




BACKGROUND AND TIMELINE

- The South African National AIDS Council (SANAC) is multisector voluntary body comprised
 of representatives from government, civil society, private sector, organized labour and
 business which was established by Cabinet in 2002 (Social Compact)
- The main role of SANAC is to advise government on the development and implementation of appropriate HIV, TB & STIs policies and programmes.
- SANAC is chaired by the Deputy President of the Country, deputized by the elected Leader of the Civil Society formations






THE NSP CASCADE



Provides national/provincial/district oversight of all financing arrangements for PIP/MDIP


Coordinates donor support to the national/provincial/district HIV, TB and STIs response

Made up of carefully selected technical experts

Elect their own chairs but mostly chaired by Deputy Ministers at national

GUDING POLICY & GOVERNANCE TOOLS

National Developmental Plan 2030

The NDP 2030 The aim is to have a health system that: raises the life expectancy of South Africans to at least 70 years. It would include dealing proactively with HIV and reducing injury, accidents, violence, and substance abuse and significantly reducing the burden of disease.

NSP on HIV,TB and STI (2017-2020)

The National Strategic Plan (NSP) 2017 – 2022 serves as a roadmap for the next stage of our journey towards a future where HIV, TB and STIs are no longer public health problems.

District Development Model:

Introduces new IGR planning, budgeting and implementation paradigm and discipline (spatial targeting and budgeting towards common long-term outcomes)

Focus on strengthening local government response

SANAC Procedural Guidelines

The NSP has direct implications for the governance of SANAC. It is imperative that the SANAC Plenary and its various committees are streamlined and fit for the purpose of incorporating good governance, accountability and effective use of resources into all their activities. Good governance of SANAC is considered critical to overseeing the country's response to HIV, TB and STIs. This document captures both the composition and the roles and responsibilities of the national structures of SANAC.

PCA Procedural Guidelines

A derivative of the SANAC Procedural Guidelines intended to provide guidance for good governance at Provincial, District and Local levels of the HIV, TB and STI response

SANAC Civil Society Terms of Reference

Provides terms for the establishment and effective functionality of the SANAC Civil Society Forum to facilitate the equal, meaningful, and visible participation of Civil Society Sectors (CSS) and networks at all levels in the implementation of the

National Strategic Plan (NSP) on HIV, TB & STI.

Civil Society Sector Charters


Sector specific governance instrument that further outlines the principles and values of the sectors.

RECOMMENDED INSTITUTIONAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR AIDS COUNCILS/NON-NEGOTIABLES

- All AIDS Councils must adopt the structure of SANAC and,
- be established and located in the highest political Offices
 (Premier/Mayor) Leadership and Ownership
- meet regularly (at least once per quarter), with Premier / Mayor chairing
- be multi-Sectoral (each PCA is comprised of representatives from government, civil society and private sector)
- AIDS Councils Secretariats to be adequately staffed and located in the offices of the Premier / Mayor
- AIDS Councils Secretariats should be qualified and competent individuals able to carry the mandate of the AIDS Councils.
- AIDS Councils should be adequately resourced to achieve their mandates



COORDINATION FOR THES RESPONSE...1



 AIDS Councils Secretariat are a vehicle for the coordination function of the AIDS Councils,

The Secretariats must be located in the Premier/Mayor's Office,


The Secretariat has a duty to:

- coordinate the multisectoral response to HIV, TB and STI including Secretariat duties for the Council and its committees,
- support and capacitate the sectors of the AIDS Council,
- Action the resolutions of the AIDS Council,
- Plan, monitor and regularly report on the multisector response,
- All Sectors (Gov, CSF, PSF) have a duty to provide regular progress reports to the Secretariat.
- Ensure strengthening of the sub-AIDS Councils including functionality assessments


COORDINATION FOR THES RESPONSE...2

- The Secretariat must be enabled to make coordination decisions,
- The OTP has a duty to support the Secretariat to function effectively and optimally,
- The OTP must allocate adequate budget for the Secretariat to coordinate the work of the AIDS Council,
- Budget allocation must include a reasonable portion for Civil Society support, to enable Civil Society to participate actively and contribute meaningfully to the HIV, TB and STI response,
- AIDS Councils Secretariats don't implement programmes, they only coordinate,
- Apart from the PIP, the PCA Secretariat must have its own midterm Strategy annualized into APP and Operational Plans,
- SANAC's PCA Procedural Guidelines provides a minimum recommended structure for AIDS Councils Secretariats at all levels.

Minimum Structure for AIDS Councils PCA Secretariat




Minimum Structure for Secretariats DAC

- Current NSP is coming to an end at the end of March 2023,
- Currently developing the new NSP and Provinces have been consulted,
- Concurrently SANAC is conducting the End-Term Review of the current the NSP 2017-2022,
- Provinces will be conducting End-Term Review for their PIPs through the support of SANAC,
- Provinces will be developing their Provincial Implementation Plans (PIPs) starting from October,
- Expected launch date for the new NSP and the PIPs is the 24 March 2023,



CONCLUSION

- SANAC commends the province for its unwavering leadership for PCA and the response,
- SANAC welcomes the new Premier and look forward to working with her as the Chairperson of the PCA,
- There is a need to ensure the PCA Secretariat is adequately staffed in line with the Procedural Guidelines,
- Attention should be paid towards strengthening the ailing DACs,
- SANAC is coordinating a Study Tour for 3 Provinces (FS, GP & NW) on the 07-11 November (concept note shared),
- Request the province to avail three MECs to share their experiences during the Study Tour (details to be shared)
