- Sexual Assault cases at health care facilities decreased as compared to the 4th Quarter.
- Sexual assault cases under 12 years old between April to June 2023 has decrease as compared to the previous quarter.
- There has been a significant decrease in cases seen after 72 hours.
- Between April to June 2023, Health facilities saw about 2645 cases in total, there is a decrease from the 3rd quarter.
- eThekwini Metro has the highest contribution on cases reported in TCC'S compared to other districts.
- There is a need for Sign language interpreters in government facilities such as: Thuthuzela Care Centres, Police stations and Courts to cater for People with Disabilities.
