DISTRICT OVERVIEW

- uThukela district municipality (DC23) is one of eleven district municipalities in the Province of KwaZulu-Natal.
- Uthukela district municipality derives its name from one of the major rivers in the Province of KwaZulu-Natal, the Uthukela River that rises from the Drakensberg Mountains and supplies water to a large portion of KZN and as well as Gauteng.
- There is National part land to southwest, Lesotho to the west the Province of Free State to the north west. UThukela district municipality has three district municipalities bordering onto it within the Province of KwaZulu-Natal, namely Amajuba, Umzinyathi and UMgungundlovu. Uthukela district municipality consists of five local municipalities namely,

 - ✓ Emnambithi/Ladysmith(KZ232)
 - ✓ Umtshezi (KZ234)
 - ✓ Okhahlamba(KZ235)
 - ✓ Imbabazane (KZ236)


- The size of UThukela district municipality is approximately 11500 km².
- Emnambithi is occupying 2,965.92km²,Indaka is on 991.71km², Umtshezi 2130.85km².
- Okhahlamba is which is the largest and is occupying 3540.63km²,
- Imbabazane is on 827.74km².
- It is located in the western boundary of Kwazulu-Natal. UThukela district municipality is 75 % rural and the local municipalities,.
- Indaka and Imbabazane, having no formal towns and mainly comprising of traditional areas.

Number of registered OVC receiving care and support




- The Uthukela DSD has employed 136 Community Care Givers and is training 166 Child and Youth Workers through Isibindi Program whose duty is to put emphasis in Prevention and intervening at an early stage.
- Uthukela DSD has also funded 14 Community Care Centres to render a range of services to communities and OVCs to meet their psychosocial needs (meeting the emotional) physical and social development needs of these vulnerable children.

Number of new learners pregnancies for Q1 and Q2 at uThukela District




- Education Department introduced My Life My Future campaign which focuses on fighting against teenage pregnancy and focus on life skills using peer education programme.
- Teenage pregnancy awareness's are also done in schools especially high schools.
- Learners support agents have been appointed to 32 high schools with high teenage pregnancy to support peer education programmes and to minimize teenage pregnancy in schools.


Baby PCR tested positive around 6 weeks rate at UThukela district for Q1and Q2

Achievement

- Decrease in number of PCR done around six weeks due to improve d PMTCT strategies adherence to guidelines
- Decrease number of babies positive at six weeks due to early initiation of HAART to pregnant women at 500 CD4 count
- Remarkable decrease in the positivity rate post sensation of breast feeding
- Decrease positivity rate at 18 months due to mothers adhering to preventative measures
- Great improvement in antenatal clients booking before 20 weeks due strengthened health education at community level
- Less number of HIV positive clients due to healthy life style condom usage
- Increase coverage of pregnant client on HAART


Challenge


Number of infants deaths in public facilities in Q1 and Q2 at uThukela district

- Decrease in infants mortality due to introduction of new vaccines


Challenges:


Number of HIV tests carried out for Q1 and Q2 at uThukela District

Achievement

76% of new HIV tests carried out.

Challenges

 43 HAST Counselors have left for training and some left because of their contract with the NGO Partner expired. None availability of HIV Screening test kit for 3 weeks due to recall of test kits. TB screening for HCT clients low due to challenges of data management at facility level.

Interventions

Increase implementing PICT by all trained nurses categories.
 Support HCT data analysis in all facilities.

 Low condoms distribution in grey areas. Service provider stopped distribution due other commitments.


Intervention


Number of new sexual assault cases for Q1 and Q2 at uThukela District

Children under 12 years sexually assaulted rate for Q1 and Q2 at uThukela District




Achievements

- Decrease in number of sexual assault cases due to community awareness's on contributory factors to sexual assault
- Number of sexual assault cases given prophylaxis increased due to early reporting of the victims to heath facilities
- Remarkable decrease in number of sexual assault cases reporting after 72 hours due education and awareness's at community level
- Decreased number of sexual assault cases under 12 years.


Total number of patients on ART for Q1 and Q2 at uThukela District


Number of patients de-registered due to loss to follow up for Q1 and Q2 at uThukela District

Activities/Interventions moving forward

Achievement

 The district target was met through implementation of consolidated guidelines which allows initiation on lifelong ART of clients with ≤500 CD4 count, all pregnant and breastfeeding women and the HIV/Hepatitis-B co-infected clients.

Challenge

 5 facilities and 4 mobiles are without NIMART (Nurse Initiated and Managed Antiretroviral Treatment) trained


Intervention
