- Quarter three (Oct-Dec) has been one of the busiest quarters of 2021 with KZN hosting the Women Now Summit, the ICASA, the women's month, the 16 days of activism; the WAD and the International Day of Persons with Disabilities;
- The gender-based violence and femicide cases continue to increase;
 KZN women seem to be getting the worst, according to the latest crime statistics we were the only province to record an increase in crimes against women;
- Inanda and uMlazi continue to be in the lead police stations which record the highest increase in rape and sexual offences which see them being dubbed the "rape capital" in the country; and
- The COVID-19 cases increased in this quarter with Omicron driving these infections, it is critical that we observe COVID-19 protocols and get vaccinated as it has become clearer that the vaccines work to minimize critical illness.

KZN Youth Summit took place from the 16th to the 19th of November 2021. The summit was centred around revitalisation of youth sector in the province in order to improve youth engagements in districts which can then contribute to the achievement of the PIP

KZN Youth Village held from the 6th to the 11th of December 2021 during ICASA. The ICASA youth village was to provide a vibrant, interactive, empowering and active safe space for youth engagement and dialogues
