Quarter 2 (July – Sept. 2017)

Challenge	Mitigation (Plans to Address Challenge)	Status (Actions Taken)
High number of teenage pregnancy	 Municipality to conduct awareness campaigns on teenage pregnancy in collaboration with DOH and DSD and DOE 	 Teenage pregnancy awareness campaigns done in 10 high schools with the assistance from the stakeholders. Conducted early marriage awareness campaign at Phuthini High in Loskop including surrounding high school.
Increase in first PCR test positive around 10 weeks.	 Prioritize pregnant and breastfeeding mothers during adherence and counselling sessions at PHC facilities. Encourage counselling of both partners during pregnancy and breastfeeding. Implementation of Index (HAST) case finding. 	 Conducted basic Antenatal care training update in January 2018. Intensified viral load monitoring using TIER.NET and adherence counseling for pregnant mothers in all Antenatal (ANC) visit and breastfeeding.

Sexual assault cases against 12 years is constantly high.	District stakeholders to address sexual assault jointly, to curb the high numbers.	 District is piloting a project that accesses the risk of sexual assault and referral from the communities targeting young girls through NGO partners (Health Systems Trust, Zoe-Life and Duduza Care Centre) piloting
60 infants death occurred in Q2 in public Health Facilities.	 Ensure early detection an management of underlying conditions during pregnancy. Ensure pregnant women receive HIV testing and screening for TB & STI. 	 Conducted integrated basic Antenatal care training update (HIV,TB;STI;PMTCT) for health care workers.
Poor reporting of WAC's	 Strengthen the functionality of WAC's. 	 District conducted strategic workshop for district Councillors and DAC members on functionality of LAC & DAC with the assistance of OTP, HST and other departments.

Quarter 3 (Oct – Dec 2017)

Challenge	Mitigation (Plans to Address Challenge)
High number of teenage pregnancy still a challenge	 District to conduct teenage pregnancy awareness campaigns in schools with high rate of teenage pregnancy. DoE to provide Psychosocial support to pregnant learners and parents.
Number of new HIV test carried out and new HIV positive cases target not met.	 District to Implement outreach events targeting the vulnerable and key populations in high transmission (hot spots) and hard to reach areas.
Increased number of new sexual assault cases	 District to collaboration with other stakeholders in addressing this challenge since this is a social ill. District to empower community for immediate (within 72 hours) reporting in order to access health service available (PEP, emergency pill). Stakeholder meeting to be held on the 12th March 2018 for feedback on child sexual assault project being piloted by NGO Partners.

Quarter 3 (Oct – Dec 2017)

Challenge	Mitigation (Plans to Address Challenge)
Children remaining on ART target (target 4437 – data 3342)not met since they depend on their caregiver and parents to access treatment.	 District to collaborate with stakeholders to improve HIV testing services targeting priority populations i.e. males, children, adolescents, key populations and people from hard to reach areas. District to empower health care workers, parents caregivers on disclosure guidelines and skills on how to disclose. District to communicate messages on universal test and treat as an HIV prevention method through community radio slots; community events and campaigns.
Poor attendance of other government departments, only key departments such as DSD, DOH, DHA & DOE attends most of the DAC & LAC Meetings.	 District to involve Head of Departments to improve attendance of officials. Conduct follow up on HOD that have not yet submitted nominees for DAC representation by the end of April.
Poor reporting of WAC's	 Office of the Premier to facilitate three workshops for Ward Aids Committee throughout the district target non-functional WAC's.

Achievements/Successes

Goal 1: Accelerate prevention to reduce new HIV, TB and STI infections

- MMC and condom distribution target were exceeded in Quarter 3.
- Total number remaining on ART target has been exceeded.

Goal 2: Reduce morbidity and mortality by providing treatment, care and adherence support for all

- Implemented Adherence guidelines (spaced fast lane, adherence clubs and pick up points)in order to curb the loss to follow up, with the help from the supporting partner and CBOs.
- Weekly nerve centre meetings were successfully conducted in Q3 so as to closely monitor indicators and troubleshoot where necessary this facilitated quality improvement on interventions and performance.

Goal 3: Reach all key and vulnerable populations with customised and targeted interventions

- Conducted community outreach targeting key populations and vulnerable groups for informal settlement (Emagogogweni).on the 6th October 2017.
- Conducted a mapping exercise and developed the plan for key and vulnerable populations.

Achievements/Successes

Goal 4: Address the social and structural drivers of HIV, TB and STIs

- Facilitated life skills and parenting skills sessions and workshops in Okhahlamba sub-district.
- 11 Social Workers employed to provide social behaviour change and psychosocial support to children and families affected and infected by HIV/AIDS.
- 100 young people reached through substance abuse workshop conducted by Ithembalethu on the 5th December 2017 at Wembezi (ILM)

Goal 5: Ground the response to HIV, TB and STIs in human rights principles and approaches

- 1500 beneficiaries reached through You Only Live Once program rolled by Home Community Based Organization.
- 120 young people reached through awareness campaign on issues affecting youth at Okhahlamba Christian Council on the 1st November 2017.

Goal 6: Promote leadership and shared accountability for a sustainable response to HIV, TB and STIs

- Facilitated rotation of District Aids Council Meeting venue among Local Municipalities to strengthen participation by Local Municipalities.
- Conducted training sessions for political leaders.

Plans for the Next Quarter

- Conduct MMC camps with the supporting partners to maintain the regular performance.
- Distribute condoms in non-health facilities through a combination of stakeholders to reduce new infections.
- Revive civil society structures at the local and district level to strengthen community linkages and involvement.
- Coordinate district teenage pregnancy awareness campaign in 5 schools to reduce unplanned teenage pregnancies.
- Support DOH outreach campaigns for priority population to improve service delivery in hard to reach areas.
- Coordinate sexual assault & rape awareness campaigns to raise awareness and inspire action against sexual assault in communities.
- Coordinate capacity building workshops for performing WAC's.
