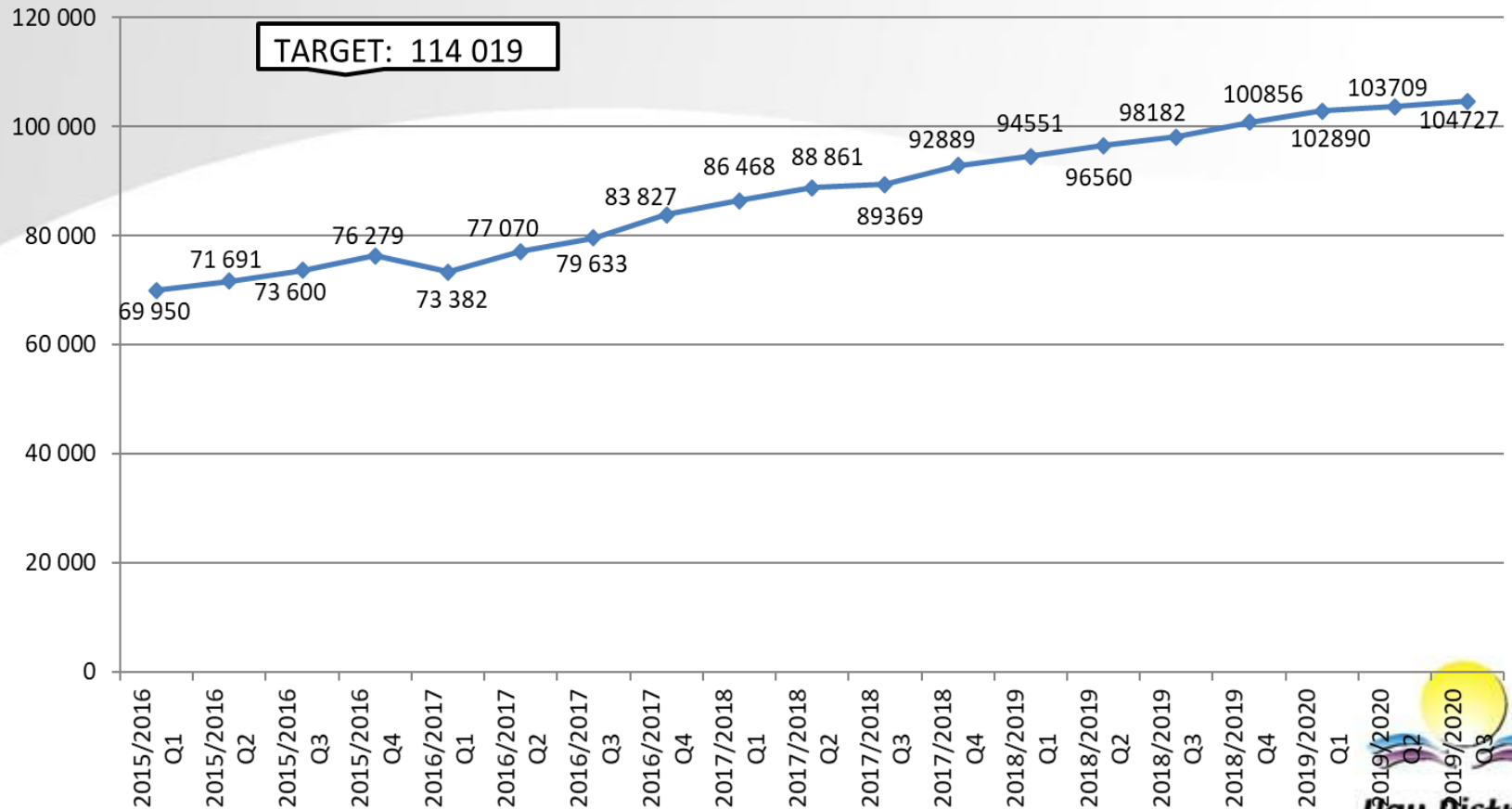

TOTAL NUMBER OF CLIENTS TESTED FOR HIV

