



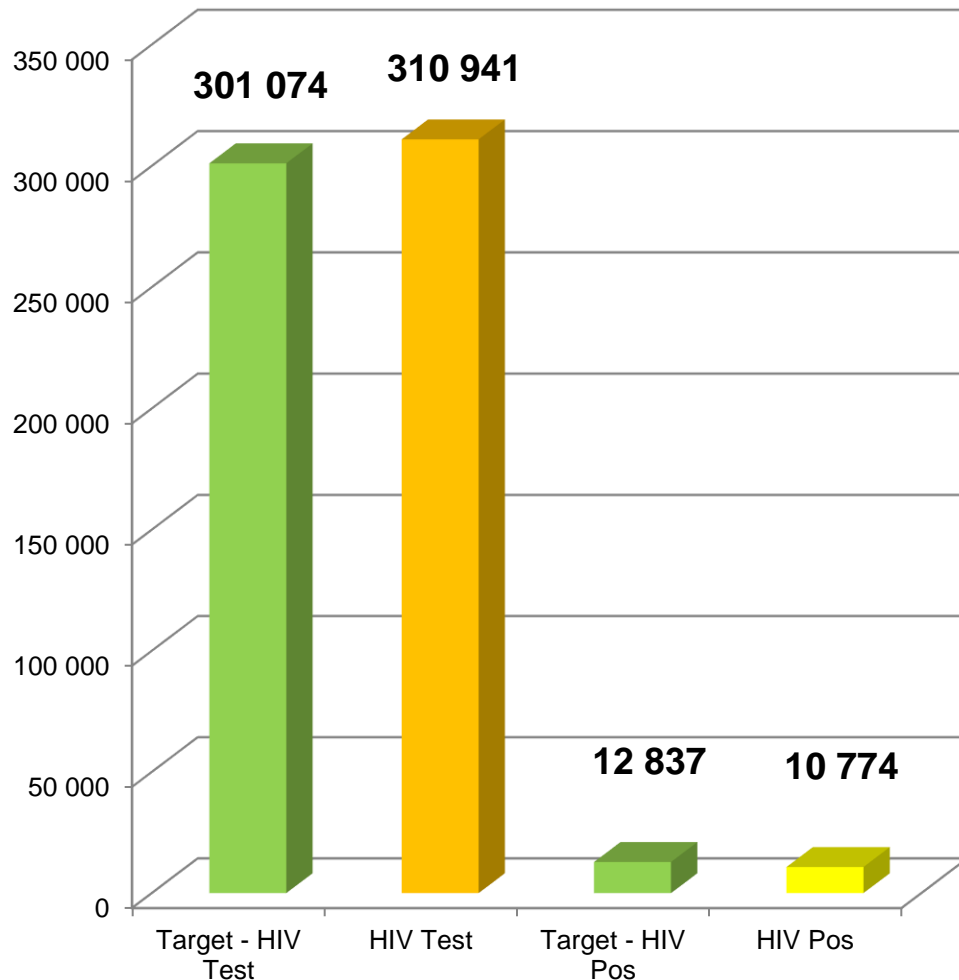

## Success! Surpassed testing target by 3371:

- Targeted index testing.
- Men's activations:
  - WEMA CRU
  - Kwa Ximba Tribal authority.
- Men's Health Clinic
  - Kwa Mashu
  - Kwadabeka

