KZN Premier hosts Africa's biggest Property Management Conference to 'Build KZN Better'

Co-hosted by the National and Provincial Departments of Public Works and Infrastructure and the eThekwini Municipality, the two-day event, running from 28 to 29 January 2025 has drawn hundreds of property industry experts and stakeholders from across the continent.

Organised under the theme "Build KZN Better," the conference aimed to foster collaboration, share cutting-edge insights, and explore innovative solutions in property management. Participants included property developers, investors, government representatives, and infrastructure specialists, all united in their commitment to advancing KwaZulu-Natal's real estate sector and boosting economic growth.

As part of the KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Government's commit- The Premier outlined the eight key priorities for the province ment to accelerating economic growth, Premier Honourable Thamsanqa Ntuli led a high-level Investment Business Breakfast on 6 March 2025 at Umhlanga Coastlands. This event followed the State of the Province Address (SOPA) delivered on 28 February 2025 and served as a crucial platform for fostering strategic economic partnerships.

The Premier was joined by Sport, Arts, and Culture MEC Mntomuhle Khawula and eThekwini Deputy Mayor Cllr Zandile Myeni. Key industry leaders, policymakers, and investors gathered to discuss investment opportunities, infrastructure development, and economic transformation

Premier Ntuli opened the event by unpacking the SOPA, emphasizing the government's commitment to creating a businessfriendly environment. "One of the key focal areas of our term will be to drive increased trade and investment, ensuring that this province becomes the premier destination for industrial expansion and global commerce," he stated.

Building a capable, ethical, and developmental state

Highlighting the province's economic strategy, Premier Ntuli stressed that KwaZulu-Natal is rolling out a multi-faceted approach to intensify investment, trade facilitation, and investor confidence. "Our approach includes direct district-level engagements with the business sector, outbound business missions targeting key global markets, and inbound missions to showcase investment-ready opportunities," he added.

KwaZulu-Natal is strengthening trade corridors and enhancing the competitiveness of Special Economic Zones (SEZs) in Richards Bay and Dube Trade Port. "These zones are key drivers of industrialization, export growth, and employment creation," he

Infrastructure development is also a priority, with the province accelerating investments in rail, road, water, and energy networks to enhance supply chain efficiency and reduce business costs. "These enhancements will make KwaZulu-Natal an even more attractive investment destination." the Premier noted.

At the breakfast, business entities from various sectors pledged millions of Rands towards revitalizing KwaZulu-Natal's economy. These investments will drive job creation, infrastructure development, and industrial expansion, aligning with the government's vision of an inclusive and thriving economy.

Premier Ntuli provided an update on investment commitments made at the KZN Investment Conference in November 2024. "The 17 projects recorded at that conference represent a combined R85.2 billion in committed investment pledges, which will generate over 82,271 permanent jobs once fully operational," he announced

The Premier acknowledged challenges in project implementation but reassured investors that the government is actively working to resolve these issues. "The commitment from both investors and the government will ensure that these projects reach their full potential, driving economic growth and job creation across the province," he affirmed.

With South Africa hosting the G20 Presidency later in the year. Premier Ntuli emphasized the importance of global partnerships. "Our high-level engagements with the diplomatic corps and

The tournament will not only showcase the grace and intensity of modern netball but will also serve as a launchpad for athletes aiming to secure provincial and national representation. Players will have the chance to be scouted for teams such as the Kingdom Stars, KZN's professional netball franchise, and potentially the Spar Proteas, South Africa's national netball

The KZN Premier's Netball Cup aligns with the broader mission of Netball South Africa (NSA), the governing body responsible for the sport's development nationwide. NSA has played a pivotal role in positioning South Africa as a dominant force in international netball, most notably hosting the 2023 Netball World Cup—a landmark achievement that underscored the country's growing influence in the sport. Netball remains one of the most widely played sports in South Africa, with over two million participants, second only to soccer in popularity. The tournament reflects the national vision to increase mass participation in sport, enhance collaboration and resource integration, promote unity and social cohesion, establish netball as a career pathway for young athletes, encourage sponsorship and investment in netball's growth, and develop infrastructure to sustain long-term sport development.

The KZN Premier's Netball Cup is not just about competition—it represents a comprehensive strategy to professionalize the sport. The tournament aims to nurture talent across all aspects of netball, including coaching, officiating, sports administration, marketing, and sponsorship acquisition. By investing in these areas, the province is ensuring that netball evolves into a career-building platform, contributing to job creation and boosting sport tourism in KwaZulu-Natal. The provincial government calls upon businesses, local municipalities, and fans to actively support netball—both financially and through engagement—to ensure its sustainable

The competition also celebrates the rise of men's netball, which has gained significant momentum in South Africa. Special recognition was given to Vukile Prince Zulu, a young athlete from Hambanathi, uThongathi, who has achieved remarkable success in the sport. His journey, which began in 2020 under coach Joe Taylor Mhlongo, has led him to win KZN Netball Super League Defender of the Year (2024) with the Ocean Predators, represent South Africa at the 2023 U-23 Fast5 Tournament in New Zealand, and secure a continental championship title with the SA Senior Men's Team at the 2024 Africa Netball Championships in Namibia.

Zulu's recent invitation to participate in Jamaica's National Male Netball League is a testament to the growing opportunities for men in netball, further promoting gender equality and transformation in South African sports. This development demonstrates the potential of the sport not only among women but also among men, contributing to equality and transformation in building a non-racial, non-sexist, and united society.

PREMIER NTULI CELEBRATES INDIA'S 76TH REPUBLIC DAY ANNIVERSARY



KwaZulu-Natal Premier Honourable Thamsanga Ntuli on 26 January 2025, joined the Indian community and dignitaries in Durban to celebrate the 76th anniversary of India's Republic Day. The occasion commemorated India's transition to a republic in 1950, following its independence in 1947, and underscored the longstanding friendship between South Africa and India.

Premier Ntuli highlighted the deep historical ties linking South Africans of Indian descent and those of African descent, tracing these bonds back to the arrival of the SS Truro in 1860. He pointed to the ways these two communities have worked together over the years, from the struggle against ward to continuing our shared journey with India." oppression to establishing democratic governance after 1994.

In his remarks, the Premier praised India's founding leaders, including Prime Minister Jawaharlal Pandit Nehru, whose ideas influenced South Africa's first democratic president, Nelson Mandela. Nehru's concept of a "no easy walk to freedom" served as inspiration for Madiba's iconic biography, Long Walk to Freedom. Premier Ntuli also referenced the contributions of Mahatma Gandhi, noting that both Gandhi and Nehru championed inclusive between our two nations continue to deepen, guided by the principles of approaches to unity rather than confrontational policies.

The Premier drew on the words of Prince Mangosuthu Buthelezi, who recalled how India's achievement of republic status in 1950 inspired South Africans fighting for their own freedom. Premier Ntuli emphasised the parallels between the Indian Constitution of 1950 and South Africa's 1996 Constitution, both of which are cornerstones of democracy and social justice.

"This celebration reminds us that hope and collaboration can guide nations toward justice and democracy," Premier Ntuli said. "KwaZulu-Natal stands firm in its commitment to building an inclusive province, and we look for-

As KwaZulu-Natal pursues its mission of leaving no one behind and fostering a brighter, more inclusive future, the Premier called on South Africans to reflect on the lessons from India's journey to a republic. The event concluded with well-wishes and congratulations to the people of India on this significant anniversary.

"Happy Anniversary India!" Premier Ntuli proclaimed. "May the friendship equality, unity, and freedom."







