Implement adherence guidelines to reduce LTFU and improve on TB/HIV outcomes

Revive Phila Mntwana sites in the community and conduct MUAC and community IMCI to identify early children with malnutrition. Implement multisectoral approach when managing children with malnutrition

Through OSS provide community awareness campaigns on GBV targeting areas with high number of sexual assault cases



District achieved target for HIV testing 15 years and old including ANC

Male condom distribution target achieved

VMMC target of 3396 was achieved (14 190)

Adults started on IPT, target is 90% , district achieved average target of 96%