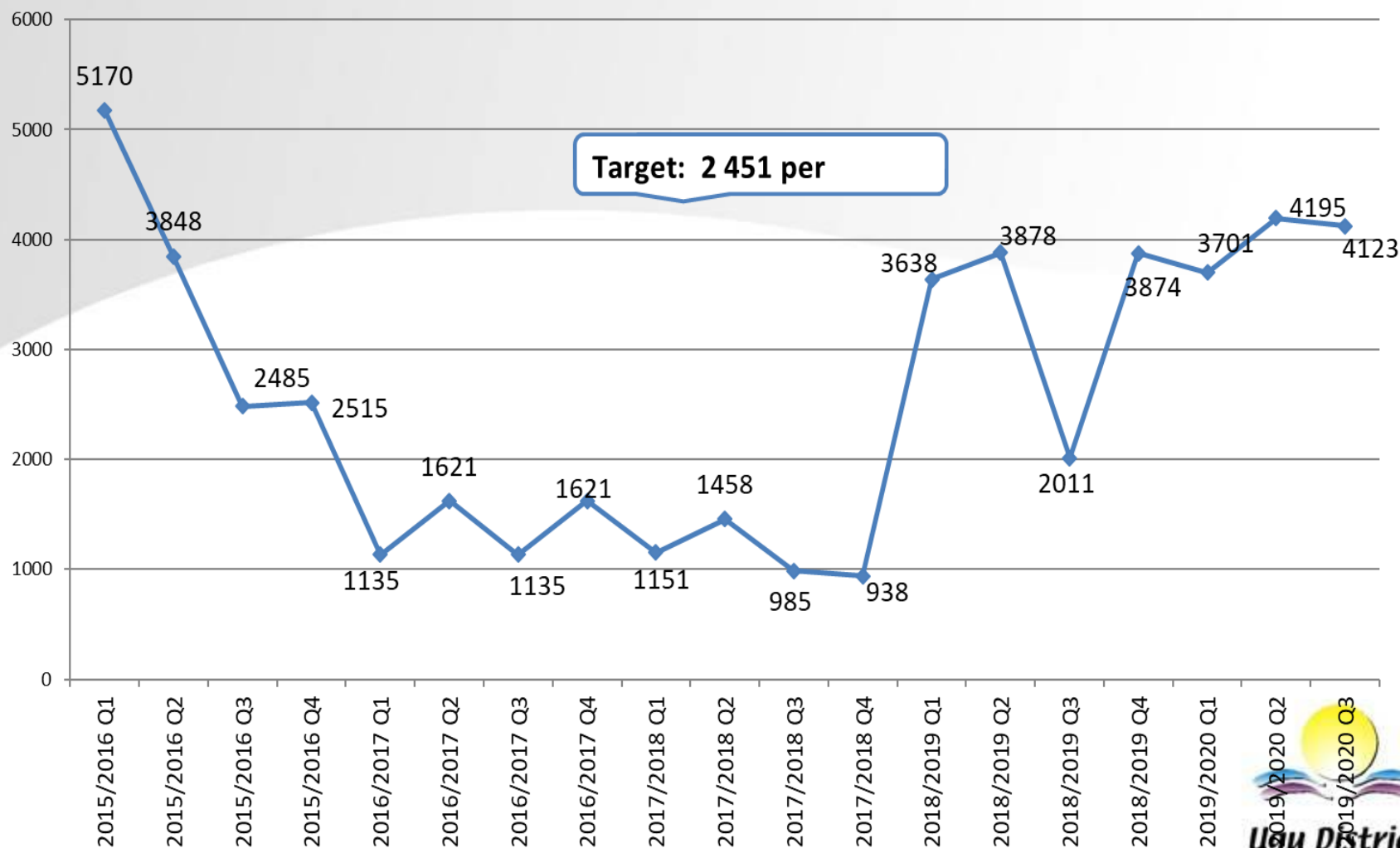


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