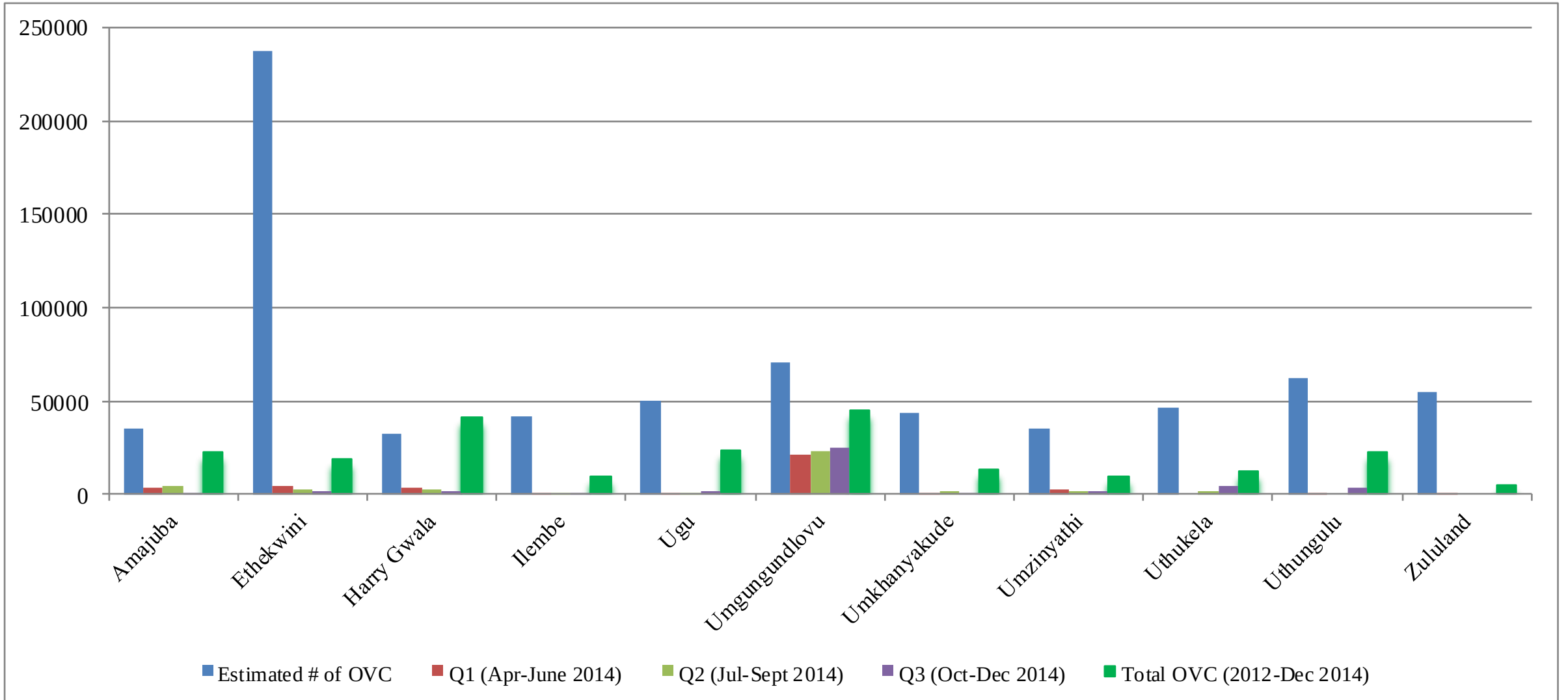

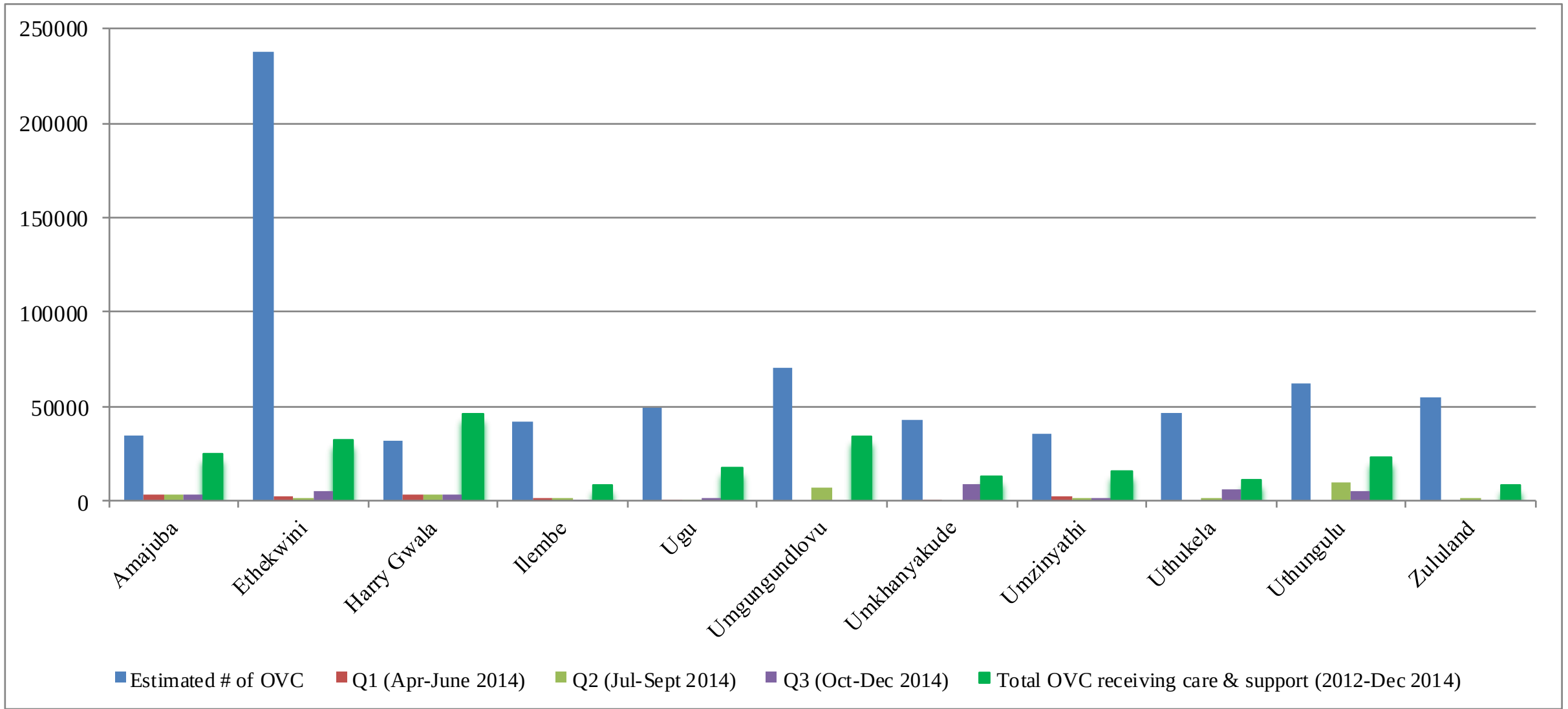

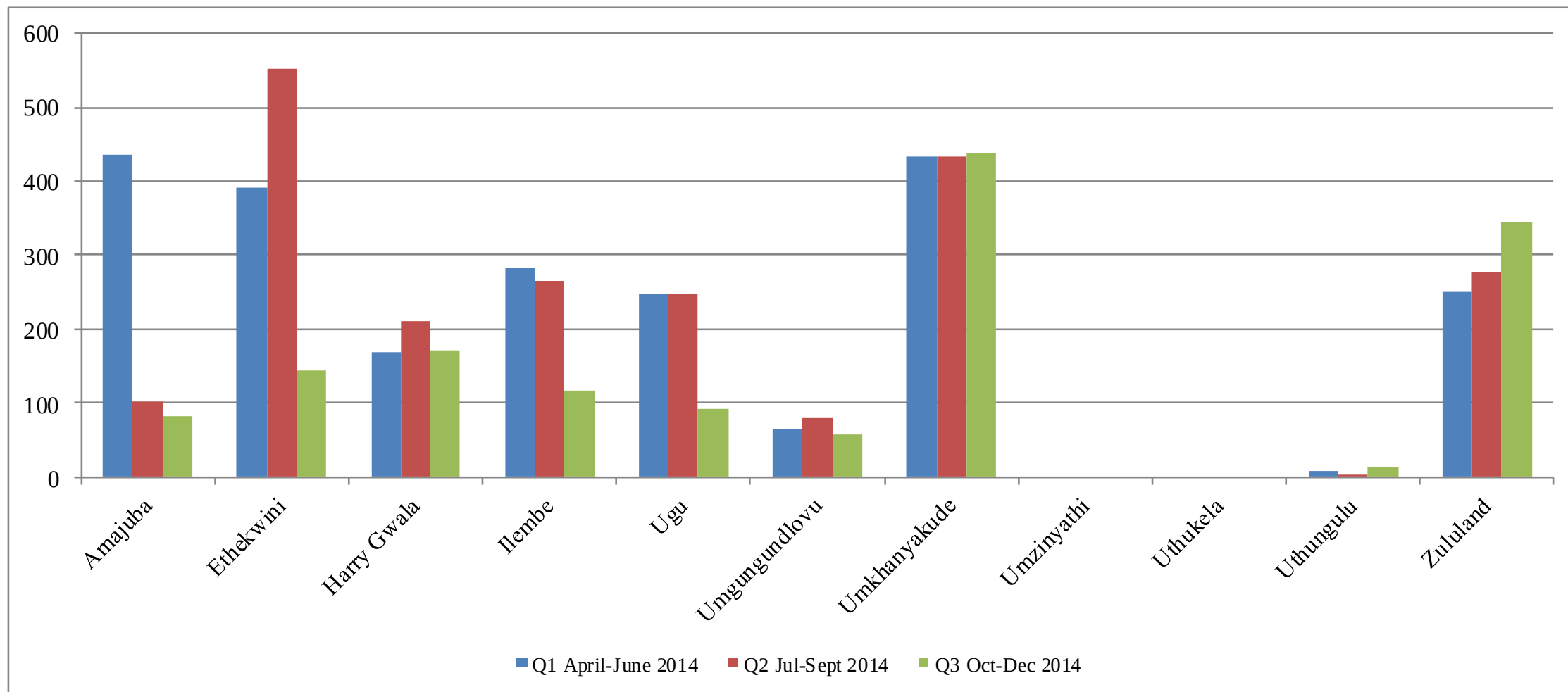
Number of registered OVC receiving care & support