## Problem! Positive yield target not met.

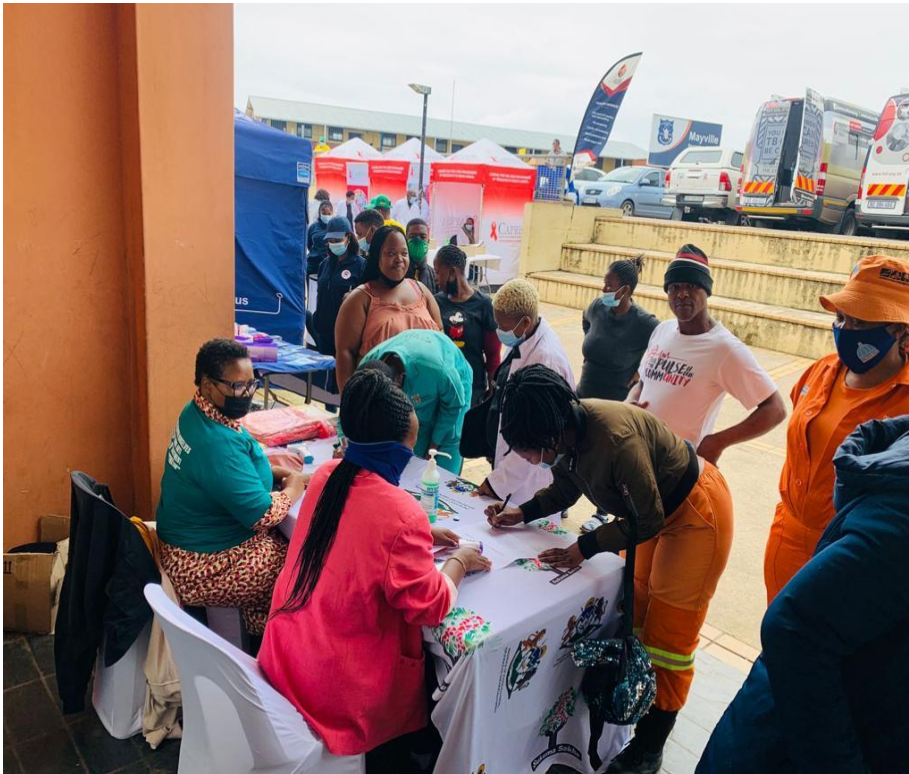
- Low testing in children and adult males.

## REMEDIAL ACTIONS

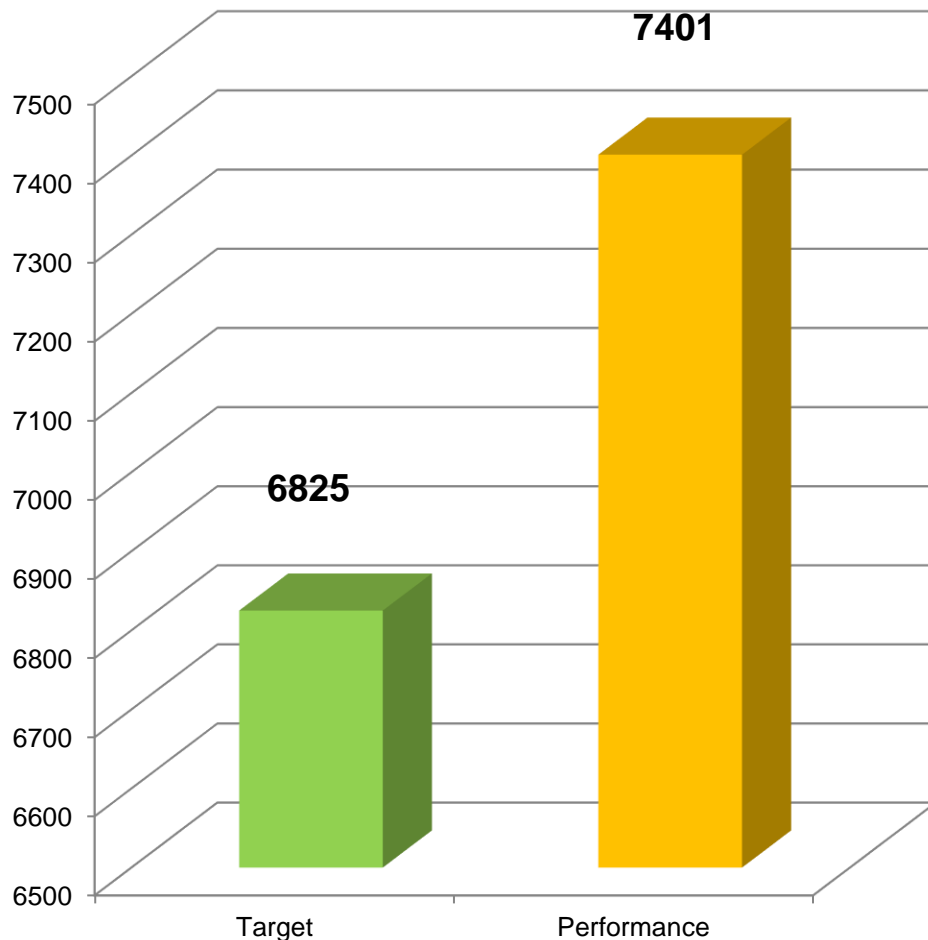
- Target more high-prevalence settings.
- implement door-to-door testing for children
- HIV Screening tool for children

**Success! Surpassed target with partner support**

## How:

- District PrEP training conducted (July) for clinicians focusing on the three cadres:
  - HTA (key populations)
  - AYFS
  - MINA (Men's health)
- PrEP education and marketing increased in the community.
- Prep Program is monitored in DoH nerve center meetings.

