#### Goal 1: Accelerate prevention to reduce new HIV, TB and STI infection

- COVID 19 Integrated tool is utilized at house hold level for early detection of new TB, HIV and STI infections
- Increase uptake of Pre-Exposure Prophylaxis for HIV prevention.
- Increase TB case finding through support from IHI

# Goal 2: Reduce morbidity and mortality by providing treatment, care and adherence support for all

- Increase in remaining on ART clients.
- District Adherence facilitator was appointed to improve treatment adherence & disclosure of clients on chronic treatment
- Outreach teams were appointed in all Sub-districts to assist in the welcome back campaigns

## Goal 3: Reach all key and vulnerable populations with customised and targeted interventions

- 3 Peer educators under the Key population sector were appointed at Endumeni
   LM, Nquthu LM and Umvoti LM to provide linkage to care and support
- Staff appointed at all 4 LMs to provide comprehensive service delivery at all hotspots including TVETs.
- Civil Society engagement is also assisting
- The issue of Teenage Pragnancy has been reffered to OSS to allocate its members
- GBVF study has been conducted and presented to DAC by all stakeholders

#### **Achievements/Successes**

#### Goal 4: Address the social and structural drivers of HIV, TB and STIs

- Operation phuthuma conducted in the district focusing on COVID19 & All Priority programs in May 2022.
- Isibaya samadoda conducted in Pomeroy and Nquthu in March 2022 and Amajuba TVET and Msinga in May 2022
- Mens dialogue conducted in Kranskop under uMvoti Municipality ward 5
- TVET Activations conducted in January 2022.
