Taking ARVs and accepting Jesus as my Lord and was the best thing I did, today I am not ashamed of being HIV positive because I know my Redeemer lives. I am calling upon all those who are in hiding to come and join me in the struggle against this virus. Our government is trying by all means to help us, but if we do not come forward, it won't be easy. Just imagine if we were all to come out, how many families do you think will appreciate having their loved ones around a bit longer? I real believe that I'm still going to live till the cure is there.

You know since the day I accepted that I am living with HIV, I vowed to myself that I am going to find as many people who are living with HIV as I can. I am trying very hard it's not easy and I don't want to be alone in this fight, I will never allow HIV to deprive me by looking down upon myself, even with HIV I'm still a human being above all I am a child of God and I do believe that I was brought in this world for certain purpose which I am not going to die till I fulfil it. For me to succeed I apply the `RDP` method which is RESILIENCE, DETERMINATION and PERSEVERANCE.

RESILIENCE means to stay focused on achieving your goals no matter the odds and with DETERMINATION you will never go. A determined person always finds a way, with PERSEVERANCE you will reach your goals and dreams by taking a step as the saying goes `A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step`.
