

<p>PILLAR 1: Accountability, Coordination and Leadership</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • KZN delegates participated in the 2nd Presidential GBVF Summit. The 2nd Presidential GBVF Summit was held on 2-3 November 2022. One of the most critical resolutions taken was the establishment of a GBVF Council. • Provincial Gender Machinery meeting was held on 24 October 2022. The meeting focused on Public, Private Partnerships on GBVF programmes with Let's talk GBVF in Real Time by Women Pact, GBVF Panic Button by AROSA, Mens Conference in Motion by Gugulesizwe, Phaphama Mshayeli Road Safety by Nalenhle Progressive business. • The District Gender Machinery Functionality tool was completed by District Gender Focal Points. King Cetshwayo, eThekweni, uMkhanyakude and uGu are the four districts with functional District Gender Machinery which meets on a quarterly basis. • All government departments have the Sexual harassment Policy in The Workplace. While all District Municipalities have the Sexual Harassment policy, uMkhanyakude, Zululand and iLembe reported that the policy is not implemented. A report on all 52 Local Municipalities will be presented in the next PCA meeting.

<p>PILLAR 2: Prevention and rebuilding Social Cohesion</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • GBVF Prevention and Awareness programmes were implemented throughout the province. The leading district with the highest number of intervention programs is King Cetshwayo followed by uMkhanyakude and uThukela. The other districts are implementing GBVF prevention programs very well except Harry Gwala with zero programs implemented. • Government Departments, Municipalities and Civil Societies reached 70 898 community members with GBVF prevention and awareness programmes • Intervention to shift Behavior in Men such as the Men Care programme, Boys Development programme, Boys Championing Change reached 2224 men and young boys during the period under review. • All 14 government departments have the Sexual Harassment policy. • Majority of prevention and awareness campaigns implemented did not priorities People with Disabilities. • Ukhozi FM entered into a partnership with the Office of the Premier on a 365 Days GBVF programme to raise awareness on GBVF via radio and other relevant platforms.

<p>PILLAR 3: Justice, Safety and Protection</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The following districts had the highest contribution towards violence against women: eThekwini ,uMgungundlovu, King Cetshwayo, uGu , uThukela and iLembe. With eThekwini being the highest. • 264 Child abuse cases reported were mostly from eThekwini Metro, followed by King Cetshwayo and uMgungundlovu • Sexual Assault cases at health care facilities increase as compared to the 4th Quarter. • Sexual assault cases under 12 years old between July to December 2022 increase as compared to the previous quarter. • There have been a significant increase in cases seen after 72 hours. • Between July to December 2022 , Health facilities saw about 2290 cases in total, a slight increase from the 4th quarter). • There is a need for Sign language interpreters in government facilities such as: Thuthuzela Care Centers, police station and courts to cater to People with Disabilities. • OTP entered into a Public Private Partnership with the KZN Gaming Board where the Gaming Board sponsored R10 million Rands towards the GBVF response programme. This sponsorship is for refurbishing shelters, 50 Victim Friendly rooms in Police stations and the development of a GBVF APP with a Panic button. • Spar Group is currently working with the Department of Health in the establishment of a GBVF laboratory

<p>PILLAR 4: Response, Care, Support and Healing</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The Department through the Office of the Premier has partnered with South African Breweries to renovate and establish three shelters in the Province in Inanda, Zululand and King Cetshwayo. • Requests for the early occupation of the sites has been forwarded to Provincial and National Department of Public Works and the Ingonyama Trust. • Through the Department of Public Works initiative one site in uGu has been found to be suitable for the establishment of a Shelter and has been included the Department's infrastructure plan. A needs assessment has been conducted and forwarded to the Department of Public Works. • To date DSD is in the process of finalizing User Agreements and reallocation agreements for the sites in Inanda , Babanango and Esikhawini.

The definitions of rape, harassment and sexual assault differ. • There are discrepancies in statistics reported by NPA,DSD and DOE in respect of number of children sexually assaulted by educators. • There is no policy or guideline that assists SGB's at schools regarding disciplinary of SGB hired staff. <p>KZNLA conducted an audit on the extent to which liquor outlets comply to regulations i.e., trading hours, selling alcohol to children below age 18 years.</p>



The Department has supported Isulethu Women Marula Processing Cooperative of 14 members of which 11 are women by building a Marula Processing Factory at uMkhanyakude District in Umhlabuyalingana Local Municipality Ward 11. This Amarula project entails harvesting Marula on seasonal basis, and it provides jobs to 980 Women. The budget of R31 million has been allocated for the placing of 340 un-employed graduates in the 2022/23 financial year on agricultural enterprises across the province of Kwa-Zulu Natal is underway.

RECOMMENDATION

- It is recommended that the Provincial Council on AIDS notes the Quarter 3 (JULY TO DECEMBER 2022) progress report on GBVF programmes implemented by government departments, civil society organizations.
- It is recommended that implementers of GBVF programmes indicate the population size estimate of the target for coverage to be determined which will determine resources.
- There should be support for Municipality Gender Focal Office to be able to discharge their responsibilities.
- The Provincial Gender-Based Violence and Femicide progress report is submitted to District Gender Focal Points so that the report is endorsed by District Mayors before it is tabled before the Provincial Council on AIDS.
