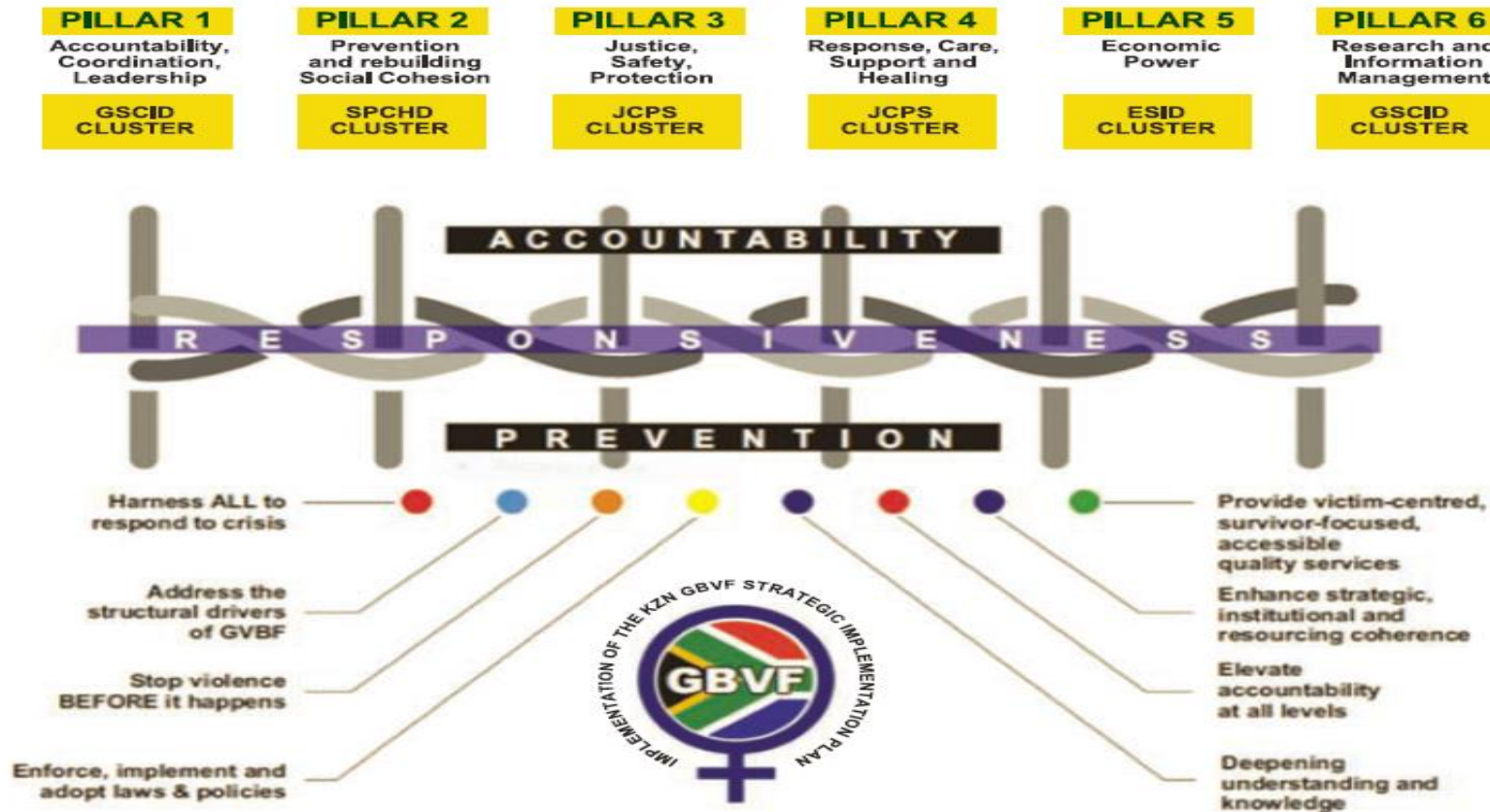

- The District Gender Machinery Functionality tool was completed by District Gender Focal Points.
- eThekweni Metro is the only Metro with a functional District Gender Machinery which meets on a quarterly basis.
- There is a high demand for Gender Mainstreaming Training.