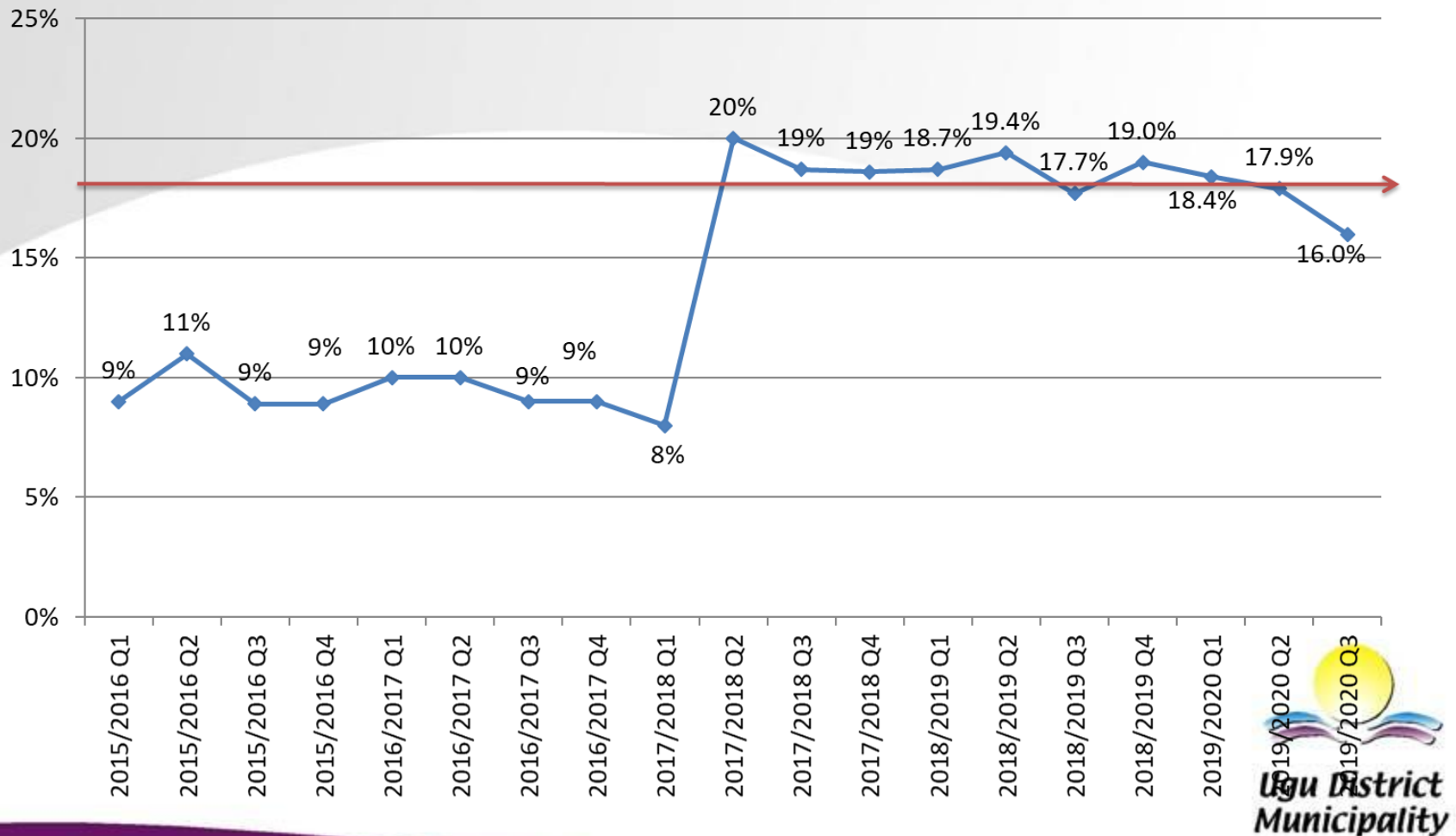
TOTAL NUMBER OF CLIENTS REMAINING ON ART: Q1 2015- Q3 2019