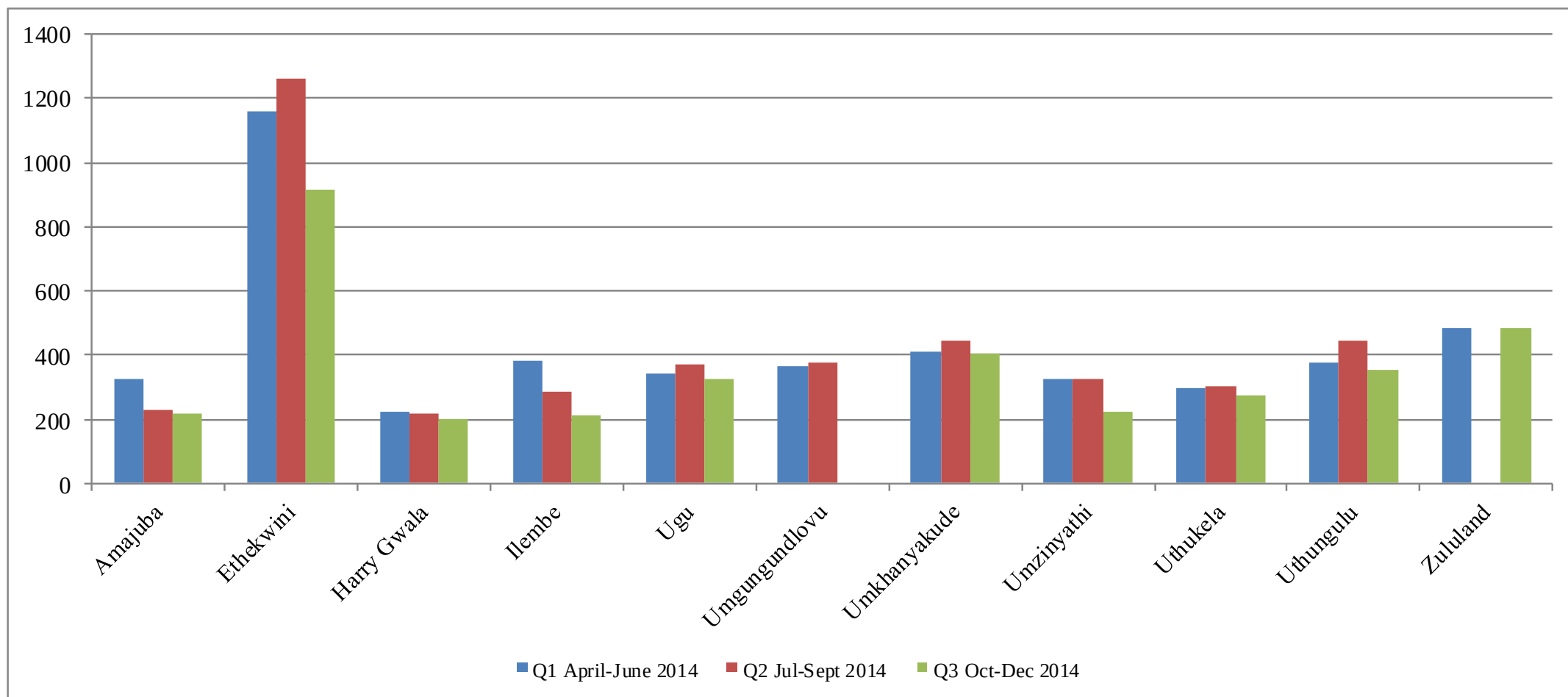

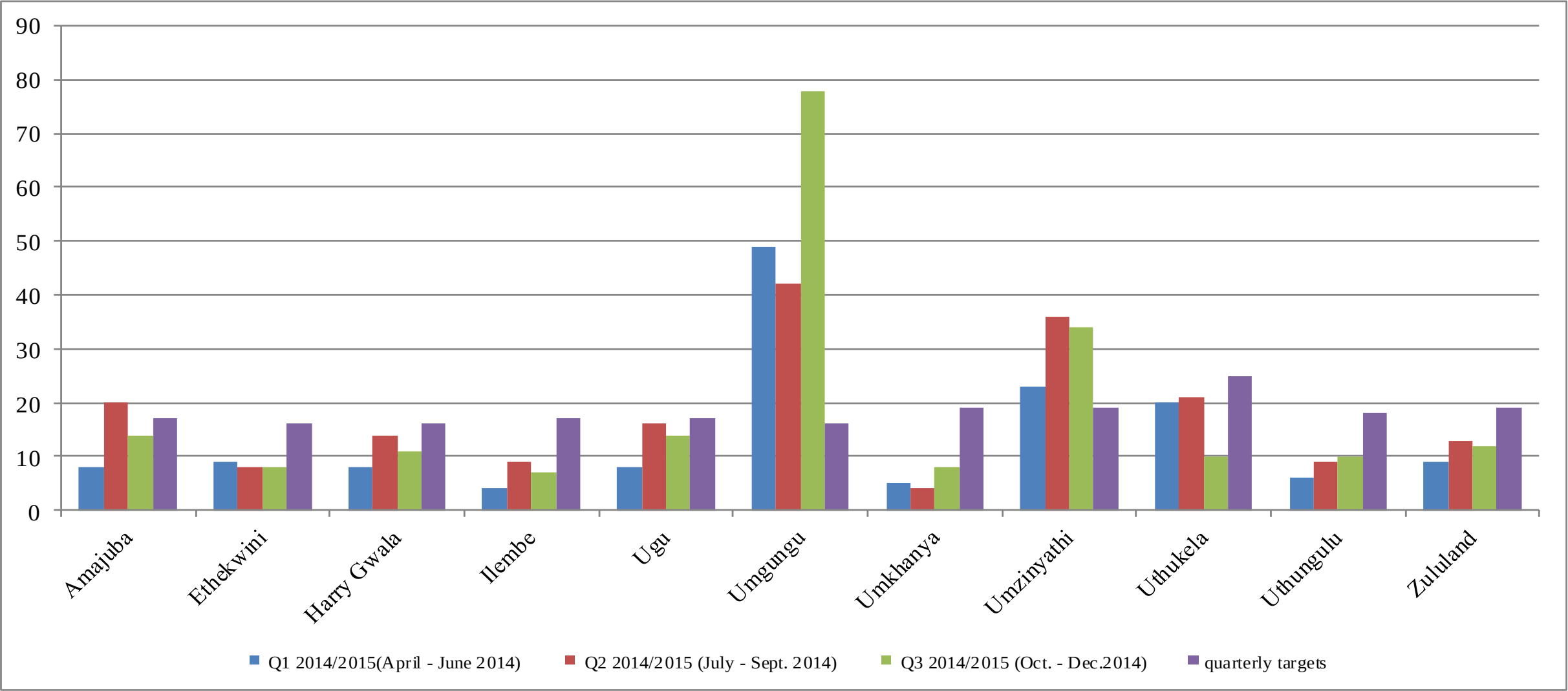

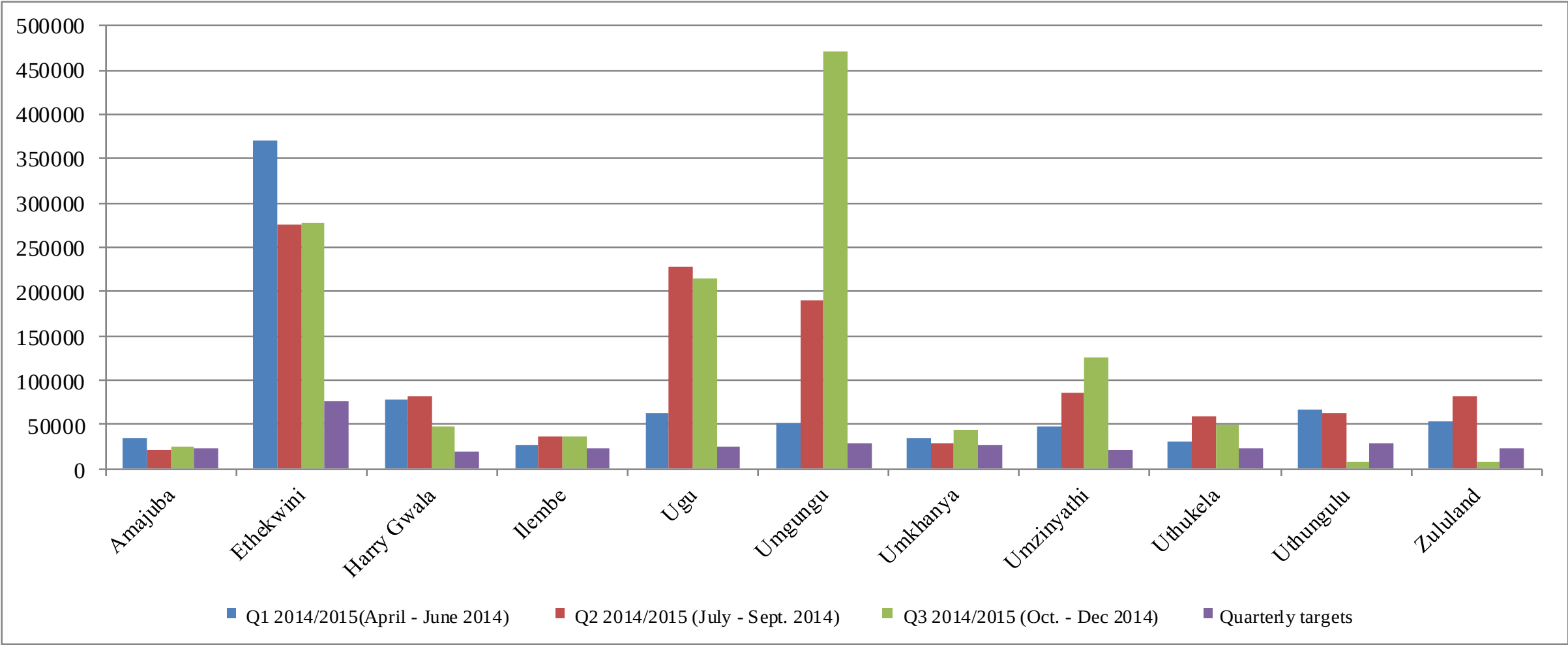
Condoms Accessibility: Number of male condoms distributed per male per quarter aged >15 years and older