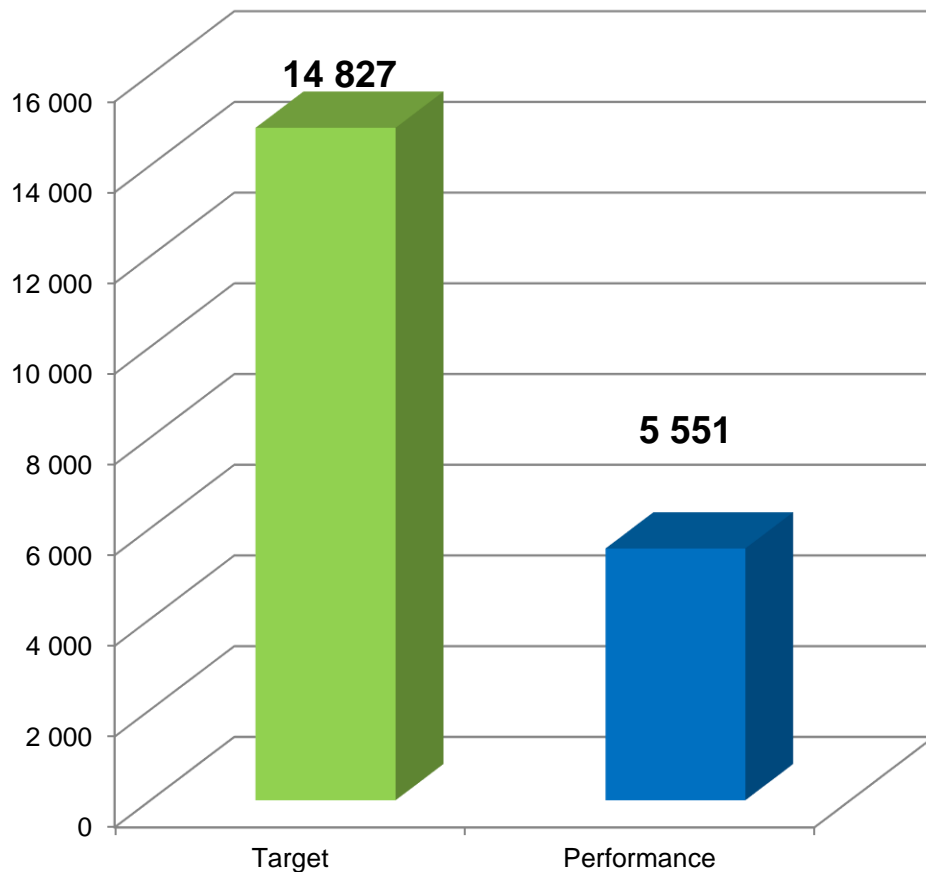

# VMMC

**Problem! VMMC was far below target.**

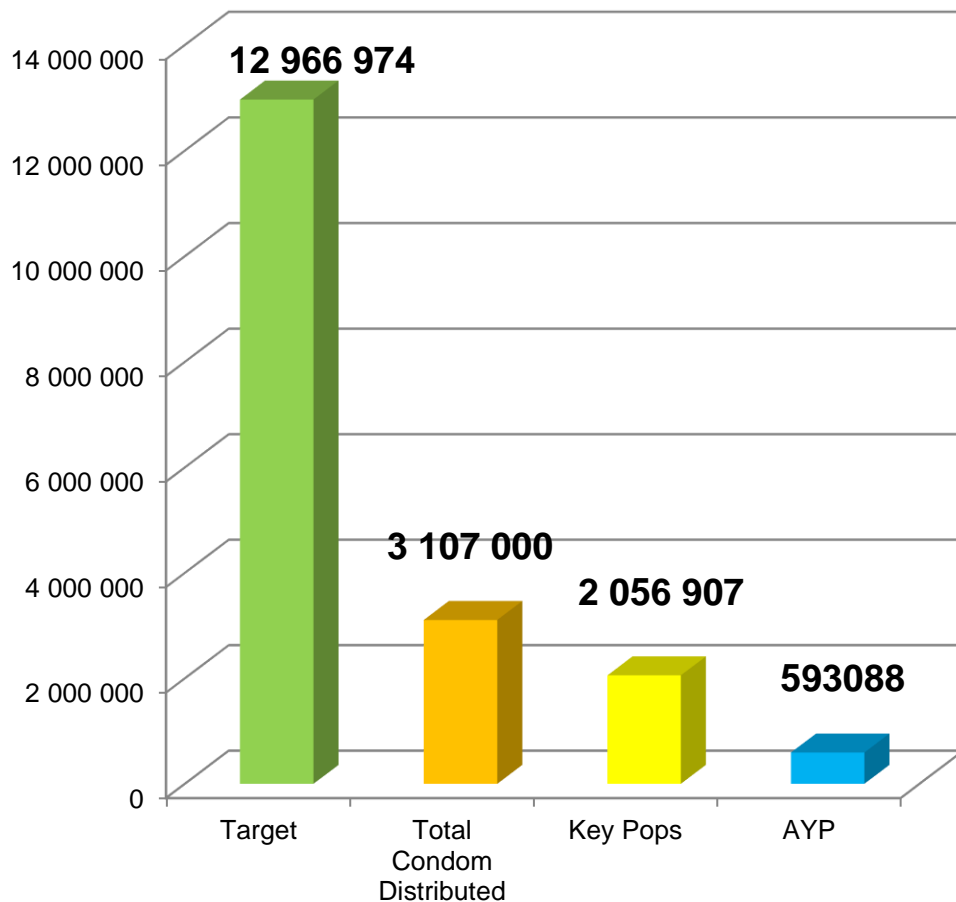


## INTERVENTIONS:

- 4 service providers contracted and started VMMC service delivery on the last month of quarter one (15/06/22)
  - Total numbers done within last two weeks of June: 1 854
- Men's Activations this quarter:
  - Isibaya SaMadoda at KwaXimba (3 June)
    - Umsunduzi Clinic on 3rd June 2022
    - VMMC- **24** done
  - Isibaya SaMadoda at Wema CRU (15 June)
    - supported by Lamontville clinic
