





- A total of 303 newly registered OVCs were recorded in quarter three (3)in ILembe district.
- Following the appointment of additional 102 Child and Youth Care Workers to offer care and support to the OVCs, a total of 865 OVCs were receiving care and support as at quarter three (3).
- The District will continue with the close monitoring of progress in the number of OVC's that get registered and provided with care and support through Operation Sukuma Sakhe.
- DSD solicited funding from German Bank to create a multi-million rands structure for inter-alia OVC, this infrastructure will contribute in the caring and supporting OVCs in Ilembe district.

Intervention Area: Life Skills



- The decrease in the total number of learners pregnant in Q3 was due to the various outreach programmes that were directed at the schools. These were led by the District, Transnet, Civil Society, the DOE and the DOH. The drop is also due to some of these learners having had delivered their babies. The introduction of the <u>implanon</u> contraceptive which is popular to the youth may have also contributed in the total number of pregnancies that were recorded in Q3.
- As programmes to address the challenges of learner pregnancy the following will be done:
- 1) Girls Summit to be held on 18 20 March 2015 aiming to address the Social Ills including the high pregnancy challenge in the District. This programme will be done in collaboration with the office of the MEC Champion.
- 2) Continuation of the roll out of the schools health programme
- 3) Identification of 60 schools (15 per LM) prioritised based on the prevalence of social ills and related challenges and the role out of the programme to assist these schools. The programme will be led by the District and MEC champion.

• The number of deaths in the health facilities is still high. Most of the infant deaths are due to the following diseases:

✓ Malnutrition;✓ TB;✓ Pneumonia; and✓ Diarrhea.
```

- Mothers also bring the babies to the health facilities late i.e. When the conditions have already complicated.
- To address the challenge, focus would be on ensuring that Phila Mntwana Centres are functional and that they are established where they do not currently exist.
- Awareness campaigns would be conducted.
- Vaccination and use of Muarc , mid /upper arm circumference.

• High Martenal deaths remains a huge challenge in the iLembe District, with the recent negative coverage of deaths at Stanger Provincial Hospital.


The deaths are due to:

- Late Antenatal Bookings by the mothers;
- Non pregnancy related infections,
- Teenage pregnancies,
- Hypertension.
- Mothers that do not book and only arrive at health facilities to deliver.



- In Quarter three (3), 14% of all people that tested for HIV /AIDS
 - tested positive. This is still an unacceptable high rate.


- The district is not meeting its set targets for condom distribution (both male & female condoms)
- We still have a total of 223 secondary distribution sites through out the district that are being utilised to distribute condoms.

In order to address this challenge, we will continue doing community awareness campaigns. The meeting with all Cllrs that is scheduled for the 16th of April 2015 will also address these issues.

Intervention Area: MALE MEDICAL CIRCUMCISSION



- The quarter three (3) target for male circumcision for ages 15-49 was not met.
- The challenge is the coordination of the boys that need to come forward to circumcise. MMC coordinators in some areas are also inactive.
- To address the issue, the local leadership in terms of Amakhosi, Cllrs, Izinduna and the MMC champions will be convened and a programme developed.
- Awareness campaigns, proper communication on the dates of the MMC campaigns will be done.
- The District Municipality will work with the DOH to mobilise for an improved uptake of this service.

- Whilst the District Q3 statistics on new sexual assaults dropped. It remains unacceptable high i.e. 163.
- Challenges are low conviction rates due to lack of evidence, withdrawal of cases by victims of assault and non reporting of the cases in some instances.

 Programmes on gender based violence will be conducted in collaboration with the SAPS, Department of Justice and other relevant stakeholders.

In quarter three (3) a total of 28 children under 12 years were sexually assaulted. This remains a major challenge in the district.


We will continue to do the following to deal with the scourge:

- Community dialogues and awareness campaigns in collaboration with relevant sector departments.
- Empowerment programmes to Children under 12 years as a preventive measure,
- Conduct the Schools Health Programme with a focus on the issues of sexual assaults and gender based violence.

As at Q3, a total of 47 908 people were on ARTs, 1127 deregistered due to loss to follow-up and 79 ART patients were deregistered due to death.


 Programmes targeting people living with HIV & AIDS (and those affected) will be rolled out to reduce the number of people that default.

 We will continue to work with Civil Society, the CBOs, NGOs, FBOs and people living with HIV & AIDS in addressing this challenge and ensure that no person with HIV/Aids defaults and as a result die.
