- Start the development of the New NSP 2023 – 2028

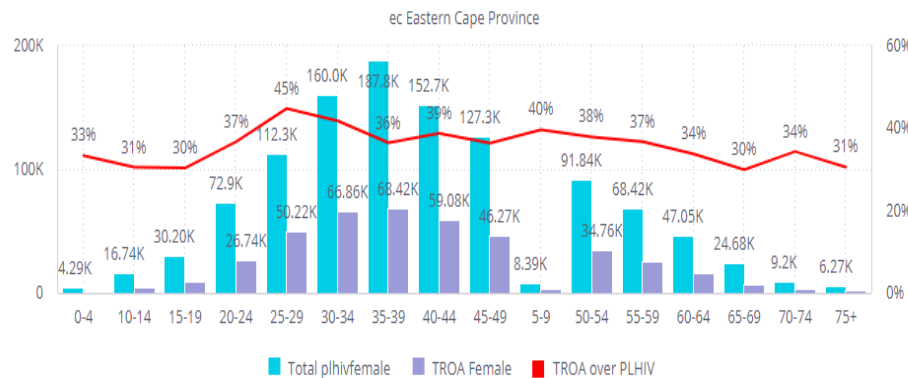

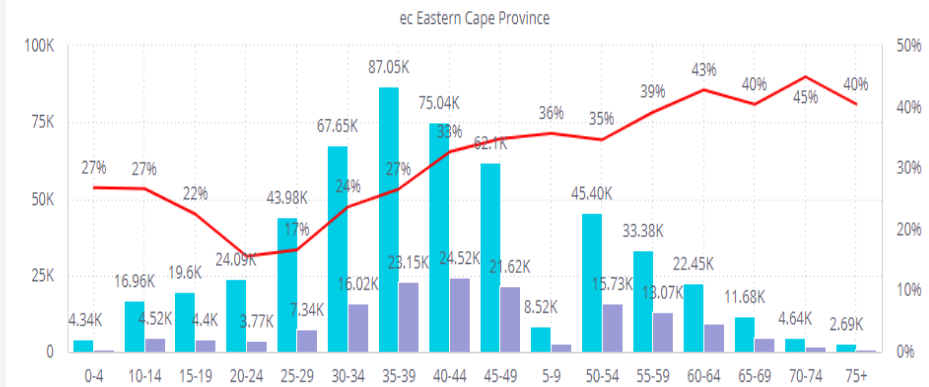

ART Coverage

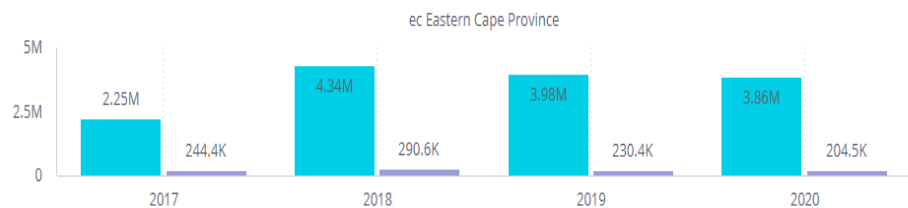
Female ART Coverage per age group



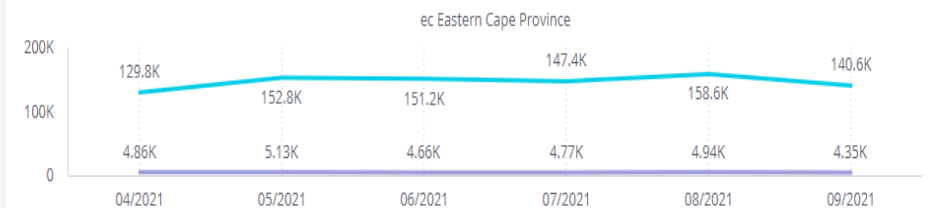
Male ART Coverage per age group



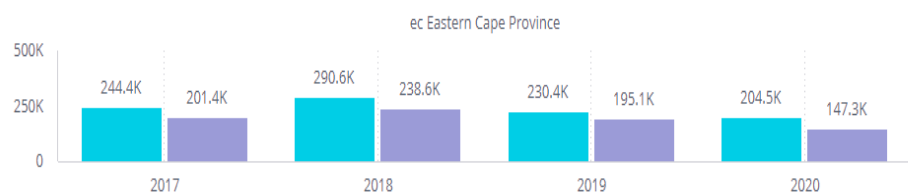
HIV Testing vs Positive Identified per year



