
Successes and Innovation

NACOSA

- Transition SRs have been absorbed into the ZAF-C grant by AFSA (GBV) and NACOSA (SW)
- Sex worker programme increased in HTS training for Sub-Recipient staff to become HTS counsellors.

KZN Treasury

- Revision of HCT delivery model-from HCT in-school to outside the school
- She Conquers Campaign continues to be a driving force for buy-in to the YW&G in the districts
- Joint communication aligned with She Conquers Campaign through existence of functional subnational coordination structures in the districts e.g. Operation Sukuma Sakhe
- MOUs signed with govt SRs




Successes and Innovation Contd.

6. Challenges and Learnings

Challenges and Learnings

Kheth'Impilo

- Still lack of understanding from Government staff on the implementation of adherence module
- Recruitment process of patients to the adherence clubs is longer than anticipated
- Individualised care model is assisting to identify barriers at a very early stages of patients in treatment
- Through Adherence Advocates the programme is able to trace and refer back unstable patients

AFSA

- Difference between program assumptions and implementation for shelter program
- * TCC protocol implementation and role of CSOs at TCCs
- Integration of TB into all program components
- Management of shared SRs
- Ensuring alignment of indicator measurement across PRs