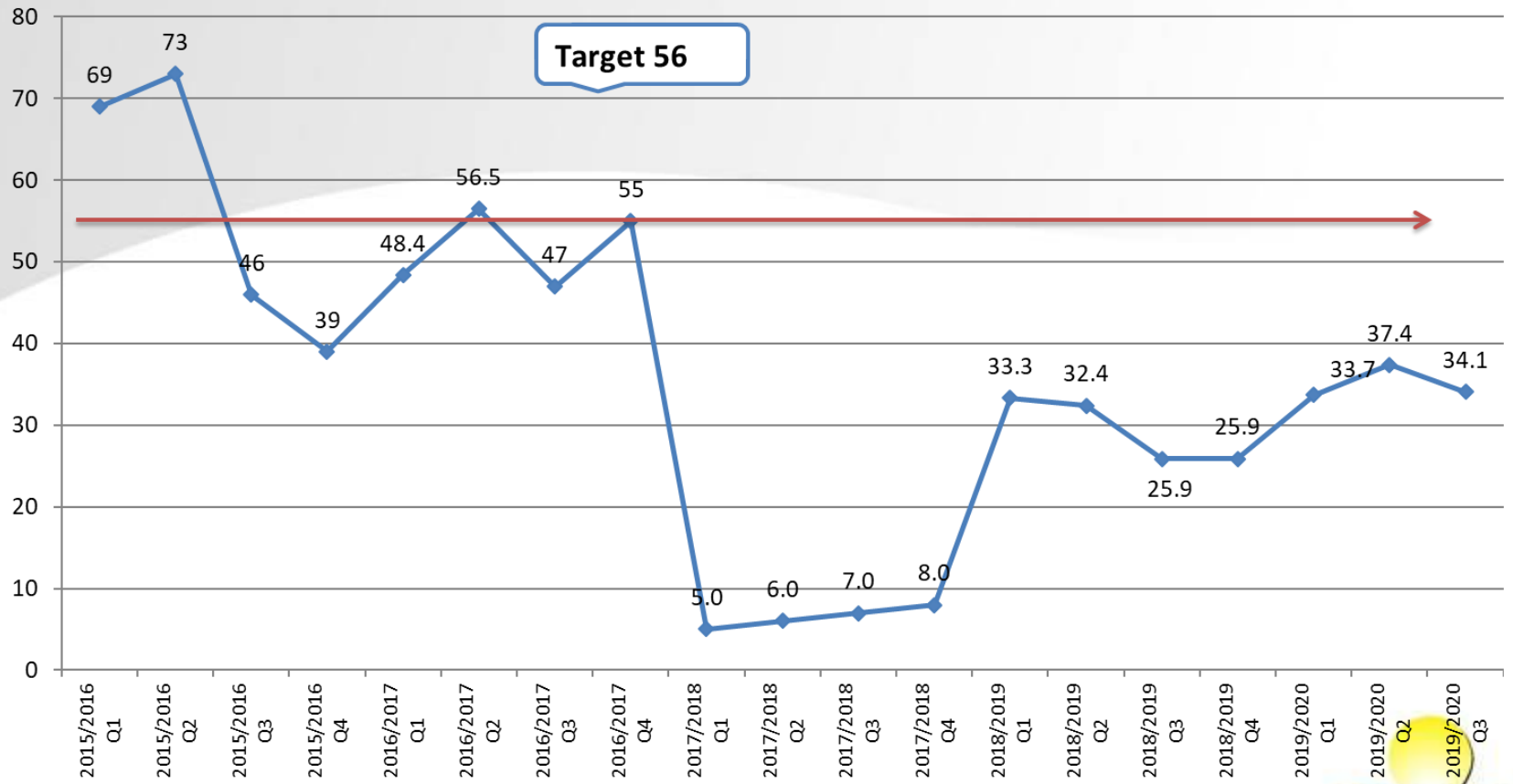
NO OF ADULTS MALES CIRCUMCISED: Q1 2015- Q3 2019