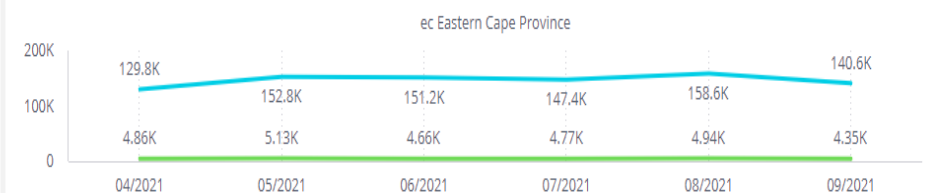
HIV Testing per month

SYNOPSIS OF CURRENT NSP DEVELOPMENT AND LESSONS LEARNT

SANAC conducted a NSP process documentation

Objectives

- Guide the process of developing the next NSP 2023-2028 from an informed perspective
- Streamline the success stories and lessons learnt into the new NSP development process
- Develop NSP development SOP

Findings

Cumbersome and problematic **administrative** processes at times chaotic

Late start of the NSP development, Inefficient logistics planning & **poor communication** with stakeholders

Consultations characterized by inadequate representation sectors & poor facilitation

Writing not SA led, perceptions of incapable writers, challenging M&E / target setting exercise

Poor involvement of the Secretariat

Difficulties in providing inputs into the document (Draft was kept at high level and local level inputs not included)

Endorsement viewed like a rubber-stamping process

No clarity on who had mandate to endorse the document

Too much pressure to **launch** – PIPs needed to be finalized before the launch

The final version was only seen on the day

HIGH LEVEL WORKSHOP


Overall Objective:

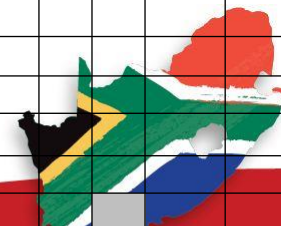

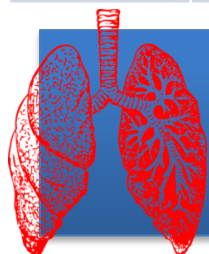
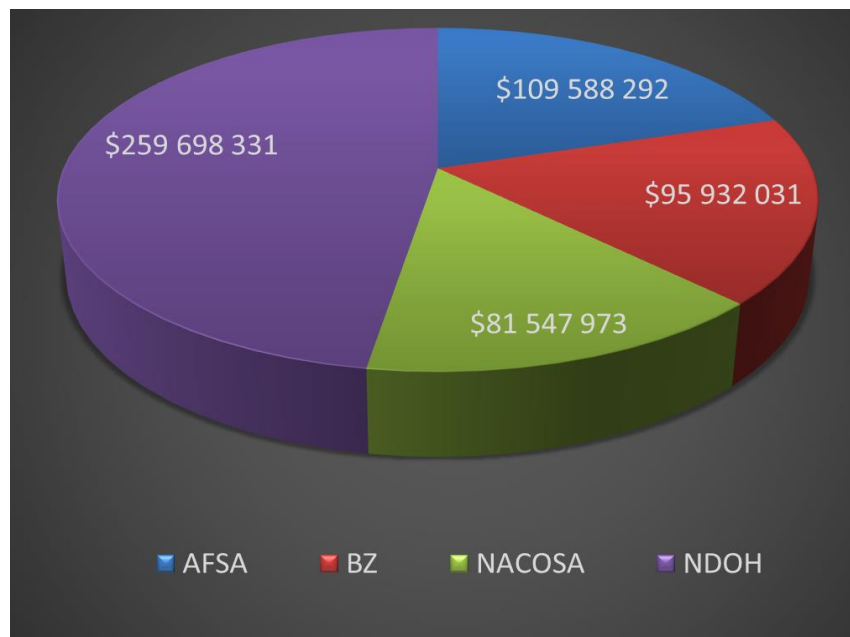

A surge investment is prioritized for TB interventions, responding to the recent findings of South Africa's first TB prevalence survey which showed a TB burden about twice as high as was previously estimated.

The allocation amounts for all countries have been determined according to a methodology approved by the Global Fund Board, primarily based on disease burden and income level. South Africa is classified as an upper-middle-income country

GTAC REVIEW 2015/16: MANDATE OF SANAC

- The Government Technical Advisory Centre (GTAC) was requested to conduct an organisational review of SANAC in 2015/16 and in 2019/20
- Purpose of the review was to improve the relevance, effectiveness, sustainability and to make recommendations on the positioning of SANAC.

