

#### **Activities:**


- The number of OVC's receiving care and support increased from 22534 in Quarter 2 of 2014/15 to 25168 in Quarter 3 of 2014/15.
- The number of newly registered OVC's is above target of 10 000 per quarter, and there is a consistent increase in the number of newly registered OVC's throughout the District.

#### **Interventions Moving Forward:**

- Intensifying identification of OVC's in real need of interventions, services and support from the Dept. of Soc. Dev. happens at ward level.
- Ward Councillors are very instrumental in identifying OVC's in their wards, utilizing War Rooms and Ward AIDS Committees.
- Local AIDS Councils are used as platforms to ensure identified OVC's are provided with necessary interventions and support.

■ Number of pregnant learners




# Learner Pregnancy

#### **Activities and Interventions**

The number of learners pregnant at school is slowly decreasing when compared to last Quarter.

The primary achievement on the decrease is due:
 My life My future Campaigns throughout the district
 Soul Buddyz educational interventions
 Teenage Pregnancy Campaigns done by the uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council in partnership with the District Department of Education & other stakeholders at targeted schools with high teenage pregnancy rate
 The work of the NGO's at schools e.g. pregnancy test, implanon insertion, have also been remarkable.

# HIV, COUNSELLING & TESTING: HCT

#### **Target**

The annual target for HCT is 261 549, with the quarterly target of 65 365.

#### Achievements

 The district has achieved above the target in the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter at 68 337 due to the implementation of the HAST framework presented in the last PCA.


In the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter the district performed at 62 751 which is slightly below the

quarterly target of 65387.

The District is expected to achieve 82 753 in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter to reach its 100% target.

- Awareness campaigns in all local municipalities to educate people on the need for regular testing.
- Monthly Monitoring and evaluation has been strengthened at the Nerve Centre meetings with all stakeholders verifying and confirming their numbers
- All facilities are strengthening their outreach campaigns and in facility activities on HCT/TB screening.

### Medical Male Circumcision: MMC

#### **Target**


 The annual target for Medical Male Circumcision is 51 621 with the quarterly target of 12905.

#### **Achievements**


- The district is struggling to reach the MMC target
- In the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter the district performed 4763 MMC which was below the quarterly target of 12 905.
- In quarter 3 the performance was 4748 still below the target.

- A MMC Framework with facility and partners targets is being implemented, strengthened and monitored.
- MMC Traditional Coordinator's targets have been increased from 50 to 100.
- Capacity building for MMC Traditional coordinators in the recruitment strategy.
- The Provincial office has committed to provide MMC Transport for Districts.
- Targets will be set for Development Partners (SACTWU and Society for family Health) to increase the District MMC performance.
- Marketing of MMC targeting older males will be strengthen
- The District AIDS Council and its family of seven Local AIDS Councils are aggressively utilizing all events / campaigns to promote MMC and conduct HCT.

#### **Targets**


- District Targets Condom Distribution
  - Male condom annual target is 21 566 979 and Quarterly 5 413 994
  - Female condom annual target 455 653 Quarterly 113 913 for female.

#### **Achievement**


- The annual targets for both the male and the female condom distribution has been far exceeded
- Total performance for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter is 60 854 471 for male condom and 955 534 for female condom distribution

- CCG (Community Care Givers) Distributing condom in the households allocated to them per area of jurisdiction.
- Condom distribution to all War Rooms, and availability thereof is sustained at all times.
- Distribution of condoms in all Health facilities and strategic areas
- Contracted service provider covering Taverns, Tribal Court, High Transmission Areas

# SEXUAL ASSAULTS (RAPE)

### Target:


Baseline 2013/2014 was 1219

#### Achievement

- Thuthuzela Care Centre in Edendale Hospital is operating 24 hours, 7 days a week with the dedicated Medical Officer allocated for the clinic.
- The other 3 general hospitals have crisis centers for rape cases on a 24 hour basis

- Community awareness done in November 2014 during the 16 Days of Activism on no violence against Women and Children across all municipalities.
- Zazi Youth Camp was held in Richmond LM in December 2014 for approximately 200 boys and girls between 13-25 years of age to empower them on sexual reproductive health matters.
- Department of Social Development has ward based programmes across the District.
- District 10 point plan strategy against sexual assaults to be incorporated in the district strategic plan scheduled for 24-26 March 2015

### Maternal Deaths


The district still has a challenge in a number of maternal deaths which is above the target of 160 per 100 000 which is contributed by high prevalence of HIV and TB

#### Achievement:


The district is strengthening the implementation of the HAST Strategy, CARMMA, ESMOE Drill saturation training.