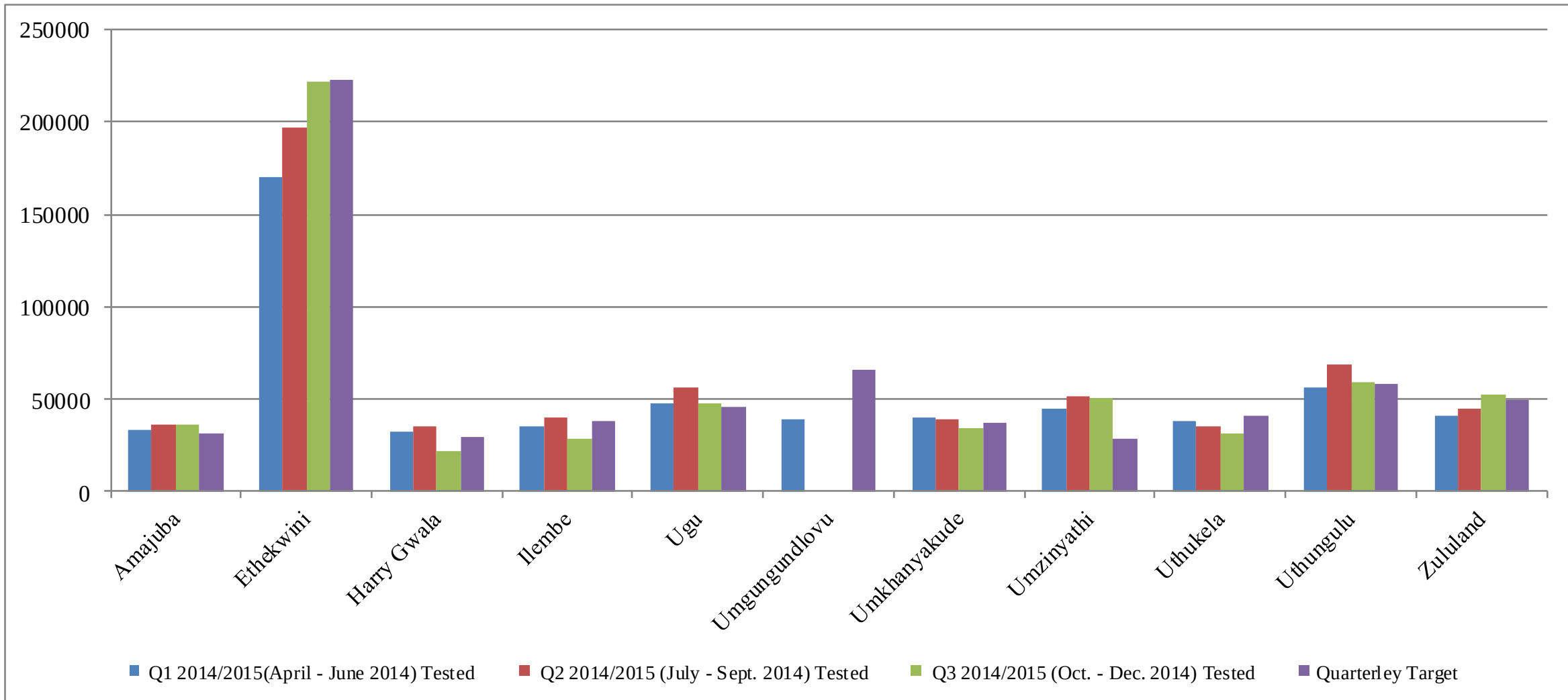
Condoms Accessibility-Number of female condoms distributed

