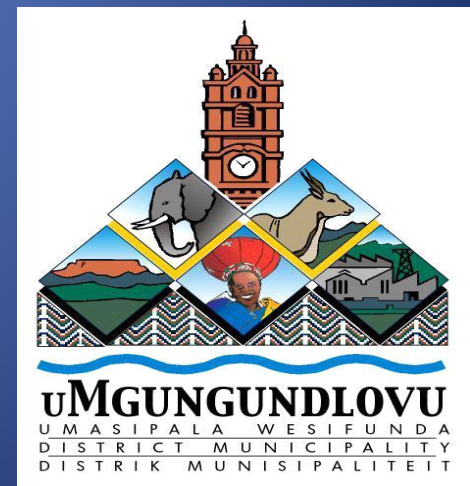

#### Comments

- The number of people aged between 25 – 49 reached with anti-gender based violence increased from 775 (first quarter) to 3249 (third quarter), and the increase is merely around November – December 2013 when 16 Days of Activism awareness campaigns were undertaken.
- The number of people reached with anti-gender and prevention information reduced from 2352 (first quarter) to 768 (third quarter). On the 2014/15 financial year, we aim to increase this number by focusing more on this age group on all messages aimed at anti-gender based violence.

**Comments**

- The number of registered OVC's/OVC's in schools increased from quarter 1 to quarter 3 - this indicates that the number of new intakes, including the already registered OVC's on the register, has increased on both indicators.
- The number of registered OVC's receiving care and support from the Organisations funded by DSD has increased, the package of services includes: 1) Psychosocial Support, 2) School Uniform, 3) Food Parcels & 4) Cooked Meals.

### Comments

- The number of learners pregnant per each Quarter is alarming, a reduction in the third quarter may contribute to writing of exams and End of Year holiday breaks, but the reality is that Teenage Pregnancy remains high in the District.
- The uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council in partnership with the Department of Education rolled-out a Teenage Pregnancy Project aimed at reducing incidences of Teenage Pregnancy through understanding the root causes of Teenage Pregnancy by engaging Learners, Educators and Parents on a Community Dialogue aimed at unravelling the issues and prescribing positive recommendations. The Teenage Pregnancy Project will be rolled-out throughout the District in a near future – this will enable a District Point of View on Teenage Pregnancy. The Department of Health and partner RMCH assisted in conducting teenage pregnancy workshops on the 10<sup>th</sup> of October 2013. 30 teenage mothers attended, we visited St Josephs school 40 grade 11& 12 pupils were reached.

# Comments:

- The District is doing very well in the mother to baby HIV transmission as the Provincial Target is  $< 3\%$  and the District has performed as follows:
- District- 0.8 First Quarter and 1.7 second quarter **which are both under 3%**
- Support by our Partners e.g. 2000+ assisted in the improvement of the programme (prevention of mother to baby HIV transmission).
- The District is also doing well in the post - breastfeeding cessation target at 18 months

- The annual target is 39 266 and currently 13 302 has been done for the 3 quarters.
- The quarterly target for MMC is 9816 males circumcised.
- The district is below the target.
- The withdrawal of one NGO on MMC had a negative impact on the program.

- The District has put the following strategies to catch up on the target:
  - ✓ Operation Hlola Manje Zivikele campaigns in all wards .
  - ✓ Facilities including development partners have been requested to develop HCT catch up plans.
  - ✓ Awareness campaigns in all local municipalities to educate people on the need for regular testing.
  - ✓ District HCT roving team assisted by Khethimpilo will start in the next Quarter.

- The new cases are down this quarter compared to previous quarters and the initiation on prophylaxis has improved.
- 48% cases of the sexual assault cases were not given prophylaxis because they came after 72 hours & 22% tested HIV positive prior to PEP.
- 52% of sexual assault cases were of < 12 years.
- Operation Sukuma Sakhe War Room Task Teams to develop strategies in addressing this challenge.

### Comments

- As from Quarter 1 to Quarter 3 – the uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council in partnership with HST – Health Systems Trust and ETU – Education & Training Unit conducted a number of workshops throughout the District aimed at re-engineering; re-establishing and re-strengthening of WACS. The training schedule disrupted the scheduled meetings by Local AIDS Council because priority was given to WAC training/establishment throughout the District.
- The training of WACs by ETU and HST is now complete – 79 WACS established & trained, and the phase two of the WAC Project – focusing primarily focus on integrated strategy development (DAC/LAC/WAC/NGO'S & GOVT. DEPTS) and systems strengthening of WACs/LACs through an integrated approach.
- Reporting and submission of minutes for quarter three has already started which is an indication that the training received by WACs was effective, and the uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council is grateful of the work done by HST and ETU in this endeavour.
- The target is 7 LAC's submitting reports – we have not reached our target yet, but we remain confident that with the structures, strategies and the technical assistance from HST, ETU & NACOSA in place our target will be achieved.
