


#### STATE OF ORPHANS

- Maternal Orphan Study Surveillance was conducted in 2012 throughout the country to determine the magnitude of the problem
- Study indicated that by the end of 2009, there were approximately 905, 453 maternal orphans in South Africa, which accounts for about 4 percent of all children living in South Africa.

- Abuse and Neglect
- Exploitation
- Child Labour
- Heading households
- At risk / vulnerability to social ills e.g. HIV and AIDS, Substance Abuse and Crime

- National Child Protection Register (CPR)
- Provincial & Districts Integrated ECD Action Plans
- Provincial & Districts Integrated Action Plans for Children Living and Working in the Streets and in Child and Youth Care Centers.







#### **RECOMMENDATIONS**

- Strengthening of coordination through revitalization of Institutional Structures and Partnerships with all stakeholders focusing on:
  - Reporting on programmes implemented and Monitoring thereof.
  - Capacity building
  - Best Practices- Replication
  - Information Sharing(challenges/ development of turnaround plans)
- Each District to update the state of Orphaned and Vulnerable Children(OVCs) and issues affecting the OVCs in order to review an Integrated District Response to address gaps identified.
- Each District to ensure monitoring of implementation of reviewed District Integrated Response Plans.