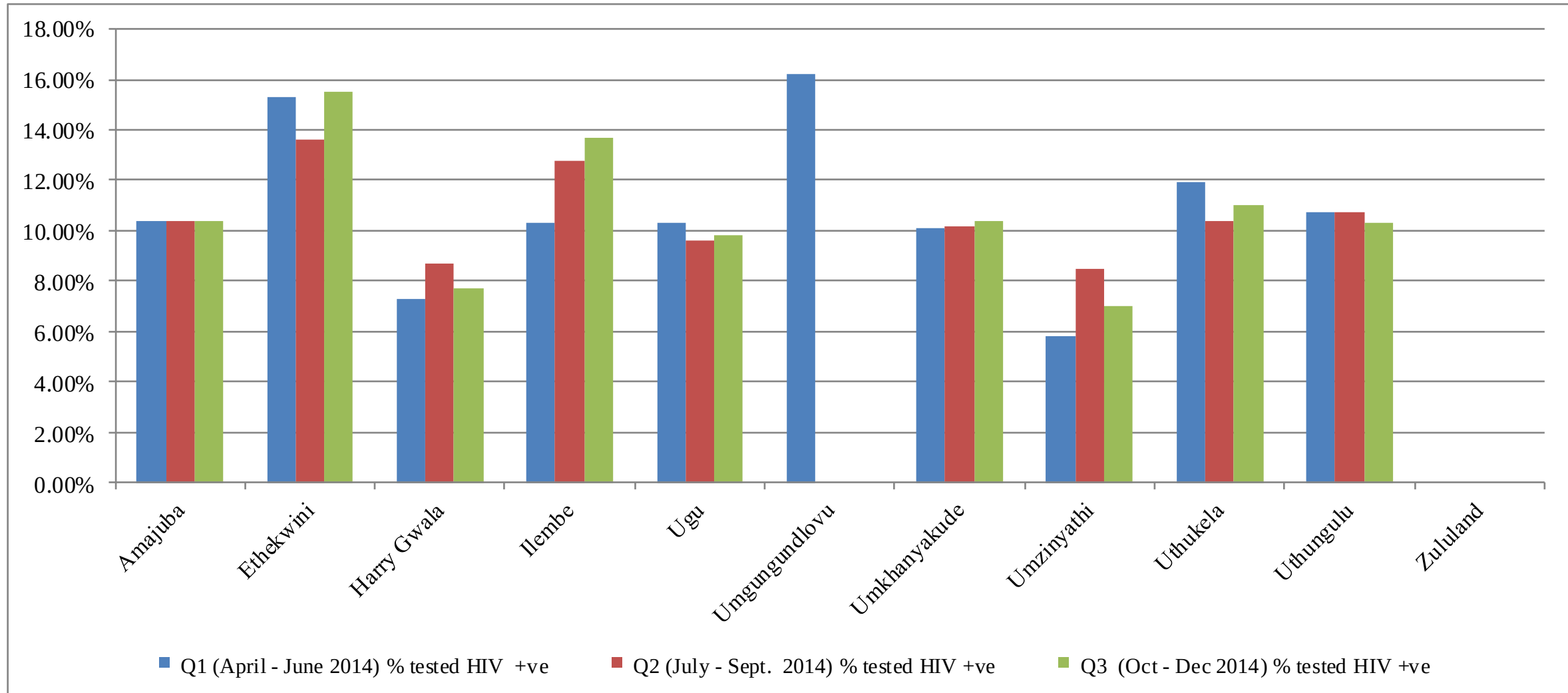

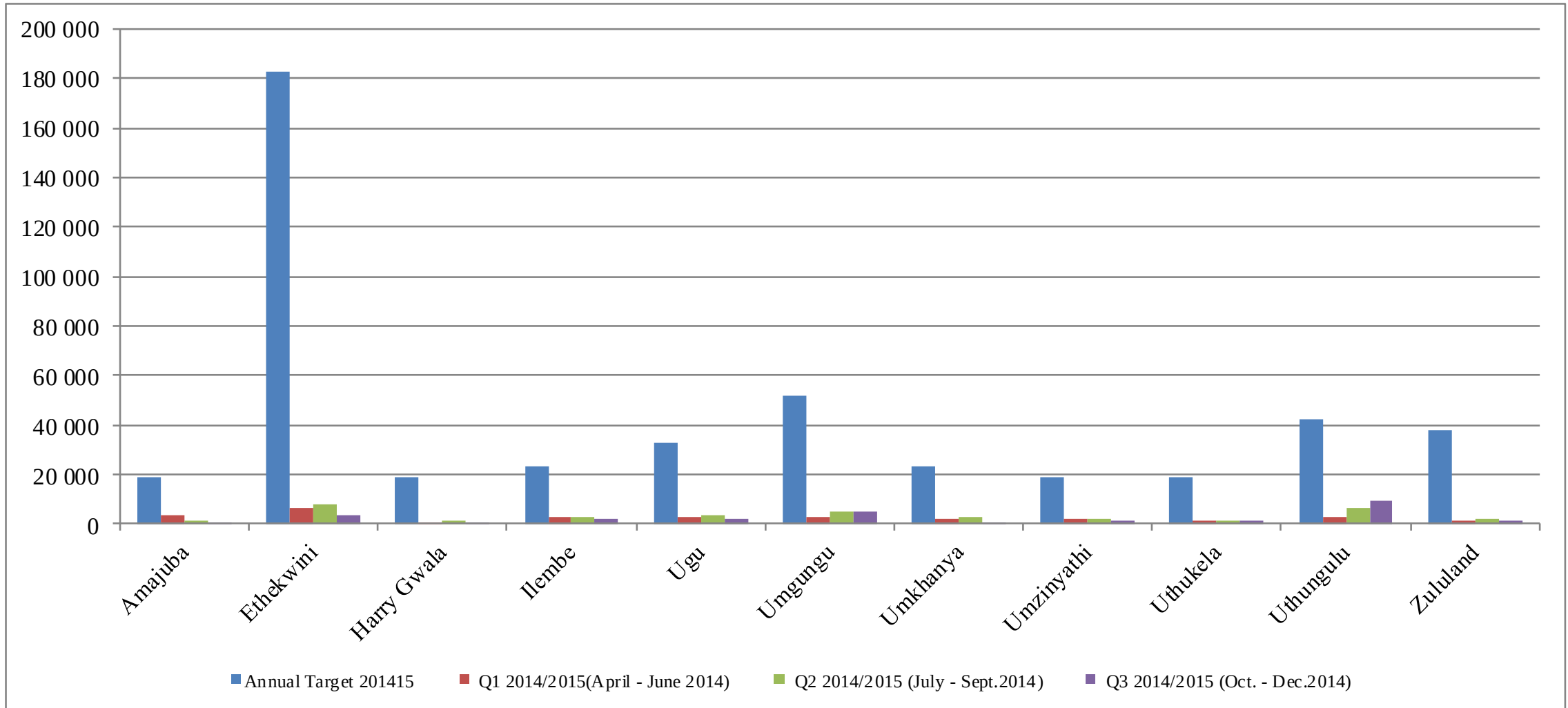

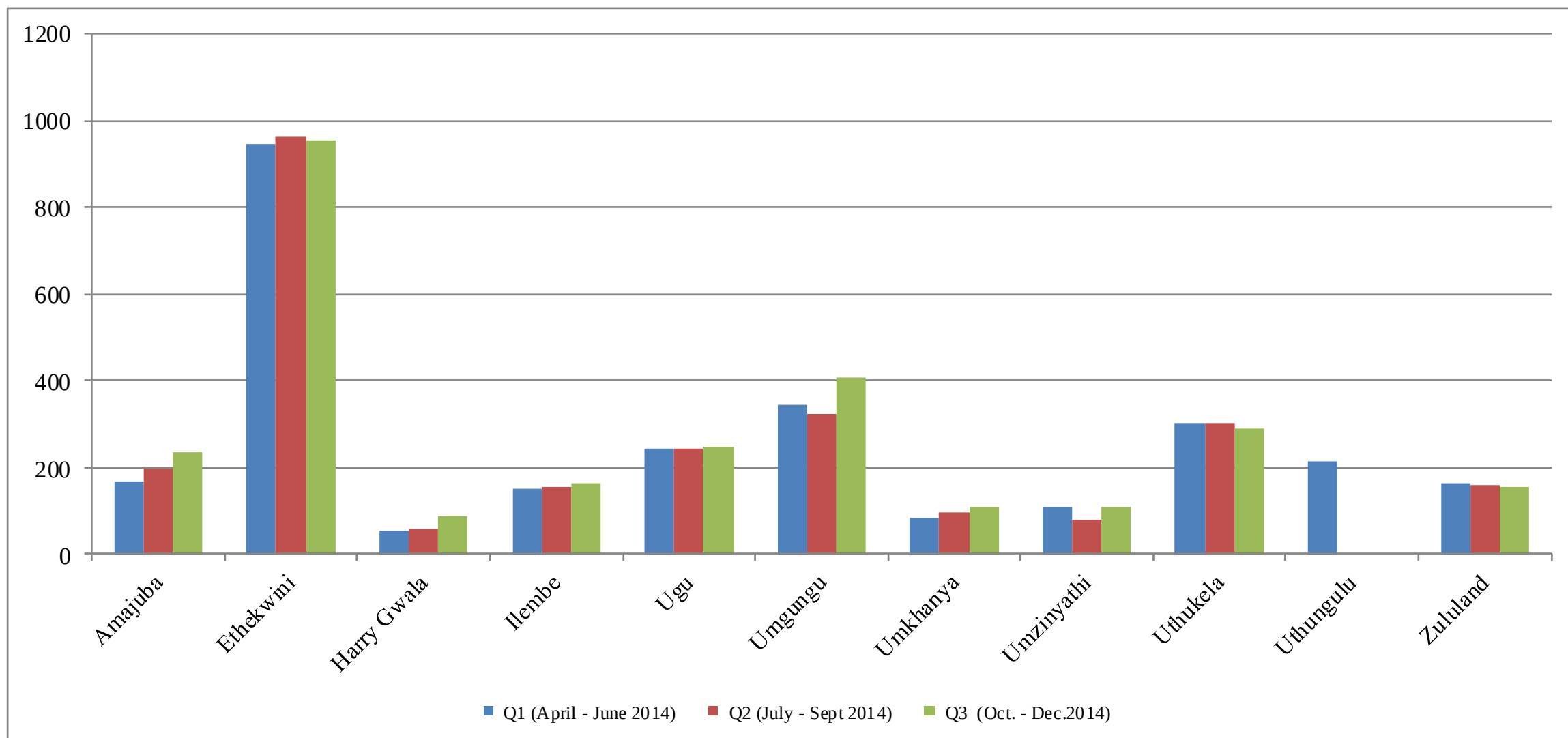
Medical Male Circumcision -Number of males aged 15-49 undergoing male medical circumcision

