## Goal 1: Accelerate prevention to reduce new HIV, TB and STI Infections

Low HIV Positivity Yield 3%	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Few male contact Index elicited, working very far</li> <li>Targeted testing not adequately done in facilities and community</li> </ul>	<p>Marketed Men's Health programme to the community</p> <p>Marketed Men's Health programme to all departments (OSS)</p> <p>Monitor the functionality of Men's Health programme</p> <p>Scale up HIV testing services at High Transmission Areas and through out reach services.</p> <p>Provider HAST services at community points for upcoming measles campaign to upscale HIV testing services.</p> <p>Conduct direct community based testing to areas of high prevalence.</p>

## Goal 2: Reduce morbidity and mortality by providing treatment, care and adherence support for all

ART remaining in care / TROA	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• District poor implementation of tracing and tracking mechanism,</li> <li>• Electrical problem in kwaMsane resulted in poor capturing</li> <li>• All sub districts reflect a loss to follow up. Disclosure issues on child cascade</li> </ul>	<p>Conduct adherence literacy module classes in all facilities to improve treatment adherence.</p> <p>Conduct weekly generation of LTF up client lists and daily evidence on auctioning of the lists.</p> <p>Manually pull out all clinical files of patients appearing in unconfirmed loss to follow.</p> <p>Extend facility after hours tracing in the 24 hour facilities.</p> <p>Hlabisa Management to fast track the electrical issues with relevant stakeholders and supply KwaMsane with insufficient diesel.</p>

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Maternal death	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Two maternal deaths were reported inspite of inservice training that was conducted during Perinatal meeting on the management of medical conditions during pregnancy.</li><li>• One from Hlabisa and one from Manguzi hospitals .</li><li>• Hlabisa patient died during caesarean section due to pulmonary embolism according to post-mortem results.</li><li>• Manguzi case was a 5 weeks pregnant women with known history of leukaemia who overdose aspirin and demised on the same day of admission.</li></ul>	Conduct inservice training on management of obstetric haemorrhage and on management of medical conditions in pregnancy especially at Manguzi and Hlabisa hospitals

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Death in facility rate under 5 years	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• District performance within target.</li><li>• This is attributed to decrease in number of neonatal deaths due to continuous audits on BANC, Partogram and EPOC.</li><li>• Inservice trainings on triaging of children in OPD to ensure proper and optimal clinical management. .</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Continue with supportive supervision on proper screening and management of infections in pregnancy and OPD OM's to allocate Nurses who will triage all children in OPD.</li></ul>

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INDICATOR	CHALLENGES	KEY INTERVENTIONS
Infant 1 <sup>st</sup> PCR positive around 10 weeks (0,7%)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• PCR cases were reported by Mseleni hospital, Hlabisa hospital, Jozini, Makhathini, KwaMbuluzi and Mpembeni clinics.</li><li>• This is attributed to poor maternal viral suppression and mixed feeding.</li></ul>	encourage exclusive breastfeeding, implement treatment adherence classes and advocate for PREP

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Challenge	Mitigation	Action Taken
Teenage Pregnancy still remains a challenge	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>▪ There is a decrease in terms of raw numbers reported</li><li>▪ Community dialogues to empower youth on sexual and reproductive health issues were conducted as impact thereof will be monitored in the next financial year.</li><li>▪ Mosvold and Bethesda reported high at 26%, Manguzi 19%, at 25% Mseleni is at 20%, Othobothini CHC is at 7% and Hlabisa is at 19.5%</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Continue with teenage pregnancy community dialogues targeting problematic area identified with high number of teenage pregnancies reported per ward.</li></ul>