    - approximately 150 men attended
    - VMMC -16 done



# CONDOMS



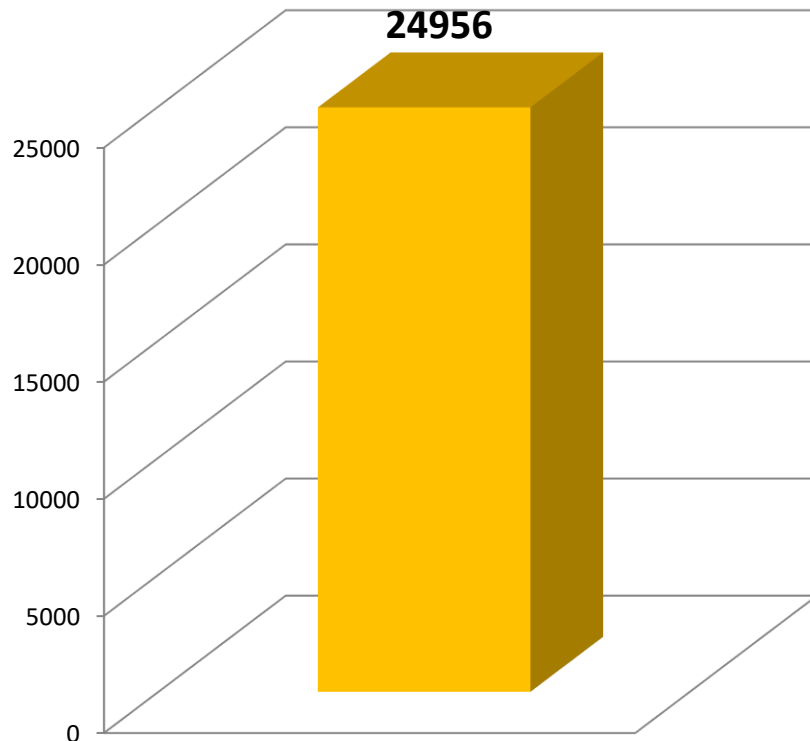
**Problem! Condom stock outs** (since Oct 2021)

## INTERVENTIONS

- District continues communication with the Province on condom needs and progress with suppliers.

# STIs

STI Treated



**Problem! STI infection rates are high - STI increases vulnerability to HIV infection.**

**Success! Male STI screening is up.**

- Number of STIs treated is due to increase in male screening in facilities and community.

