PURPOSE:

The purpose of this presentation is to provide progress on the implementation of the HIV & AIDS and OSS programmes in King Cetshwayo District.





BACKGROUND:

- **King Cetshwayo District AIDS Council is functional and is committed to addressing HIV and AIDS Issues with the aggressiveness it deserves.**
- **All five Local Municipalities under King Cetshwayo District have established Local AIDS Councils. The functionality of all five Local AIDS Councils is an uncompromised mandate for King Cetshwayo.**



SITTING OF THE LAC AND DAC MEETINGS:

■ **The District and Local AIDS Council meetings are held quarterly and they are chaired by the designated DAC and LAC Chairpersons respectively.**

Challenge:

■ **Poor participation by Local Mayors and some Government Departments in District AIDS Council meetings.**





SITTING OF THE LAC AND DAC MEETINGS (Cont...) :

- **The Department of :
Health, Social Development, Home Affairs fully
participate in District AIDS Council meetings
and they submit their reports to DAC as
expected.**





LAC & DAC SECRETARIAT:

- **The DAC and LACs do not have the presence of full time staff as secretariat. Currently, the DAC Secretariat duties are performed by the District and uMfolozi Municipal HIV**
- **Co-ordinators, DSD and DOH HIV Co-ordinators.**
- **Most Departments absent themselves when being requested to attend the sessions where the DAC and DTT reports are crafted.**





LAC & DAC BUDGET:

- **The DAC and LACs have their allocated budgets for the implementation of the HIV and AIDS Programme**
- **The budget is used for awareness campaigns, assistance for orphans and vulnerable children and identified destitute families in need of emergency relief.**

CHALLENGES & TURN AROUND STRATEGY: INTERVENTION AREA: LIFE SKILLS

■ **High teenage pregnancy rate** of 122 was noted in the district in quarter 1 (April to June 2016) but a great improvement of 35 was noticed in Q4.

INTERVENTIONS: The District has conducted a number of awareness campaigns e.g. Zazi, HIV and AIDS awareness, First Things First, Graduate Alive and Community dialogues on social ills.

■ **The Global Fund Project – Keeping Girls in Schools** will greatly assist in reducing Learner Pregnancy in the district.



CHALLENGES & TURN AROUND STRATEGY: INTERVENTION AREA: HIV PREVENTION - MMC

■ A decline is observed in the number of MMC done age 15 to 49 years old from 1605 in Quarter 3 to 1372 in Quarter 4. The target (3974) was not met.

INTERVENTIONS:

- HAST Provincial Office contracted private Doctors who are performing MMC
- Strengthened MMC mobilization by Care works(NGO).



CHALLENGES & TURN AROUND STRATEGY: INTERVENTION AREA: HIV PREVENTION- MMC (cont...):

INTERVENTIONS:

- **MMC camps done by DOH in collaboration with Social Partners, NGOs and Municipalities**
- **Mentoring of MMC Clinicians by District Roving Teams**
- **Hosting of separate MMC camps for adults and young males for privacy**



CHALLENGES & TURN AROUND STRATEGY: INTERVENTION AREA: PREVENTION OF HIV TRANSMISSION

Sexual assault cases & Children under 12 sexually assaulted rate:

- **Sexual assault remains a challenge in King Cetshwayo District. A decrease in the rate of under 12 sexual assault cases from 45% in Q2 to 30.7% is observed. An increase in the total number of new sexual assault cases from 228 in Q2 to 267 in Q3.**



CHALLENGES & TURN AROUND STRATEGY:

INTERVENTION AREA: PREVENTION OF HIV TRANSMISSION

INTERVENTIONS:

- **King Cetshwayo District is working with other sector departments through OSS as sexual assault is a social ill which needs stakeholders collaborative efforts and integration of services.**
- **The District will continue with community awareness campaigns, dialogues as part of community engagements.**



CHALLENGES & TURN AROUND STRATEGY:

