CHALLENGES

- Clients reporting late for Antenatal Care.
- Poor treatment adherence and mixed feeding and there is reduced PCR uptake around 10 weeks.

KEY INTERVENTIONS

Facilities were inserviced on EMTCT guidelines during support visits and perinatal review meetings with special focus on mother-baby pair and management of high risk neonates.

Mothers prefer receiving COVID19 vaccine post delivery. - The DAC is chaired by the designated persons
- The DAC sits quarterly, however there is poor implementation of the resolutions taken
- There is poor sitting of the LAC in all four Local Municipalities, Inkosi Mtubatuba Municipality had challenges with the sitting of the LAC as well as reporting
- ▶ Both the District and LAC'S have scheduled dates of the AIDS Councils, however there were disruptions due to elections. Currently the Local Municipality have reviewed their dates. uMhlabuyalingana has already convened their meeting on 31 January and their scheduled dates were approved by the council. Jozini LAC was on 17 February 2022 and Big Five Hlabisa sat on 15 February 2022. For Inkosi Mtubatuba no date has been communicated as yet because of the Municipality's Political instability.

ACHIEVEMENTS/SUCCESSES

- Integration of all services in the government facilities
- ▶ Peer educators appointed for High Transmission Areas (HTA) services.
- ▶ District has maintained 90-90-90 status and Pursuing 95-95-95.
- All build up activities that were planned in preparation for the 16 Days of Activism and World Aids Day were successfully done in all Municipalities.
- The District successfully conducted the World AIDS Day at Inkosi Mtubatuba Local Municipality.

Challenges

- Challenged inclusive of OSS / DAC and reporting
- Poor sitting and attendance of the AIDS Councils from WAC level
- Poor submission and reporting which affects the credibility of the District report.

Civil Society

- Four consultative meetings have been held at Jozini with the aim of creating a Youth Sector (Unemployed Graduates and youth out of school)
- Creation of the data base for functional support groups in 2 Local Municipalities, Big Five Hlabisa and Jozini

Future Plans

- Stake holders workshop on 23-24 February 2022 with the objective to understand the context in which teenage pregnancies thrive and develop a targeted response with clear roles, responsibilities and times frames for implementation. The workshop will be held at Big Five Hlabisa
- Community imbizo addressing the drivers that fuel teenage pregnancies and to lobby for contraceptive uptake including community spaces where access of condoms can be readily available.
- Engagement with community leaders and structures to encourage adolescents girls and young women and especially those that are pregnant to visit health facilities as early as possible.
- The District AIDS Council meeting to be held on 22 February 2022
- Social Behavioural Change campaign to be held on 3rd of March 2022 at Big Five Hlabisa Local Municipality with the objective of to tracking and bringing back all clients lost to follow up during COVID-19 and linking them to care and treatment.

Future Plans

- ▶ PCA Strengthening Workshop on HIV, TB and STI'S monitoring and evaluation scheduled 1-2 March 2022. The aim of the workshop is to build capacity, ensure co ordination and integration of HIV and AIDS in the District. This is an effort to strengthen the functioning of the District AIDS Council in uMkhanyakude
- Mandisa Ntuli Memorial walk and stone unveiling on 18 March 2022 at Bunganeni ward 3 (UMhlabuyalingana Local Municipality), this follows the brutality killing of a 15 year old girl grade 8 leaner from Mpiyakhe High School that was allegedly sexual assaulted, strangled to death and dumped on the side of the road.