## INTERVENTIONS:

- Awareness in community (Isibaya)
- Condom distribution.
- Increase screening
- Men's Clinic and integrated tool (also targets female infected sexual partner for therapy)

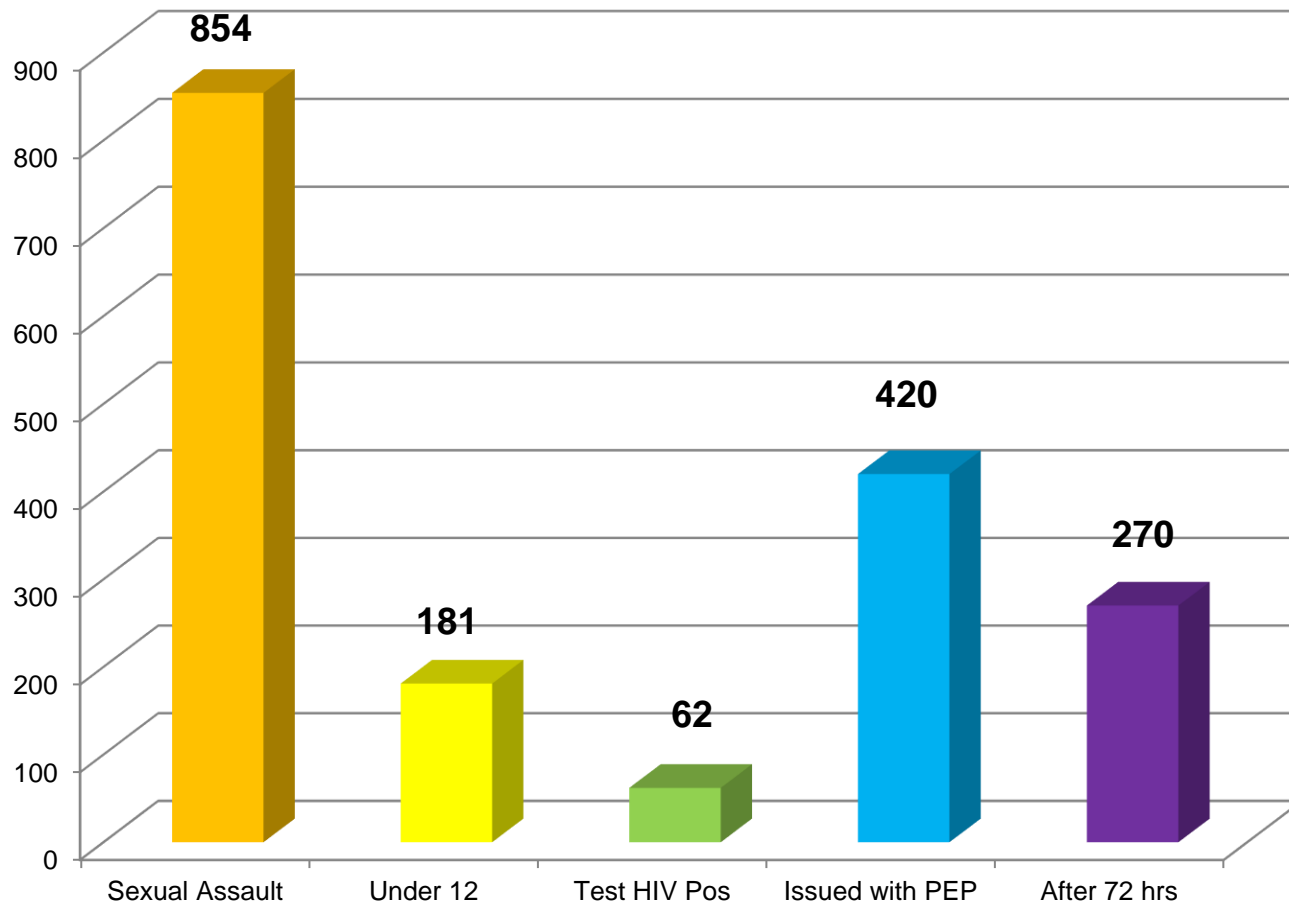

## INTERVENTIONS:

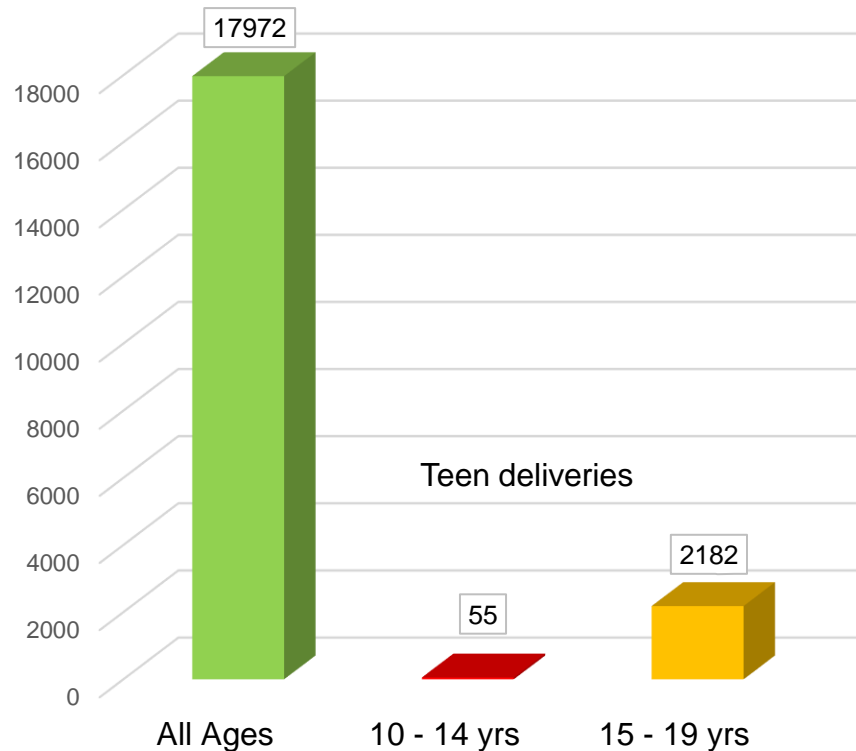
Use community structures and Men's Activations to discuss:

- GBV & Femicide
- Child rape
- Need to report cases within 72 hours for early interventions (PEP)



# TEENAGE PREGNANCY

Deliveries in Facilities



## Concerns

- Teenage pregnancy is due to peer pressure (dialogues)
- Accessing SRH services inside school premises remains a challenge.

## Interventions

- Involvement of community structures to create awareness;
- School health nurse & social worker to address learners in schools regarding teen pregnancy impact and prevention;
- School health Nurses to attend Maternal Mortality Meetings;
- Conduct pregnancy awareness and AYFS (Adolescent Youth Friendly Services) by facilities