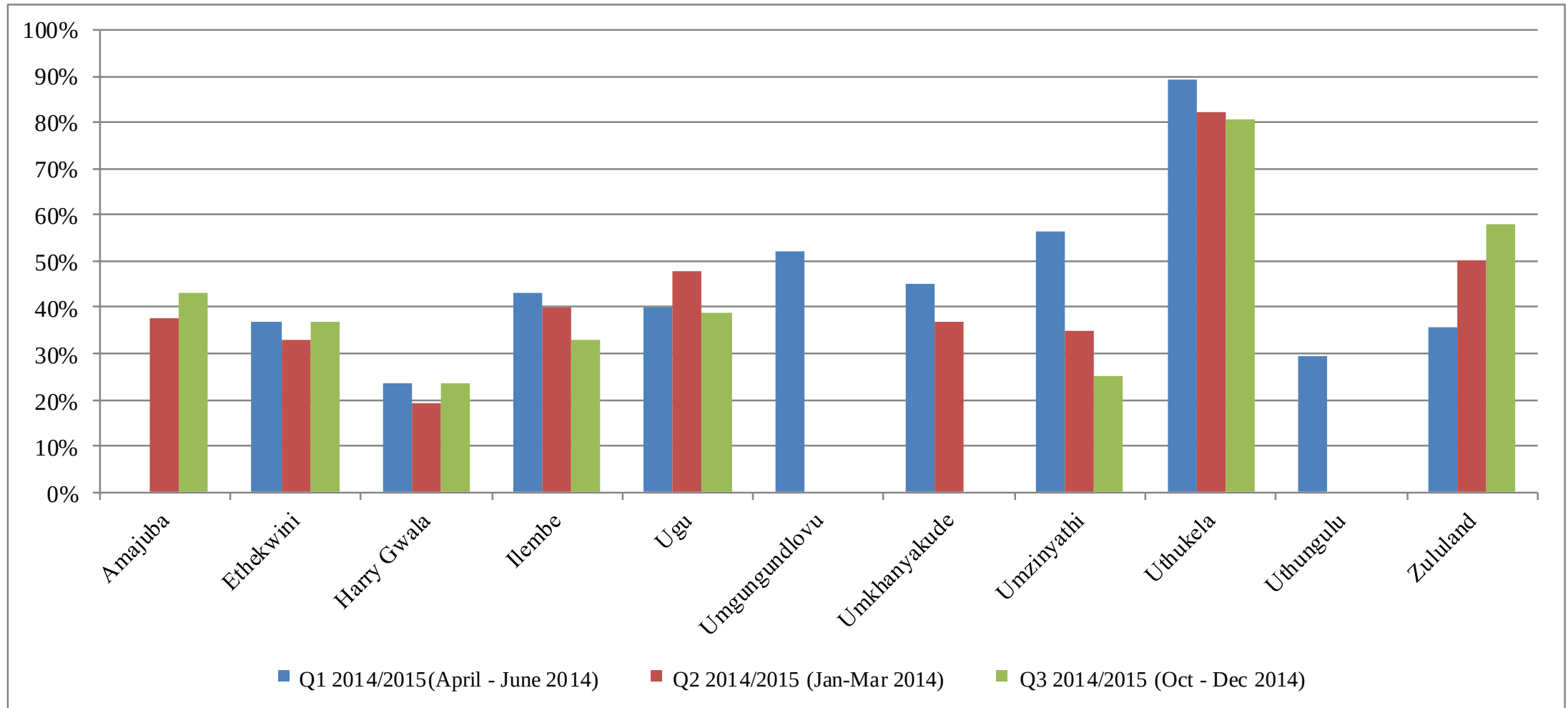

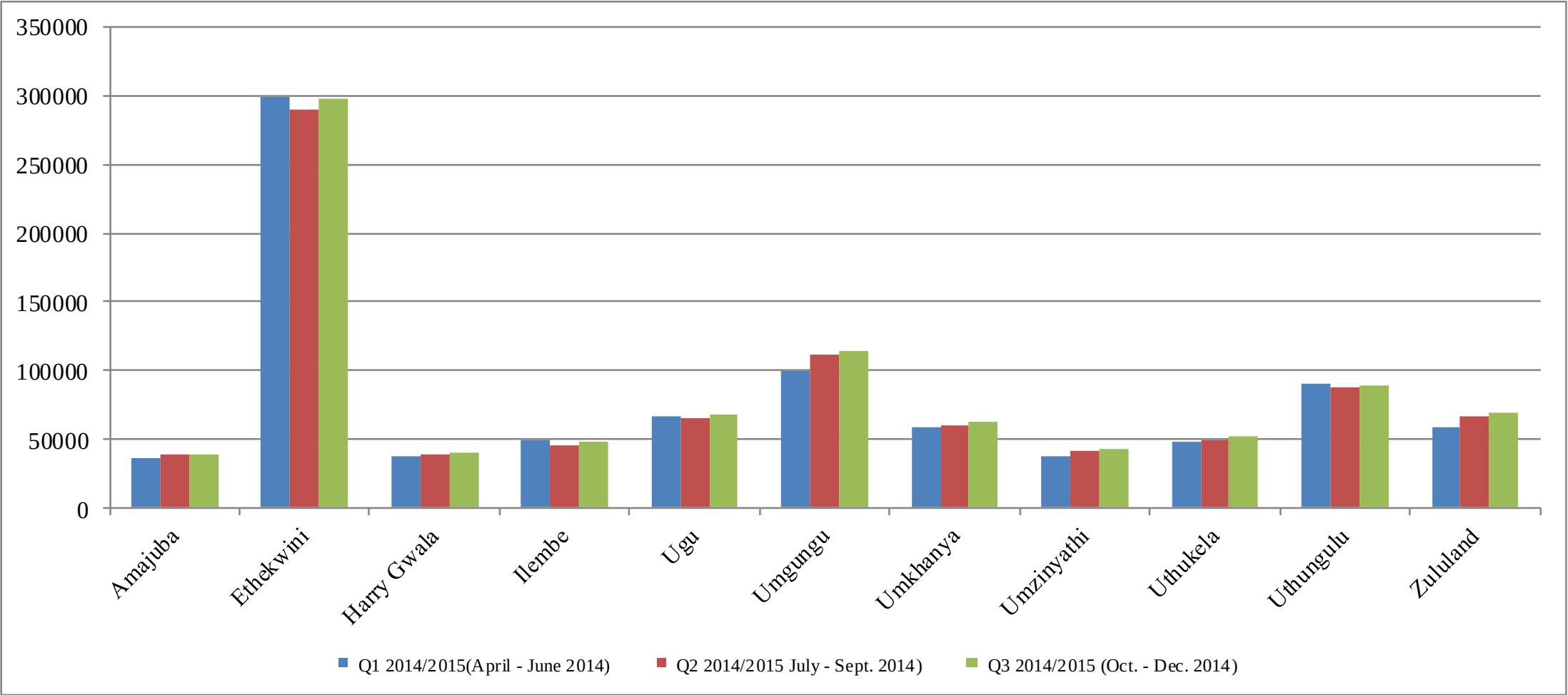
Gender Based Violence-Children under 12 Sexually Assaulted (%)

