



215 sex workers vaccinated against COVID-19 in Ugu District and good relations with SAPS led to them providing affidavits for SWs without IDs.

Across all Crisis Centers and Thuthuzela Care Centre, awareness campaigns were implemented by Childline in schools, health facilities ad public space in communities with the support from stakeholders namely Dreams from AFSA, EDI, TB/HIV Care, Lifeline Zululand, Department of education, Department of Health, and Department of Social development