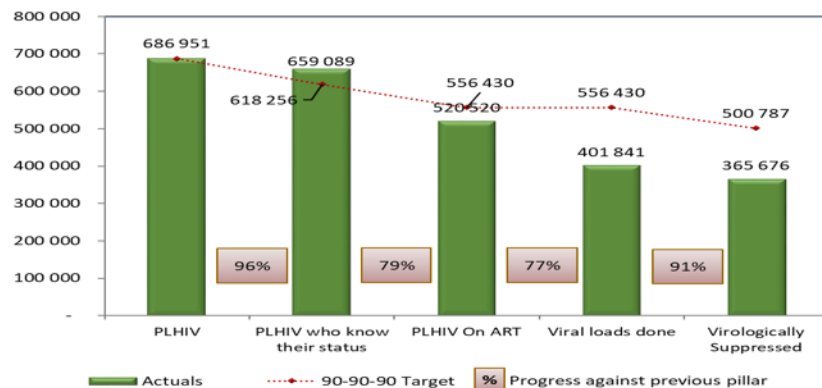

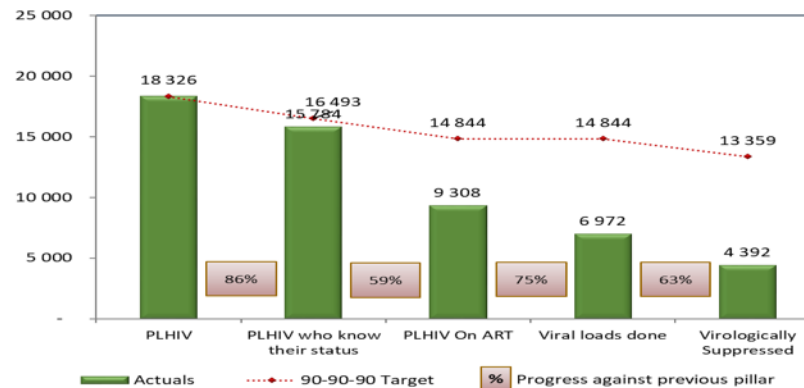

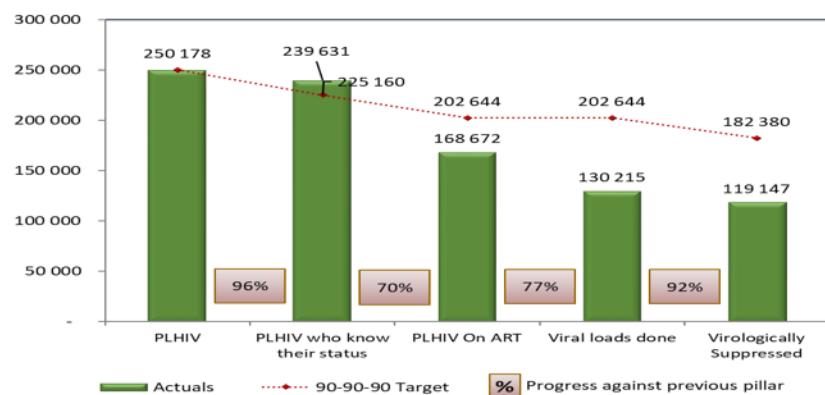
90-90-90 Cascade - Total Population  
eThekweni (Jun 2022) - Public & Private sector



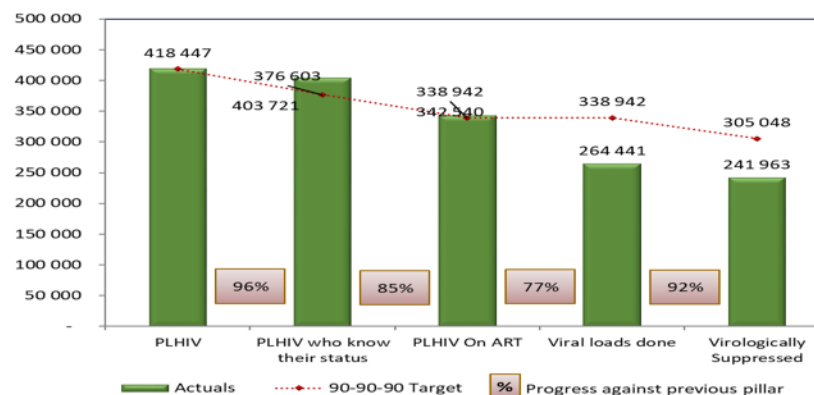
90-90-90 Cascade - Children (<15)

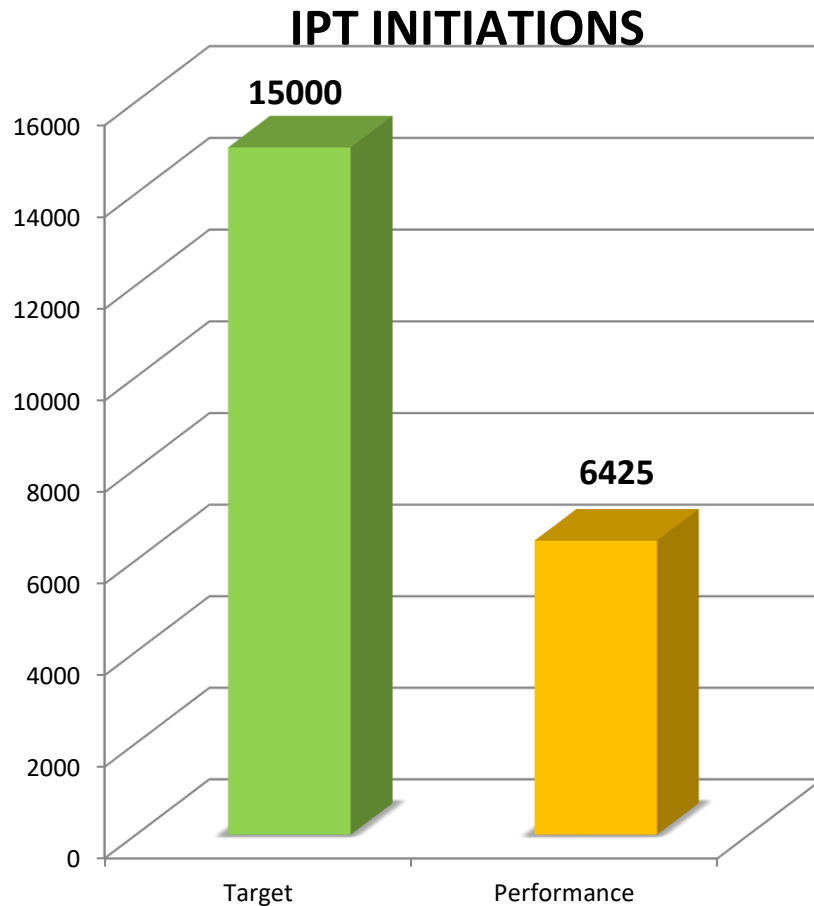

# TB PREVENTION - IPT



**Problem! Not meeting TB prevention target.**

## INTERVENTIONS:

- Increase demand by working with Civil Society to educate community on TB Prevention
- Continue to mentor and educate clinic staff on TPT guidelines implementation
- Capture files on Tier

Note: Some clients completed TPT treatment hence not eligible for TPT.