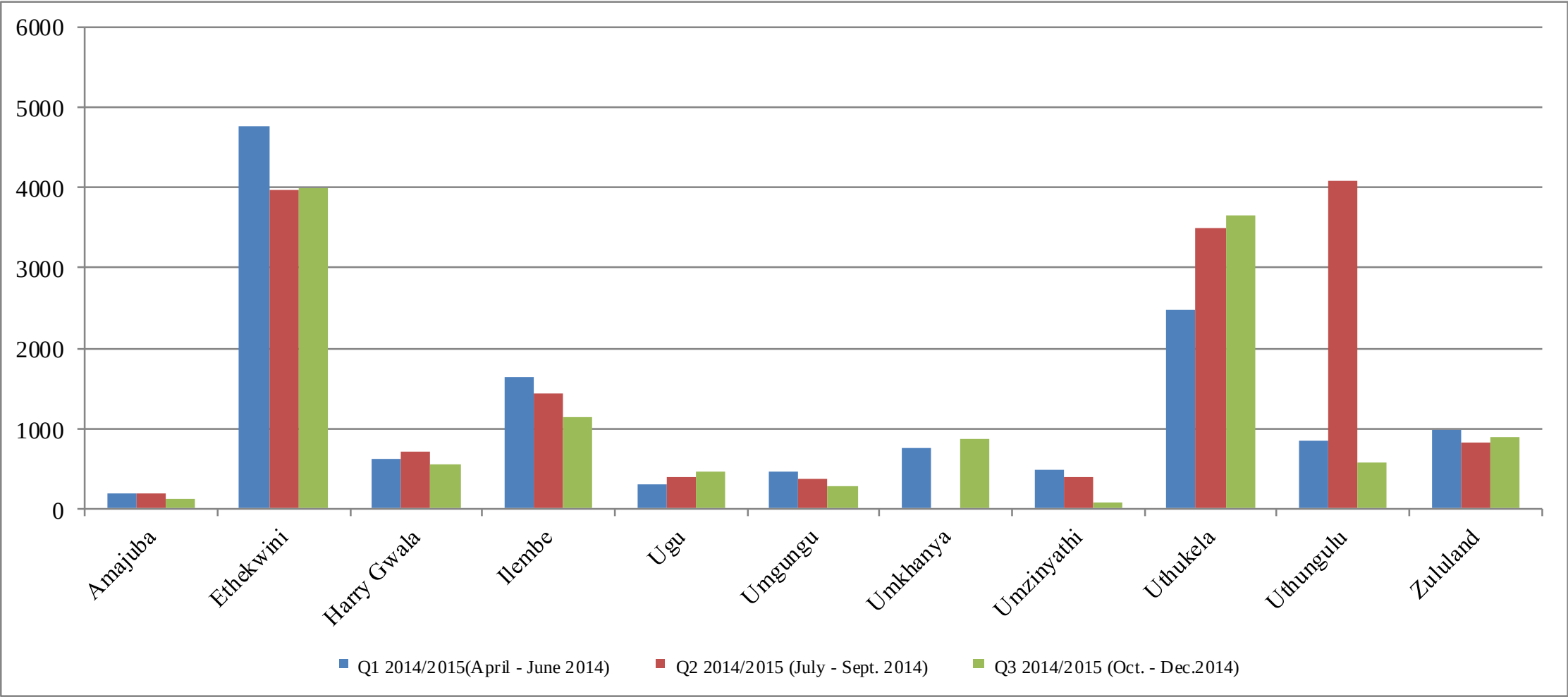
Comprehensive ART Services –Number of Clients Receiving ART

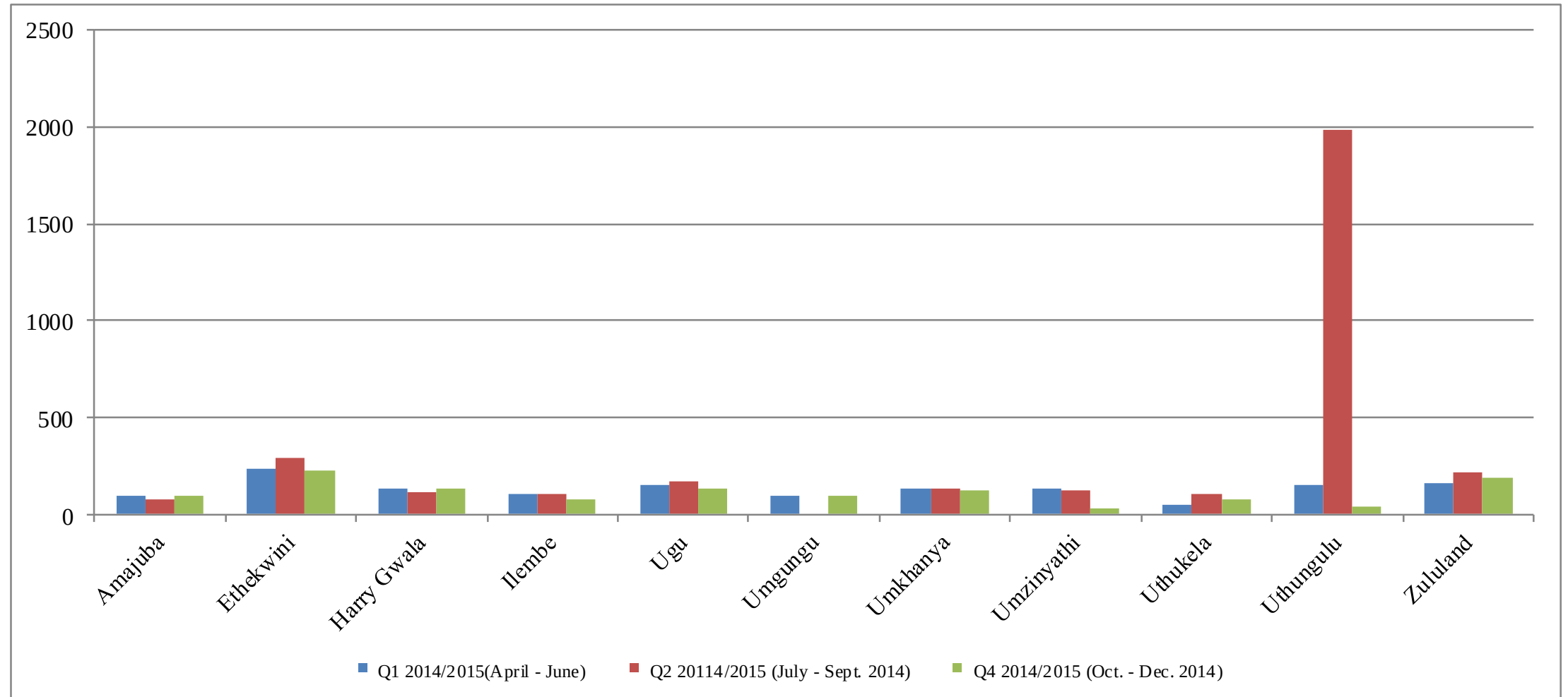
Comprehensive ART Services –Number of ART clients lost to follow up