INTERVENTION AREA: MARTENAL CHILD & WOMEN'S HEALTH

- **Number of infants deaths increased from 58 in Q3 to 90 in Q4. Number of maternal deaths increased from 3 in Q 3 to 7 in Q4.**

INTERVENTIONS:

Hospitals and PHC facilities referring to Lower UMfolozi Regional War Memorial Hospital (LURWMH) need to identify and



- manage high risk ANC clients on time. This will prevent complications that lead to maternal deaths.**
- **Obstetric ambulance to be always available when needed.**
 - **Strengthening of training for management of children's illnesses.**
 - **Early case identification and management of malnutrition.**
 - **Linkage of all Children to CCGs follow up and tracing. Hospitals and clinics to have perinatal meetings.**



ACHIEVEMENTS:

INTERVENTION AREA : MATERNAL CHILD & WOMEN'HEALTH

Baby HIV antibody test positive around 18 months

- **A decrease is observed from 0.3% in Q3 to 0.1% in Q4.**

INTERVENTIONS:

- **Health education to pregnant women on infant feeding during antenatal care (ANC) & breastfeeding**
- **Viral load monitoring of all breast feeding women according to the ART guideline.**



ACHIEVEMENTS: THE GLOBAL FUND PROJECT

- **A total budget of approximately R54 million has been allocated in the King Cetshwayo District, interventions are being implemented in uMfolozi and uMhlathuze local municipalities using the services of NGOs in collaboration with 5 community based organizations (CBOs).**
- **A total of 33 people have been employed at King Cetshwayo, 60 % of which are youth below the age of 35 years.**



ACHIEVEMENTS: THE GLOBAL FUND PROJECT(Cont...)

- In partnership with the Department of Education, a total of 100 schools in the district have been identified for the in school youth intervention. 12 team leaders have been trained as trainers in the Keeping Girls in School (KGIS) curriculum delivery, Soul Buddyz and Rise club modules.**
- 2500 learners have been reached with the KGIS, soul Buddyz clubs consisting of 25 per club have been formed in all 50 targeted primary schools, bringing the number of total girls reached to 2550. 340 girls have been enrolled for the 14 Rise clubs that have been established.**



ACHIEVEMENTS:

THE GLOBAL FUND PROJECT(Cont...)

- * The second part of this intervention is the Cash plus Care intervention. This innovative intervention whose principle is a behaviour change empowerment and incentives. It will be implemented on a pilot basis among young women aged 19-24 years in the King Cetshwayo District. A target of 20 000 young women will be enrolled.**
- * A total budget of approximately R130 million has been allocated. NGOs and CBOs will be appointed to implement this intervention. The expected employment numbers in this intervention is more than 120 people.**



THE BELGIAN GHENT UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL STUDENT EXCHANGE AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME:

- **The Ministry of Arts, Culture, Sport & Recreation requested to place an International student, Ms Olivia Maertens from Belgium as an intern at King Cetshwayo District from 15 February to 31 May 2017.**
- **The Belgian Ghent University has expressed a keen interest in our social and community development programmes, as the KZN Province.**
- **One of the programmes they have been following ,is Operation Sukuma Sakhe (OSS) and Homes for Orphans and the Elderly. Pursuant to their interest , they even wrote a scholarly chapter in book, on OSS “War room” as a service delivery model.**



THE SABC NEWS: UKHOZI CURRENT AFFAIRS LIVE RADIO BROADCAST ON SOCIAL ILLS:

- **King Cetshwayo District hosted a very successful live radio dialogue on social ills on 09 June 2017. The show was led by Mr Dumisani Ndimande from SABC News, the Honourable MEC for Social Development Mama Weziwe Thusi, KCDM District Mayor, Cllr Mkhulisi. In attendance were Political principals both from the District and Local Municipalities, THPs, Religious sector and Civil Society Sector.**

- **King Cetshwayo District is hosting the sitting of the KZN Provincial Legislature Youth Parliament as follows:**