GTAC Recommendation 6:

- The **governance framework** and **procedural guidelines** should be reviewed and revised

Consideration

- SANAC is developing a Multi-Sector Policy Framework to achieve standardization of all SANAC structures, to be approved by Cabinet
- Conducting a high-level review of the SANAC Procedural Guidelines as a backbone of the SANAC Multi-Sector Policy Framework,
- This will be thoroughly consulted with all SANAC stakeholder,
- SANAC will share with the provinces process outline.

PARTNERSHIP WITH SALGA AND COGTA

SALGA POLICY POSITION

- Working with SALGA to develop Policy Position for the Strengthening of the Local Government HIV, TB, STI response.

AIM OF THE POSITION PAPER

- The aim of the position paper is to determine local government niche and clarify its role in response to HIV and AIDS within the intergovernmental and multi-sectoral approach.

OBJECTIVES

- To review and develop institutional mechanisms (Frameworks) for local government response (planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation)
- To lobby for HIV and AIDS resources for Local government response
- To Strengthen Intergovernmental Relations.

PROGRESS UPDATE

- 1st round of stakeholder consultations (internal) completed
- Draft Policy Position developed and shared for external inputs

SALGA PORTFOLIO BASED INDUCTIONS

- Working with SALGA to prepare for the Portfolio Based Inductions for new Councilors,
- Task Team has been established to develop a comprehensive Induction Manual,
- Inductions will be in two phases:
 - 1st Phase – Orientation on various portfolios,
 - 2nd Phase – Portfolio Specific Capacity enhancement for the Councilors,

ESTABLISHMENT OF PROVINCIAL PRIVATE SECTOR FORUMS

Background

- On June 11, 2021, Deputy President David Mabuza, launched the SANAC's Private Sector Forum (PSF).
- **PSF's vision:** "a voice of the South African private sector united behind the pursuit of equality and an AIDS & TB free society by 2030 in support of the country's National Strategy on HIV, TB and STIs."
- **PSF's mission:** "to rally all private sector players in South Africa, big or small, towards a united and coordinated voice, that meaningfully contributes to the country's fight against HIV, TB and STIs."
- On March 15, 2022 the PSF 2022 Strategic Plan was launched in Johannesburg.
- The plan detailed a strategic road-map for the year, framed by 9 key strategic areas (KSAs).
- One of the KSAs focuses specifically on PSF provincial structures as an essential part of the PSF's objectives.

Principles of Establishment

- Each provincial private sector forum (PPSF) will serve as a representative of the PSF in coordinating the private sector at provincial level
- They will help to ensure the provincial implementation of the strategy of the PSF in line with its vision and mission, within the strategic framework of the over-arching National Strategic Plan (NSP) for HIV, TB and STIs.
- PPSFs will also play an important consultative role with regard to PSF inputs into the drafting of the new NSP for HIV, TB and STIs.

ESTABLISHMENT PROCESS AND PROGRESS

Establishment of the PPSF Task Team.

- Task Team to plan for establishment of the PPSF made up of:
 - PCA Secretariat
 - The Office of the Premier
 - Provincial DoH
 - National PSF Secretariat
 - SANAC Secretariat

Stakeholder Engagement/ Consultation.

- 'Roadshow' / engagement with key stakeholders, including:
 - The respective PCAs
 - The Provincial Departments of Health
 - The Offices of the Premier
 - Provincial Business Formations/Chambers

Nomination of the PPSF Members.

- The PPSF Task Team to issue a call for nominations.
- Nominations to be forwarded by provincial business formations or structures.
- PPSF should comprise of 30 members.

PPSF Leadership Committee elections.

- To comprise of 7 members:
 - Chairperson.
 - Deputy Chairperson.
 - Three representatives on the PRC.
 - Two representatives on the RMC.

PPSF Launch

- Launch officiated by the Premier or his/her delegate.
- Broadcast through media channels accessible to communities.

Post-Launch Activities

- Development of Provincial Action Plans.
- Establishment of the PPSF Secretariat.
- Coordination of the participation of the private sector in relevant activities.