Orphans & Vulnerable Children (OVC): <u>Registration</u>	41% of the estimated number of orphans & vulnerable children registered in the province have been registered Harry Gwala, uMgungundlovu and Amajuba have registered highest percentage numbers of OVCs Registration percentage across other districts still low Zululand and eThekwini with lowest registration numbers
Orphans & Vulnerable Children: <u>Care & Support</u>	44% of the registered OVCs receiving care & support in the Province Amajuba and Harry Gwala with highest percentage of OVCs receiving care & support eThekwini & Zululand with lowest percentages of OVC receiving care & support The rest of the districts displaying moderate to low percentages (range 20%-48%) of OVC receiving care and support
Life Skills: Learner Pregnancies	Most districts showing decrease in number of learner pregnancies. Amajuba with lowest number of learner pregnancies. uMkhanyakude and Zululand with highest number of learner pregnancies.

Life Skills: <u>Deliveries Under 18 Years</u>	3133 deliveries under 18 in the province in quarter 3 as compared to 4256 in quarter 2 and 4691 in quarter 1. Deliveries under 18 across most district has declined. Amajuba, Harry Gwala iLembe and uMzinyathi consistently showing decrease in deliveries under 18 years
Condoms Accessibility: <u>Male Condoms distribution</u>	All districts have achieved their male condoms distribution targets. In quarter 3 48 186 210 male condoms were distributed as compared to 54 627 468 in quarter 2 and 52 080 924 in quarter 1. uMgungundlovu distributed the highest amount of condoms.
Condoms Accessibility: <u>Condoms distributed per male per quarter</u>	In quarter 3, 12 male condoms were accessible to an eligible male compared to 14 in quarter 2 and 9 in quarter 1. Most districts achieved the set targets. uMgungundlovu and uMzinyathi remain with commendable numbers of male condoms distributed per male per quarter at an average of 59 and 31 respectively eThekwini iLembe, uThungulu and uMkhanyakude with lowest number of condoms per male ranging 7 -10

Condoms distributed per male per quarter

In quarter 3, 12 male condoms were accessible to an eligible male compared to 14 in quarter 2 and 9 in quarter 1.
Most districts achieved the set targets.
uMgungundlovu and uMzinyathi remain with commendable numbers of male condoms distributed per male per quarter at an average of XXX and 31 respectively
eThekwini iLembe, uThungulu and uMkhanyakude with lowest number of condoms per male ranging 7 -10

Female Condoms Distribution

835070 female condoms distributed in the province in quarter 3 compared to 961367 in quarter 2 and 1 274 251 in quarter 1.
Most district exceeded their quarterly targets
Amajuba, eThekwini, iLembe, uMkhanyakude and uMzinyathi showing increase in number of female condoms distributed.
UThungulu showed a drastic decrease in Q3
However, the numbers are still insufficient when calculated as “condoms distributed per eligible female per quarter.

HIV Testing: <u>Number of HIV Tests carried out</u>	583539 HIV tests carried out in quarter 3 as compared to 603787 in quarter 2 and 576145 in quarter 1 All districts met their quarterly targets. However testing numbers and across the districts are stable and increases not significant
HIV Testing: <u>Percent testing HIV positive</u>	The percentage of testing HIV positive in quarter 3 was 10.4% as compared to 10.3% in quarter 2 and 9.9% in quarter 1 Harry Gwala and uMzinyathi with lowest testing positive % Amajuba, uMkhanyakude and uThungulu showing stability in numbers testing positive. eThekwini and iLembe with highest percentage of testing positive. Increase in iLembe noted.
<u>Medical Male Circumcision: Males aged 15-49 medically circumcised</u>	22230 males circumcised in quarter 3 compared to 31098 in quarter 2 and 26559 in quarter 1 Most districts recording declining numbers of male circumcision in quarter 3 when compared to quarter 2. Consistent declines noted in Amajuba, uMzinyathi and uThukela. uThungulu only district with consistent increase

Gender Based Violence: New Sexual Assault Cases	2334 sexual assault cases were recorded in quarter 3 as compared to 2529 in quarter 2 and 2738 in quarter 1. Consistent decline noted in Zululand. uMzinyathi and uThukela with decreases between quarter 2 and quarter 3. Consistent increase in Amajuba, Harry Gwala and iLembe.
Gender Based Violence: <u>Children under 12 Sexually Assaulted(%)</u>	Sexual Assault cases in children remains generally high across districts Harry Gwala remains with lowest sexual assault cases among children aged 12.
Comprehensive ART Services: <u>Number of Clients receiving ART Services</u>	All districts showing increased numbers of clients on ART on a consistent basis.

Comprehensive ART Services: Number of ART clients deregistered due to loss of follow up

12595 ART client de-registered due to loss of follow up in quarter 3 as compared to 15864 in quarter 2 and 13476 in quarter 1.

eThekwini, iLembe and uMzinyathi showing consistency in decline numbers across quarters. Most districts showing decline between quarter 2 & 3.

However numbers generally high across districts. uThukela numbers particularly high.

Comprehensive ART Services: Number of ART clients deregistered due to death

1113 clients on ART deregistered due to death in quarter 3 as compared to 2202 in quarter 2 and 1196 in quarter 1.

UMzinyathi showing consistent decrease across quarters. Most district with declines when comparing quarter 2 and quarter 3.