DELIVERY IN 10-19 YEARS FACILITY RATE Q1 2015-Q3 2019

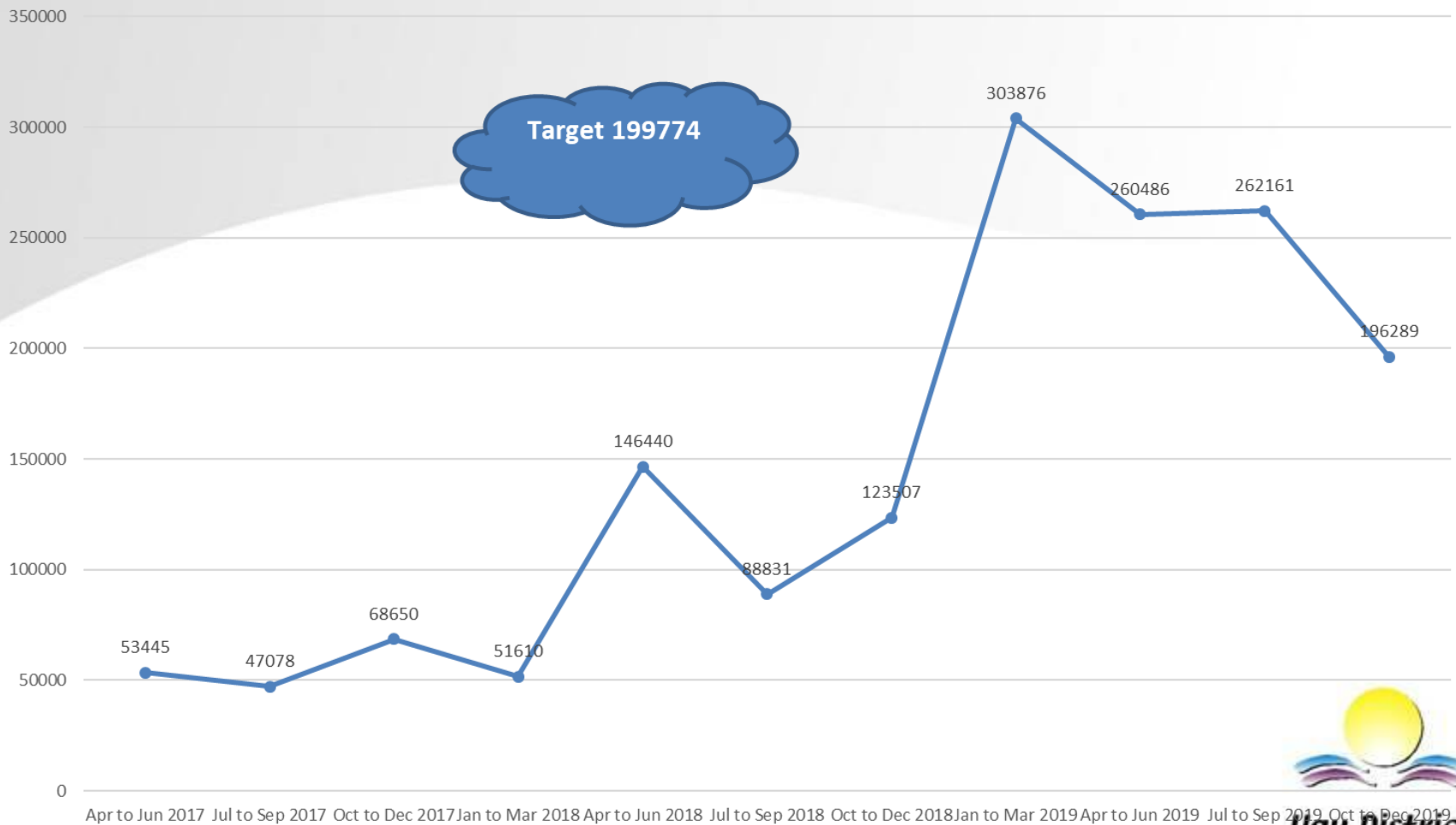


MALE CONDOM DISTRIBUTION Q1 2015-Q3 2019

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CHALLENGES

Challenge	Mitigation (Plans to Address Challenge)
Lost to follow up of both TB and ART clients	Emphasize Linkage into care of clients by the clinicians.
TB death rate was high due to high number of defaulters (105) and 89 death, in Q2 of 2019/20 we were on(10.4%),now we are sitting at 8.6%	Continue monitoring and early initiation of treatment to clients
Use of incorrect Condoms distribution reporting tools	Monitor use of correct Condoms distribution reporting tools
Ineffective data variance mop-up and data validation	Conduct data variance corrections mop-up and validations sessions monthly with the institutions and supporting partners

ACHIEVEMENTS/SUCCESSES

Goal 3: To reach all key and vulnerable populations with customised and targeted interventions

- World Aids day was commemorated at Umzumbe on the 01 December 2019, attended by 900 people. Various services conducted by government departments.
- 35 Youth attended district youth camp at Helahela in Richmond from 11-14 November 2019. Different stakeholders provided presentations on skills development. Youth benefited during the camp.
- Youth Abusing Substance abuse expressed their views during MEC visit on the 26 November 2019 to stop substance abuse. MEC commanded DSD intervention. DSD visited taxi rank and managed to interview 41 affected individuals that are living on the street.
- On the 26 November 2019 , 16 days of activism of no violence against women and children was commemorated at Kwa Xolo in ward 8. 1000 community members attended the event.
- Distribution of home base care kits to 19 beneficiaries and 50 nutritional supplements packs

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ACHIEVEMENTS/SUCSESSES

Goal 4: Address the social and structural drivers of HIV, TB and STIs

