FOR: IMMEDIATE RELEASE KZN EXECUTIVE COUNCIL APPOINTS ANTI-RHINO POACHING TASK TEAM

Pietermaritzburg, 22 September 2016: The KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Executive Council, has appointed an anti-rhino poaching task team that will conduct a full assessment of the current measures and capacities of the anti-rhino poaching initiatives in the province.

The appointment of this task team follows an alarming escalation in the numbers of rhinos poached annually in this province. In this year alone 107 rhinos have been poached in KZN with the highest numbers being from the Hluhluwe and Imfolozi Game Reserve.

The task team will include:-

- A representative from KZN Ezemvelo Wildlife;
- A representative from the South African Police Services;
- A representative from the Premier's office;
- An international policing expert; and;
- A legal expert from the Ian Player foundation

This task team terms of reference will also include, conducting an assessment of the criminal justice processes in relation to the poaching incidents at all levels and also evaluate if the current provincial human and logistical resources are sufficient to turn the tide against rhino poaching.

The task team will have to provide a report with recommendations to the Provincial Executive Council within six months. Commenting on the establishment of the task team Premier Willies Mchunu said the team must ensure that it developed innovative ways to curb rhino poaching as syndicates were becoming sophisticated in their methods of poaching rhinos.

This team must look at all possible ways in which we can strengthen our anti-poaching campaigns and strengthen the resources of our law enforcement agencies," said Mchunu.