PROGRESS

- National Task team established to support the process
- Establishment guidelines completed and shared with provinces
- Currently consulting with the PCA HoS

24TH INTERNATIONAL AIDS CONFERENCE



- Theme: ***Re-Engage and Follow the Science***
- Focus will be on:
 - Defining future research agendas
 - Shift latest evidence to action, and
 - Chart a new consensus on overcoming the HIV epidemic as a threat to public health and individual well-being
- Every two years, the International AIDS Society (IAS) holds the most authoritative global conference on HIV.
- It provides a unique forum for the intersection of science, advocacy, and human rights, attended by scientists, researchers, activists, policy makers, government officials, civil society organisations and people living with HIV





FEATURES OF AIDS CONFERENCE 2022

- 100+ **hybrid speaker sessions and panel debates** live from Montreal and around the world
- **E-posters** showcasing cutting-edge research with live in-person and on-demand presentations
- Multiple opportunities for **networking and engaging** in speaker Q&As
- **Global Village and Youth Programme** in Montreal and virtually
- In-person and virtual **exhibition** and daily educational workshops
- Tailored **live, semi-live and pre-recorded satellite symposia and pre-conference meeting** packages





SOUTH AFRICAN PARTICIPTION

- Numerous SANAC Stakeholders, from government, civil society and private sector will be attending the conference
- In past international AIDS conferences, activities, including the erection of one exhibition stand, had been centrally coordinated by the SANAC Secretariat– to ensure a collective in a variety of activities during the conference
- Brand South African will assist the Secretariat to create a positive and unified image of South Africa, showcasing South Africa's innovation and highlighting the progress to date
- SANAC stakeholders will collaborate with the Secretariat to provide branding and materials and to explore the possibility of different activities
- The South African delegation will meet prior and during the conference in order to ensure effective coordination and to enable stakeholders to speak with one voice about South Africa's successes and its future directions in its efforts towards ending AIDS as a public health threat by 2030





UPDATES ON PREPARATIONS FOR THE CONFERENCE

- National multi-stakeholder Steering Committee for the Conference has been established and meeting,
- Presidency issued communication to the Premiers on the conference and expectations from provinces,
- CEO also issued communication to the DG's on the conference and the expectations from the provinces,





FOR PCA CONSIDERATION

- To **note** the details on the upcoming 24th International AIDS Conference to take place in Montreal,
- The province to **share** its plans for the Conference with SANAC,



COMBINED STUDY TOUR TO KZN

- The SANAC Secretariat has recommended a combined weeklong study tour to KZN for 3 Provinces:
 - Free State,
 - Gauteng
 - North West
- Currently finalizing the Concept Note for the Study Tour and will be shared with the province,
- Provinces are expected to fund the Study Tour,
- To be aligned to the June PCA Meeting, date still to be confirmed,
- Provinces to determine who attends the Study Tour,

Objectives of the Study Tour

Enhance governance, leadership, coordination and accountability of the PCAs and their Sectors,

Improve the capacity of the PCA Secretariats to effectively coordinate the PCAs, their work and the HIV, TB & STI response overall,

Provide a platform for knowledge and skills sharing among the members of the PCAs and the Secretariats

Familiarise the PCA members and the Secretariats with Operation Sokumasakhe and DDM including sharing of best practices.

Recommendation

- We are recommending that at least one session during the Study Tour be addressed by Premier

Proposed Participants of the Study Tour

- Premiers and MECs Chairs (Special Hybrid Session)
- Civil Society Leadership,
- Other selected members of the PCA (government depts, SALGA, Development Partners)
- PCA Secretariats

FOR PCA CONSIDERATION

- To **accept and approve** the Study Tour and receive the 3 Provinces
- To **avail** the Premier and some MECs for the special hybrid session to be addressed by the Premier of KZN as the Chair of the PCA together with identified MECs and attended by the Premiers and MECs of the visiting provinces

CONCLUSION

- SANAC commends the Premier and the co-chair for their leadership of the PCA.
- SANAC commends leadership of the Civil Society, and the organization of Civil Society in the province.
- SANAC further commends the PCA Secretariat for effective coordination of the response in the province, however there should be no complacency.
- The PCA to improve on the support for the Civil Society Forum to ensure maximum participation and meaningful contribution to the response.
- The PCA to ensure DAC's and LAC's enable maximum participation of Civil Society Sectors,
- The PCA to work close with SALGA counterparts for the induction of the new Mayors.
- PCA Secretariat through the DG to confirm provincial arrangements for IAS Conference with the SANAC Secretariat