Recommendations

- Interventions to strengthen the functionality of Gender Machineries are coordinated by Technical Monitor and the Responsible Deputy Director Quarter 1 of the current financial year.

- In October 2021, the Provincial Gender Machinery met to discuss the Women Empowerment Programmes, and GBVF programmes implemented during 16 days of Activism for no violence against women and children.

District Rapid Response Teams

- On 6 December 2021, The Office of the Premier coordinated an orientation workshop for District GBVF Rapid Response teams
- Rapid Response teams are made up of civil society, focal persons from government departments and municipalities.
- The role of the GBVF Rapid Response Team is to develop, implement and monitor district GBVF plans as well address/ fast track high profile GBVF cases at district level.

SUMMARY

- 520 officials from Treasury received an awareness article on How to Support a GBVF Survivor. The article was distributed electronically.
- Social development reached 48714 Adolescent and young women through Social Behavior Change Programmes.
- Social Development reached 327 256 community members through prevention and awareness programmes
- 2372 of people attended the implementation of GBVF programmes
- Only 4 district municipalities have implemented the Sexual Harassment policy.
- 6 out of 14 departments have implemented the Sexual Harassment policy.
- 905 people participated in programmes driven by NGO's and CBO's during this quarter.
- 651 stakeholders were trained on GBVF workshops
- 652 stakeholders participated in the programmes against bullying and 1501 men participated in programmes to reach out to men

Pillar 3: Justice, Safety and Protection

SUMMARY

- A total of 314 Domestic violence cases reported with the highest number of 138 which equates to 44% reported in eThekweni Metro.
- 43 Child abuse cases reported were mostly from eThekweni Metro, followed by King Cetshwayo, iLembe and uMkhanyakude.
- 2872 cases were received at the Health Facilities between October and December 2021, topping the previous quarters from 2597 seen between April and June 2021, and the cases between June to September which has dropped from 2597 to 2586.
- Sexual assault cases under 12 years old between October and December increased in comparison to the previous quarter , where they are 795 going up to 845.
- There have been a significant from on cases reported with 72 hours from 990 reported between July and September from 1073 between April and June 2021. Between October and December , Health facilities saw about 1031 cases in total.

Pillar 4: Response, Care and Healing

SUMMARY

- 300 officials from Treasury attended the Candle-lighting during the 16 days of activism at Treasury House.
- Social Development provided psychosocial support services to 7 918 women.
- 83702 Beneficiaries reached through Social Relief of Distress programme in October to December 2021) from all district municipalities

Pillar 5: Economic Power

SUMMARY

- Public Works invited 54 Women contractors from Zululand district to the Women in Construction Symposium.
- 55 537 women were reached through economic empowerment programmes.
- National Department of Public Works together with KZN Public Works in collaboration with National Home Builders Registration Council conducted a training for women owned contractors in uGu District
- 367 women benefited in housing
- Department of Human Settlement reported 337 work opportunities for women through 119 projects.
- 2177 Land and house titles or leases provided in the names of women, men (26%), joint (8%).
- COGTA: 36 812 Jobs created for WOMEN. R7,5 million for in-service training R30 million for internship programmes R560 million for CWP programme. In-service training – R1 207 500 Internship – R4.5 million CWP: National Budget allocation

PILLAR 6: RESEARCH AND INFORMATION MANAGEMENT

Activities on Information Management and Research

Key Activity

Identification of knowledge gaps and coordination of the Provincial research agenda for optimally sharing existing and emerging evidence and encouraging areas of further inquiry that could be taken up by academic and research institutions

The province held a Colloquium on Gender Based Violence focusing on “Why Men Are Angry”.

The programme aimed at capturing the root cause of Gender Based Violence. DSD conducted advocacy workshops on Women’s Rights and Sexual Reproductive Health focusing on Gender Based Violence at Zululand District targeted 30 Young Men.

This advocacy workshop aimed at promoting men as agents of change in the fight against Gender Based Violence within their communities.

Current indicators caters are supported by the previous studies and improvement is on going.

RECOMMENDATION

- It is recommended that the Provincial Council on AIDS notes the Quarter 3 (October – December 2021) progress report on GBVF programmes implemented by government departments, civil society organizations.
- It is recommended that implementers of GBVF programmes indicate the population size estimate of the target for coverage to be determined which will determine resources.