- Maternal death review meetings are held at delivering facilities with all relevant stakeholders supported by District Clinical Specialist Team.
- Perinatal mortality meetings are held monthly in all the 4 general hospitals with representation from District and Primary Health Care.
- District Perinatal Mortality Meeting is held per quarter.


#### Infant 1st PCR test around 6 weeks uptake rate

### POLYMERASE CHAIN REACTION(PCR)

#### **Target**


The district target 1.4%.

#### **Achievement**

- The infant anti-body positivity rate is preforming well below target at 0.7% against 1.4% target.
- The baby PCR positivity rate is performing at 1.3% against the target of 5%.

- Strengthen (HIV, COUNSELLING & TESTING) in all babies arriving at the health facility for 18 months vaccines.
- The on-going community outreach programmes aimed at raising awareness to all communities continues.
- Strengthen (HIV, COUNSELLING & TESTING) to the community and knowing their HIV status.
- Strengthening early Antenatal booking by pregnant women before 20 weeks for early enrollment in the PMTCT program.


#### In patient death under 1 year rate



### INFANT DEATHS

- Severe Acute Malnutrition, Pneumonia and Diarrhoea are the most contributing factors in infant deaths.
- The Phila Mntwana Centers were established and are functional in the district to reduce the challenge of deaths in children.
- The Community Care-Givers (CCGs) are also trained to assess and refer children with signs of being under weight or with symptoms / indications of not being well are also referred to clinics for further check-ups.

# ART (Anti Retro-Viral treatment)

#### **Target**

The target for District for new ART clients is 23 000 which accumulates to 121 529 total ART clients for the year.


#### **Achievements**

The District performance is 113 777 clients on ART in the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter.

- Stable clients are being down referred to primary health clinics and community outreach sites (War rooms, local structures and pharmacies)
- Chronic clubs have been established at both facility and community level
- Grange clinic has been capacitated with support from developmental partners to initiate clients on ART thus ensuring all clinics are initiating clients.
- The District has commenced the implementation of the New ART guideline (500 CD4 Count)
- Taking services to the taxi ranks has been implemented from January 2015 in 5 taxi ranks in Msunduzi local municipality (Market, eMgodini, Retief street, Emasukwana, Mkondeni weigh bridge) providing HAST services

### Coordination (Strategic Objective 5)


#### **Achievements**

- There has been an increase in the number of LAC's submitting reports to the DAC, when compared to the last quarter – Five LAC's in the second
   (2) quarter of 2014/15 submitted reports to the DAC, AND in this third
  - (3) quarter six LAC's submitted reports to the DAC.

- Reports by Mayors in the agenda of the uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council Meetings feature as STANDING ITEMS.
- The collaboration between the DAC/LAC/WAC has seen positive results.
  The Technical Support given to the DAC by HST Health Systems Trust is commendable.
- Progress on LACs reporting is noted, and further interventions will be done to ensure a 100% reporting rate in the future.

### WACS: PERFORMANCE

- uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council has a strong partnership formed with Health Systems Trust (HST) – to capacitate, offer technical support and strengthen Ward AIDS Councils / Local AIDS Councils on programme coordination and operational efficiency.
- WACS and Clinics are linked and they carry out HCT Campaigns and Nerve Centre Meetings at a Local level. The Nerve Centres are functional throughout the District.

# RESOLUTIONS: PCA November 2014

#### In terms of resolutions of the PCA:

- The Civil Society Forum has been re-launched with its secretariat.
- The People Living with HIV/AIDS Sector has been launched, as per last PCA resolution.
- The accelerated response on HAST is a priority matter, and the HAST Plan has been developed and it is now being implemented and monitored through nerve centres. It is further owned/driven by the DAC/LAC's/WACs.
- Gender based violence & sexual assaults the uMgungundlovu District AIDS Council is reviewing its multi-sectoral strategy document on HAST and, a Ten-Point Plan Against Gender-based Violence & Sexual Assaults will form part of the reviewed strategy document by end of March 2015.
