Mitigations and Actions

Challenges

- TB clients lost to follow up (LTFU) 55%
- TB/MDR on treatment success rate targeted 60 currently at 8
- TB clients 5 years and older treatment baseline 1670 currently 400

Drugs and Gangsterism

Mitigation and Action Taken

- Intensify TB screening during clinics and communities
- Intensify awareness, households visit and screening during Clinics.
- Visit school parents meeting and educate about the important of completing treatment course.
- Improving quality of life through compliance to treatment.
- Advise parents to stick to clinic appointment visits.
- Conduct youth gathering, dialogues and soccer tournaments.

Goal 1: Accelerate prevention to reduce new HIV, TB and STI infections

- Male condoms distributed = 954 000
- Female condoms distribution = 7 20
- Number of people tested for HIV is at 30 874, and 913 tested HIV positive
- Male medical Circumcisions (MMC) is at 848
- 3 279 new STI episodes treated
- HIV TESTING increased by 30 874 for this reporting quarter
- Male Urethritis Syndromes increased by 1417 for this reporting quarter



Goal 2: Reduce morbidity and mortality by providing treatment, care and adherence support for all

- 426 adults and 26 children initiated on TB treatment
- TB/HIV co-infection rate is at 62,6% and HIV positive new clients started on IPT rate is at 88.1%
- Total people remaining on ART = 63 231
- Total Viral Load completion is at 72,8% at 6 months
- Total Viral Load completion after 12 months is at 86.9%
- Adult with viral load completion rate is at 79,9% and children under 15 years and younger is 93,8%
- Total viral load suppressed at 12 months is at 77,2%

Goal 3: Reach all key and vulnerable populations with customised and targeted interventions

- 26 female sex workers registered for social relief distress
- 2500 male condoms distributed
- ART defaulters' negotiations with DOH to put them back into treatment programme, by linking them to taxi rank clinic.

Goal 4: Address the social and structural drivers of HIV, TB and STIs

- 1405 beneficiaries reached through Social Behaviour Change Programme to children and youth between the age 15 to 24
- 5092 Orphaned and Vulnerable Children and Youth received Psychosocial Support Serviced during reporting quarter
- 977 families accessed family care and support services through family preservation service
- **54** children accessed registered ECD Centres
- 2122 people reached through GBV prevention programme
- 40 GBV survivors provided with post violence services
- 720 people accessing food through community nutrition and development centers
- 1147 beneficiaries reached through substance abuse prevention programmes service users who accessed substance Use Disorder(SUD) treatment Services
- 2361 beneficiaries benefited from social relief of distress
- 49 persons with disabilities accessed skills and developmental social welfare services



Goal 5: Ground the response to HIV, TB and STIs in human rights principles and approaches

• 1 761 women participating in women empowerment programme

Goal 6: Promote leadership and shared accountability for a sustainable response to HIV, TB and STIs

- Local AIDS Councils in 2 Local Municipalities are functional
- District AIDS Council is functional




Plans for the Next Quarter (Q4 FY 2022/23)
