- Men's dialogue at Dukuduku Mtubatuba, as it was identified as hotspot for rape and crime, to be held on 14 July 2022
- Traditional Health Practioners Training workshop, facilitated by THINK on issues of TB and HIV/ AIDS at Mtubatuba in August 2022
- Women's day celebration in the form of dialogue, to be facilitated by NYDA, aimed at women empowerment. To be held at Vezobala Town Hall- Mtubatuba on the 8<sup>th</sup> of August 2022
- To launch a women's forum, that will discuss women empowerment, GBV and other social ills. All Jozini wards to have 1 representative
- To Launch the business forum with the intention to interlink with the Municipality and also encourage business Sector to give back to the community of Jozini, planned to be held in September 2022
