Civil society is distraught by the continued discrimination and violence towards sex workers and calls for the decriminalisation of sex work. ☐ 13 missing sex workers in Johannesburg Six bodies found in Johannesburg ☐ One body found in Mthwalume Civil society is distraught by the unacceptably high rates of Child and Teenage pregnancies and strongly advise that the government take immediate actions. We strongly advise that the speaker launches the TB caucus by 15 November 2022. Civil Society strongly advise that the Office of the Premier do a full handover of the OSS/HIV vehicles to district municipalities for Health promoters and Civil Society Forum to conduct HIV & AIDS, TB and STI Behavioural Change Campaigns. The issue of uKuthwala is of great concern and need urgent attention from all stakeholders

Revitalization of support groups

- Civil Society is driving the revitalization of support groups.
- This initiative aims to address issue of defaulter rate and adherence amongst PLHIV within the province.
- Lubanzi uLwazi resource center is the service provider from the PLHIV sector selected to drive the process.



- Inception report has been shared, presented and supported by the HIV & AIDS, TB and STI Technical Working Group.
- · District engagements have resumed.

Revitalisation of sectors provincially, district and locally

- Elections of CSF leadership and audit is done in preparation towards elections
- The following districts have selected their new structure: Zululand and uMgungundlovu.
- The process of electing new structures in the districts is still ongoing.

Provincial Youth Sector:

- The Provincial Youth Sector Structure was inducted in June 2022. The sector is currently in the process of revitalizing youth sector structures in all the districts. Interim district youth task teams have been selected.
- Provincial Youth sector participated in the launch of the new youth HIV prevention campaign "Zikhala kanjani" which was launched 30 June in Limpopo province.



Provincial PLWHIV Sector

- The sector hosted a workshop for KZN Stakeholders on U=U literacy workshop
- CSF organised treatment literacy workshop for all CSF leaders to be informed of new ARV drugs developments and how to further assist communities in understanding side effects of new drugs.
- District task teams were selected for the U=U campaign
- Ms Zonke Ndlovu from the PLHIV sector selected at the Champion for the U=U Campaign.
- The sector advocated strongly for the government and stakeholders to urgently address the issue of child and teenage pregnancies. The participated in the
- Service provider from the sector leading the revitalisation of support groups in the province

Provincial LGBTQIA+

- Held Durban pride and LGBTQIA+
- The purpose of the celebration was to sensitize the community and raise awareness against hate crimes committed against members of the sector.



Sex worker Sector

- Participated in a sex work symposium led by the legislature.
- Quarterly meeting will be held will the PCA to discuss progress report on the issues raised.
- The sector is currently formulating a database of all sex workers in the province to assess needs and identify areas of support by the PCA.
- The sector held a workshop to capacitate members on HIV, STI & TB prevention strategies in collaboration with DOH.



Provincial Children Sector

- eThekwini and Provincial Structures revitalized; Provincial Interim Committee has been put in place.
- Revitalization of children sector led by Civil society in collaboration with CINDI network, UNICEF, USAID and IAPAC.
- The interim structure will focus on interventions to promote high ART adherence among children and increasing the number of initiation of HIV positive children into ART.



Men Sector

- In collaboration with uMtwana uNhlanganiso, the men sector held Isibaya Samadoda in the following districts: uThukela, uMgungundlovu, eThekwini, iLembe, Amajuba and uGu district.
- The seeks to address issues that affect men including issues of health and mental health among them. It also engage men on how to start building families and their role in ending Gender-Based Violence and Femicide (GBVF).



Provincial Research Sector

- The research sector was inducted in June 2022.
- The sector presented during the TB conference through THINK on the 14th of September 2022.
- Sector is busy collecting research Database
- Research sector is now looking at new vaccines and engagement are underway to address TB vaccines.



Research Sector held its quarterly meeting. THINK disseminated results on TB Studies.

CHALLENGES WITHIN DISTRICTS

Amajuba: Civil society is not supported, have issues with transport and reviving of LAC's. Need interventions to address the issue of high GBVF cases and gangsterism in Osizweni. Madadeni schools are also touched by these issues in schools and out of school gang leaders.

uMgungundlovu: Health promoter deployment in uMgungundlovu still a challenge. even though several engagements has happened between Municipal manager and Community Service Office

ACTION REQUIRED

- Revitalisation of OSS
- Audit of functional DAC/LAC/WAC
- Participation of Government Leadership is required in all levels
- □ TB Caucus needs to be launched by 15 November 2022
- OSS/HIV vehicles need to be donated to District Municipalities by 31 October 2022

CLOSING REMARKS

- CSF partnership with global fund and PEPFAR partners enable CFS to monitor progress within target and interventions rendered. Happy that the new global fund grant has been allocated for local organisations.
- Civil society has actively participated in addressing the issue of child and teenage pregnancy in the province through partnership with government, partners and OTP.
- Civil society has actively participated in GBVF activations within districts were implemented as a build up toward GBVF summit, this is critical considering the high rates of GBVF in the province
- Civil Society Forum is committed to advocate and promote service delivery among our communities, hence will continue to monitor and evaluate health facilities to address issues of stock out and attitude of health care workers within health facilities.
- We appreciate Fast- Qs for man and boys that's is being implemented in other districts and will continue to monitor from time to time