# TB Treatment

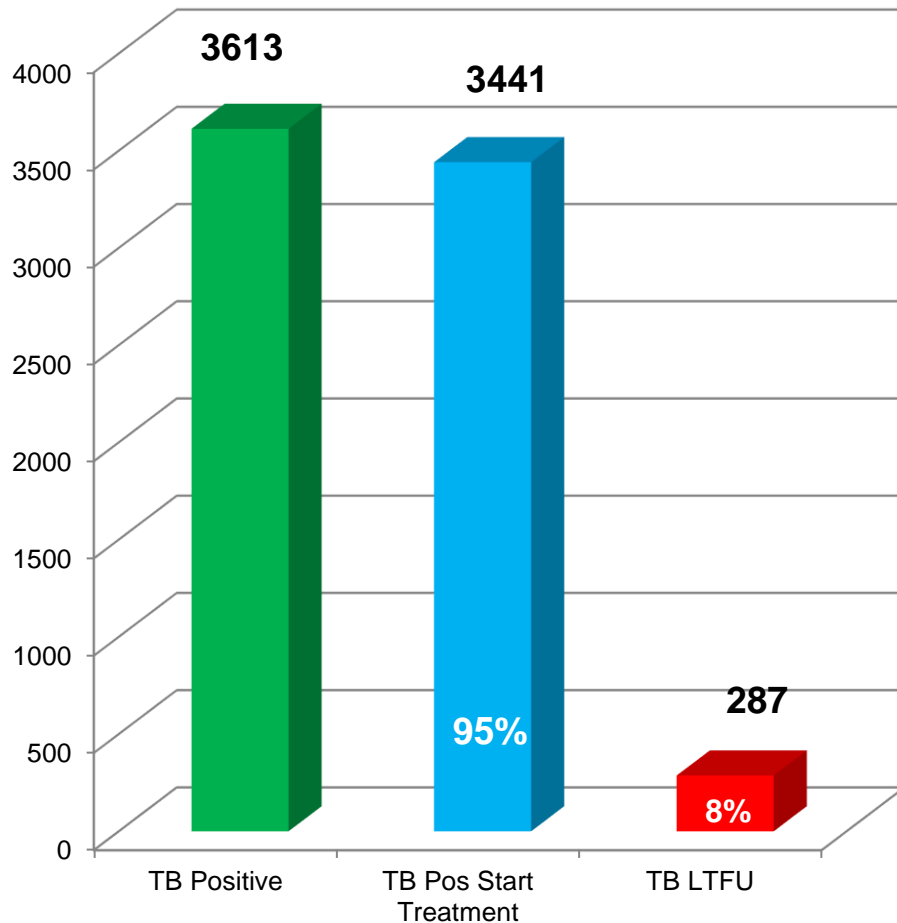
**Success! District achieved 95% TB treatment initiation.**

## **Problem!**

- TB Case Finding remains low (3613 vs 5300 target).
- TB Death Rate = 6%
- TB LTFU rate = 8.5%

## **CHALLENGES & INTERVENTIONS:**

- Poor appointment system in facilities - address
- Tracer cars highjacked (instilling fear) - address
- Target high risks groups for TB screening (Pregnant Women, PLHIV, TB Contacts, etc)
- Encourage Public-Private Partnership in TB Management
- Decant all stable TB clients after 2 months of treatment to CCMDD

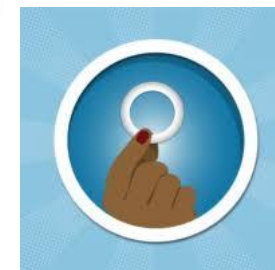
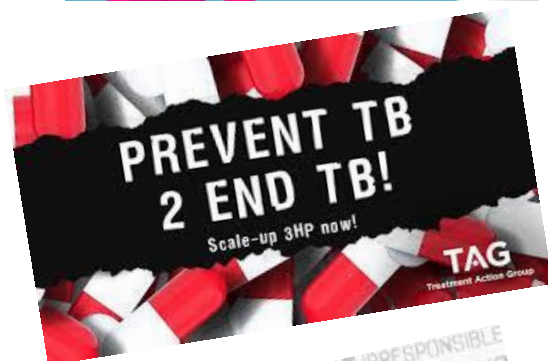
