- ❖ Men Championing Change programme has been implemented by Home Community Based Care centers at Ugu municipal area. The programme deals with social behavior change focusing on men.
- ❖ Community Based Prevention and Early Intervention programmes held in all for local municipalities to strengthen and enhancing HIV and AIDS prevention and early intervention services .