- 30 Traditional Healers were trained on symptoms of HIV & AIDS ,Cancer and STIs and were encouraged to refer their clients.
- Conducted HIV and AIDS Awareness campaigns in Amalangen Community hall and in four schools i.e. Mcushwa High school, Mphelelwa High School, Phindavele Secondary and Ingwemabala High School. Reached 2500 people.
- Conducted Awareness campaign on Sexual Assault in Kwa Machi Hall, 70 people reached
- Conducted Prayer for immorals in ward 3 of Umuziwabantu, reached 200 people
- March against gender based violence- 150 people reached
- Conducted 3 Awareness Campaigns on HIV and AIDS in ward 1, 5 and 6 of Umuziwabantu Municipality, reached 600 people reached

ACHIEVEMENTS/SUCSESSES

- Gender Based Awareness campaign for youth in ward 7 of Umuziwabantu, 200 people reached

- Anti Women Abuse Campaign in ward 9, Hhafuleni School – 200 people reached

Goal 5 Ground the response to HIV, TB and STIs in human rights principles and approaches

- Lobby for individual allocation of home based care kits and nutritious supplements.
- Clients were encouraged to attend support groups where they will receive counselling

ACTIVITY 1

- Strengthen TLD [Tenofovir Lamivudine Dolutegravir] initiation and transitioning to legible clients
- Conduct in service training on PrEP [Pre exposure Prophylaxis] and initiate legible clients at PHC level
- Strengthen giving of information through literacy classes to assist with issues of non disclosure especially with children.
- Implementation of M2M[mother to mother] framework which seeks to improve access to and uptake of quality adolescent and youth friendly HIV & PMTCT/ MNCWH[Prevention of mother to child transmission/ Mother ,neonate, child and woman's health] services among pregnant and postnatal adolescent and young mothers[15 – 24 years]
- To continue with accelerated plans on TRAP [Treatment Retention Accelerated Plan]and February frenzy were monitoring of HIV & AIDS program is intensified.
